Theatre was constructed in 1940 and when the renovation is completed will seat about 400 people. There will be live performances on stage in state of the art theatre. There was a public arts kick-off on March 27. Several Rotarians are involved in the project. Polio Fundraising Campaign Seeks To Raise \$100 from Each Member of Frankfort Rotary

The local Rotary Foundation Committee is helping to raise the club's share of an effort by the Rotary Foundation to fund an \$80 million price tag for eradicating polio by 2005. The Frankfort Rotary goal is to raise \$35 per year from each member over three years, or a lump sum of \$100

per member. Checks should be made out to The Rotary Foundation with the "for" line indicating polio eradication and given or mailed to Len Shirrell, Ron Fraass or Dick Watkins. Watkins, who reported on the project to Wednesday's meeting, said that in 2002 there were 1,925 new cases of polio reported worldwide in seven countries. Ninety percent of these new cases were in India, Pakistan, and Nigeria. Watkins emphasized that there is some urgency for funds in that if polio isn't eliminated from these last seven countries, it can spread back to the newborn population in adjacent countries that are currently polio-free.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Dr. Glen Caldwell, who spoke about various types of bioterrorism as a weapon. It is very simple to make a biological weapon. For example, if you can make beer, you can grow anthrax. However, it is more difficult to get it into a form to be used as a weapon. The weapon should be inexpensive, small and contained by the terrorist. There needs to be a convenient system of delivery. It should be silent up until the point of the event and create much fear. There are several challenges to combating this terrorism, such as the need to diagnose the event, the need for a laboratory to do the work, a public health capacity, a medical system capacity, and an economic capacity. He discussed several biological agents such as a series of bacteria, viral agents like smallpox, ebola and various toxins like ricin. Concerning anthrax, the spore has been kept alive for as long as 40 years. The terrorist needs them in small particles that can be inhaled. Although mortality is almost 100%, there are antibodies, which will work if

taken in time. Biological materials are not pure white, which helps in the identification. When inhaled, anthrax goes into a vegetative state and starts to grow. On the skin, it is treatable unless it gets into the blood stream. It can also be contracted through ingestion. Inhalational anthrax produces nonspecific symptoms similar to the common cold or even SARS within one to six days. The diagnosis has to be made early. Inhalation anthrax needs intravenous injections immediately, and treatment must be for a long period of time. There is a vaccine that works with antibodies. Anthrax is easy to make and can be dispensed with a blower. It is considered weaponized when it does not stick together. He also discussed smallpox, which can be caught through fluids or as floating particles. No one has been immunized since the late 1970s since the vaccination can cause one to two deaths per million. It has a 30% mortality rate and there is no treatment except support and time. It does tie up the health care system. Concerning the plague, the "Black Death" or bubonic plague goes back to the 12th century. It is transmitted by a flea bite and the flea gets it from rodents. These are all ideal and very frightening weapons of destruction.

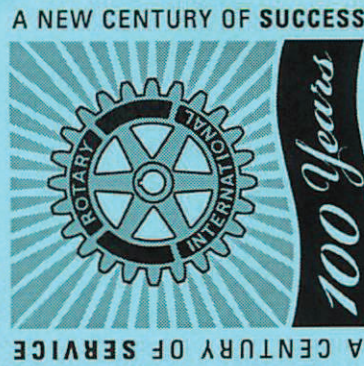

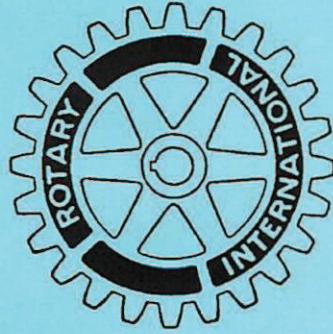

Next Week at Rotary...

Robert F. Sexton has been the executive director of the Pritchard Committee for Academic Excellence since its creation in 1983. This is an independent, statewide, non-partisan, advocacy group dedicated to the improvement of education for all Kentuckians.



A Louisville native, he has been the deputy director of the Kentucky Council on Higher Education, an administrator at the University of Kentucky, a professor of history, and a high school teacher.

A graduate of Yale University, Sexton earned his Ph.D. in history from the University of Washington. He was a Visiting Scholar at Harvard and at the Annenberg Institute for School Reform at Brown University. He has been recognized widely for his efforts to improve public education, receiving the Charles A. Dana Award for Pioneering Achievement and honorary degrees from Berea College, Georgetown College, and EKV. The Courier-Journal wrote that Sexton is Kentucky's "incomparable public policy advocate." Kentucky Monthly magazine

identified him as one of the most influential Kentuckians of the twentieth century.

Dr. Sexton was a founder of Kentucky's Governor's Scholars Program and the Commonwealth Institute for Teachers. He is also the founder and president of the Kentucky Center for Public Issues and publisher of The Kentucky Journal. He chaired the board that created the Carnegie Center for Literacy and Learning in Lexington. He is on the boards of the Kentucky Long-Term Policy Research Center and the Kentucky Institute for Education Research. He was also appointed by Governor Patton to the School Curriculum, Assessment and Accountability Council and to the Governor's Task Force on Early Childhood.

He lives in Lexington with his wife, Pam Papka Sexton. They have five grown children; all attended Kentucky public schools.

This Week's Speaker....

The speaker for the day was Pat Hankla who is a DNA specialist and has been with the Kentucky State Police Crime Lab since 1973. She stated that DNA is definitive and is helpful to lawyers, detectives, and juries. The purpose is to tell if the right person is being accused. They exonerate about one-third of all persons and a DNA profile gives the sex of the victim and nine other answers. She also talked about blood splatter, which tells at what angle the blood hits the surface. 99% of one person's DNA is identical to another's. She demonstrated the DNA helix and stated that blood and semen are typical cases. This is nuclear DNA analysis. Other types of DNA samples come from fingernail scrapings, saliva, hairs from brushes, and toothbrushes. Samples from toothbrushes are often used in mass disasters like the Trade Center. DNA is found in almost every cell of the body. The Kentucky State Police also maintain a database for sex offenders. It would be a good thing for crime investigations if DNA samples were obtained from everyone at birth. Thank you Steven Gale for a month of excellent programs.
