This Week at Rotary...

The speakers for the day were Dennis Van Horn and his daughter Lauren, who spoke about their trip to Vietnam from January 7-20 of this year. They went with 41 students from Centre College. In 1971, Dennis was in the Vietnam War and returned as a tourist. On stepping off the plane at Hanoi, they first saw water buffalo. A sign read "A destination for the new millennium." They visited several points of interest, including Ho Chi Minh's mausoleum. Vietnam has 80 million people in a country the size of New Mexico. 65% of the population is under 28 and there is a limit of two children per family. They saw the Happy Buddha and the Temple University and Lauren communicated by speaking in French. They saw the cultivation of rice fields and observed a haze, which was pollution from the burning of fossil fuels. They visited the UN World Heritage site at Ha Long Bay and saw

rocks jutting out of the waters. They ate a snake dinner where the whole meal consisted of snake including the wine! They visited Marble Mountain and went to shops run by women who are fierce competitors. Dennis also made some observations about the Vietnam War, which included asking why the United States used Agent Orange, which caused untold neurological damage to many children. The party visited Khe Sanh and went to the area between Hue and the DMZ and a Catholic Church on Highway 1. Most of the bomb craters and bombed-out buildings in Vietnam are now gone. They also went to Phu Bai airport where Dennis went when he was a soldier. In Saigon, they went to a museum where they saw hundreds of photographs taken by 76 photographers who died in the war. They were of many different nationalities including American. Dennis and Lauren concluded their talk by showing photographs of a Vietnamese child and Dennis during the war both flashing the peace sign.

Next Week at Rotary...

Preston Cecil, program chair for June, will introduce **Sheriff Ted Collins** as the speakers at Frankfort Rotary Club on Wednesday, June 18.

Here's what Ted Collins has to say about his department:

Every 27 minutes a Sheriff's Deputy in someone's hometown saves a life. Whether through apprehending a criminal, patrolling county roads, providing foot patrol in a local neighborhood, or by teaching safety tips to school children, Sheriff's Deputies are making a life-changing, life-saving difference.

The Franklin County Sheriff's Office serves residents and patrons of Frankfort, Kentucky's capitol city, as well as the several small communities of Jett, Switzer, Choateville, Peaks mill, Bald knob, Bridgeport, and Swallowfield that surround it. The Franklin County Sheriff's Office is dedicated to saving lives and to providing a safe community for its citizens.

For 18 years it has been my honor to serve as Franklin County Sheriff. I represent 11 full time,

4 part-time and 2 bailiffs who are some of the finest deputies in the Commonwealth. I do the work of one man, but my office oversees the well-being of an entire community, and hundreds of thousands of visitors from throughout the state, nation and world.

The Franklin County Sheriff's Office is located on the second floor of the Franklin County Court House on the Corner of Main and St. Clair in Frankfort.

Ted Collins was born and raised in Frankfort, 5th generation. He attended Bridgeport school and Franklin County High School. Law enforcement training came next. Ted received his training from the FBI, the U.S. Marshall Service, Kentucky State Police, and the Criminal Justice Cabinet in Richmond.

Ted's move into law enforcement came in 1973 when he started working for Sheriff Jack Penn as a deputy sheriff. Ted's work as deputy sheriff continued under the next sheriff, Bob Lewis. Then in 1977 Ted Collins successfully ran for sheriff himself, and he took office in January 1978. State law at the time prohibited sheriffs from succeeding themselves, so after his four-year term Ted began working for Farmers Bank in their security division.

During his time with Farmers Bank, a constitutional amendment was passed allowing sheriffs to succeed themselves. Ted successfully ran for office and began serving as our sheriff in 1986 where he remains today.

Ted Collins is single and lives on the family farm on the west side of Frankfort with members of his family living nearby. He likes to target shoot and boat on the Kentucky River.

Pat Milton began his working experience with Ted Collins in the sheriff's office in 1997 as a part-timer. Pat became a full-time deputy sheriff in early 2002. As a deputy in Frankfort, Milton was the first officer hired on a federal highway safety grant. He has won awards for getting the most DUI arrests and convictions for this agency in Frankfort and has also served as Director of the Drive Smart Program of Kentucky.

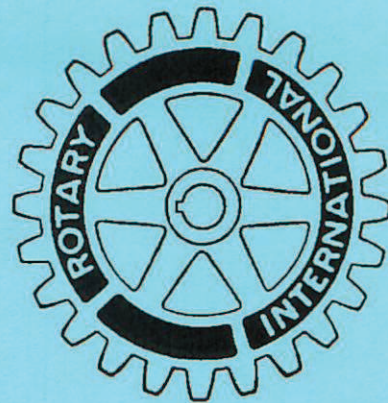

This week at Rotary...

The speakers for the day were Sheriff Ted Collins and Deputy Sheriff Pat Melton. They talked about the duties of the sheriff's office and Homeland Security. Sheriff Collins' office has had training in Homeland Security, which involves preparing for the unknown. We do not know how or where the next attack will occur. His office works closely with the city, state, and health department. His office also issues arrest warrants, serves criminal summons, serves subpoenas, investigates crimes and spends much time in court before five judges as well as taking care of juries. Most of the office income is generated from fees. Nearly \$19,000,000 is collected from taxes, and his office has been audited and all monies have been accounted for. Sheriff Collins explained the process one goes through for obtaining a concealed weapons permit. While we usually think of handguns as concealed weapons,

it could also be a knife or any dangerous instrument that can cause great bodily harm. He has received a Federal Highway Safety grant to help catch traffic violators and drunken drivers. He once caught a motorcyclist going 127 miles per hour. Tools used in DUI cases were demonstrated, including field sobriety tests and preliminary breath tests. Also, he stated that 95% of child restraint seats are put in incorrectly. He also demonstrated the the "stop stick" used to puncture the tires of fleeing criminals.

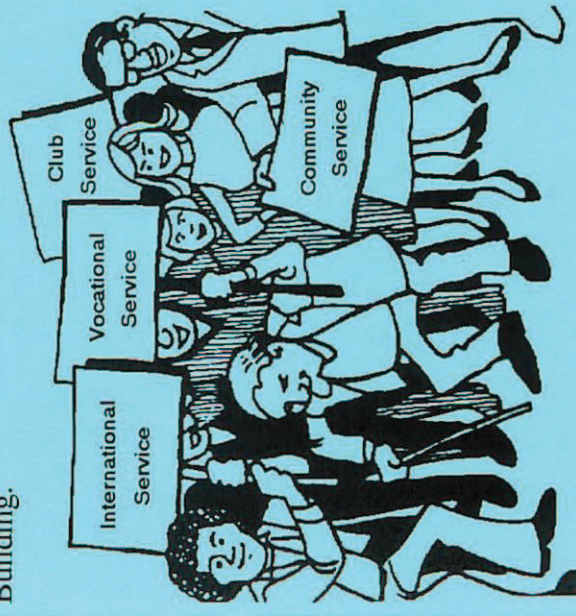

Linda Hoback Greenwell was born in May of 1949 to Vergie Mae Williams Hoback of Graves County and Lewis B. Hoback of Larue County. Linda's maternal relatives still live in Graves County. Some of her paternal relatives have gravitated to Hardin County.



Linda moved to Spencer County in 1992. When she attempted to register to vote, she was advised, "If you register as a Republican, you can't vote in this county. In order to vote here in this county, you will have to register as a Democrat". She vowed to make a change in that attitude and nullify that statement.

Her first experience with a campaign was when her friend and neighbor Bill Karrer ran as a Republican candidate for County Judge Executive in Spencer County. The voter ratio was nine Democrats to every Republican, but Candidate Karrer lost by only 57 votes. During that election, there were violations in election laws and when Linda brought these violations to

Shockley Speaks to Shelby Rotary

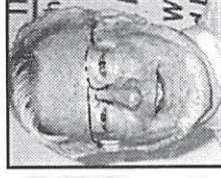
