## Next Week at Rotary...

Congressman Ernie Fletcher will be the speaker at the Aug. 13 meeting of our Rotary Club.



Fletcher was born in Mt. Sterling, KY on November 12, 1952. After graduating from Lexington LaFayette he obtained his B.S. from the UK College of Engineering, and an M.D. from the UK College of Medicine. He served in the Air Force from 1974-1979; was a member of the Kentucky state house of representatives, 1994-1996; and was elected to Congress in 1999.

**Economic Prosperity & Jobs:** Although Kentucky has come a long way in certain areas, compared with other states, there are still many issues that must be addressed in order to make Kentucky more praiseworthy, to attract quality businesses and jobs in a new economy and to encourage quality economic growth. If we cut wasteful spending, eliminate needless regulation and get the bureaucracy out of the way, we can make Kentucky business-friendly again and create more jobs. We will make Kentucky the envy of states around us.

**Medicaid Reform:** Kentucky is struggling with a national trend of out-of-control Medicaid cost and will be facing a \$200 million + shortfall in 2004. Dr. Fletcher understands the need to address this problem and will work to provide a cure to an ailing system.

**Education:** Kentucky must get back to the basics when it comes to providing our children with the best education possible. Keeping and attracting the best teachers must be a priority while also giving them the necessary resources to get their jobs done.

**Budget:** The burden of balancing Kentucky's budget should not be placed on the backs of hard-working Kentuckians but should be placed directly on Frankfort, where government spending has far outpaced available revenues. Frankfort should begin an immediate self-examination and balance their books just as Kentucky's families do around the kitchen table each and every month. The current crisis facing Kentucky is not caused by taxing too little but by spending too much. That's why Congressman Fletcher is opposed to increasing taxes. Ultimately, fiscal discipline must be returned to Frankfort to ensure a balanced budget that supports education, healthcare, public safety and the overall well being of every Kentuckian.

**Family Farmers:** Protecting and preserving our family farmers and horse heritage must be a priority of Kentucky's next Governor. Congressman Fletcher has introduced the Tobacco Equity Elimination legislation in the United States Congress to help Kentucky's family tobacco farmers. This legislation would return billions of dollars to Kentucky and has been endorsed by the: Kentucky Farm Bureau, Alliance for Health, Economic and Agricultural Development, Concerned Friends of Tobacco, American Cancer Society, American Heart Association, Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids, Burly Tobacco Growers Cooperative, Dark-Fired Tobacco Association, Flue-Cured Stabilization Program and the Commodity Growers Association.

## This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Representative Derrick Graham, who discussed issues facing the 2003 General Assembly. The state budget was the most important issue, since no budget was passed the previous year. The last session adjourned on March 25 and the budget cuts were not as painful as had been previously thought. However, there is a \$450 million shortfall in Medicaid. 250 political jobs will have been eliminated by the end of the year. 361 merit system jobs have been eliminated. Graham proposed HB 387, which protects rank-and-file state employees, and he will bring it up again in 2004. Instead of raises based on a percentage of the employee's salary there are increments of \$1800 next year. A new provision is that an employee must have worked 10 years before he is eligible for his health insurance premiums being paid upon retirement. The idea is to try to protect schools against budget cuts. \$100 million has been allocated for the construction of new

schools and Franklin County will get \$8.1 million for a new school at Bridgeport. Clean water is another priority and Franklin County will get \$750,000 in new water projects. Other issues faced by the 2003 legislature included Homeland Security, drug prescriptions written by out-of-state doctors and the new Amber Alert system which has already produced results. There were many other issues that needed addressing but time simply ran out. Issues regarding education and Medicaid funding will be addressed in 2003. Thank you Representative Graham for a very interesting and informative program.

The speaker for the day was Congressman Ernie Fletcher who was introduced by Joe Johnson and arranged by Dave Weller. Congressman Fletcher spoke on why he is running for Governor. Kentuckians are looking for new leadership and for someone we can be proud of and really support. President Bush brought talented people into his administration, and Congressman Fletcher wants to do the same thing in the governor's office. Bush had to improve the military and after 9/11 restore confidence in traveling. He has provided tax relief for a flagging economy. Changes need to be made in state gov-

Clubs and districts may determine specific deadlines for their competitions at the discretion of the governor. District contest entries must be received by Rotary International no later than 15 March 2004.

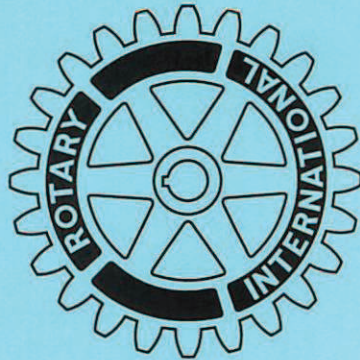

**Project to boost emergency medical services in Mexico**

(News Basket)—A fire breaks out at a home in Hermosillo, Sonora, Mexico. Eventually, a single fire truck – the only one serving the city's 500,000 residents – arrives at the scene. Although firefighters act quickly to extinguish the blaze, they cannot offer assistance to the surviving victims who must wait a half-hour or more for Red Cross volunteers to arrive and transport them to the hospital. Even then, they have to wait longer for treatment because the Red Cross volunteers are not qualified to stabilize patients or provide emergency medical care.

Scenes like these occur all too frequently in Mexico, where little money is available for medical equipment or for training emergency medical personnel, explains Leonard Rodriguez of the Rotary Club of North Phoenix, AZ. With assistance from a \$50,000 Matching Grant from The Rotary Foundation, the North Phoenix club teamed up with the Rotary Club of Hermosillo, Mexico, on a long-term project that they hope will create a model for improving emergency medical services throughout Mexico.

During the first phase of the project, volunteers from the Phoenix fire department spent several days in Hermosillo training local firefighters in basic first aid and emergency life-support techniques. North Phoenix Rotarians also donated two refurbished ambulances to Hermosillo. In the next phase of the international project, Phoenix Rotarians will send a group of Hermosillo firefighters for three months of paramedics training.

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Donna Gibson, who is the Director of the Paul Sawyer Library. She gave a brief overview of the history of the library stating that in 1880, Frankfort was the only state capital that did not have a federal courthouse. In 1882, the Congress passed a bill creating federal district court in Frankfort and in 1887, the present building was completed. The post office was on the first floor with the courtroom being on the second floor. The new federal courthouse was built in 1964 and the Paul Sawyer Public Library moved into the building. A major renovation was completed in 1987 with the creation of the children's room. Plans for a new library building next door are in the works. Donna encouraged all Rotarians to use the library as often as possible and she is available to answer all questions. The library has an "outreach program" for people who cannot make it to the

library. Thank you Donna for a most interesting and informative program.

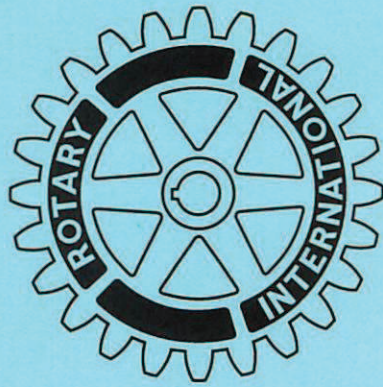

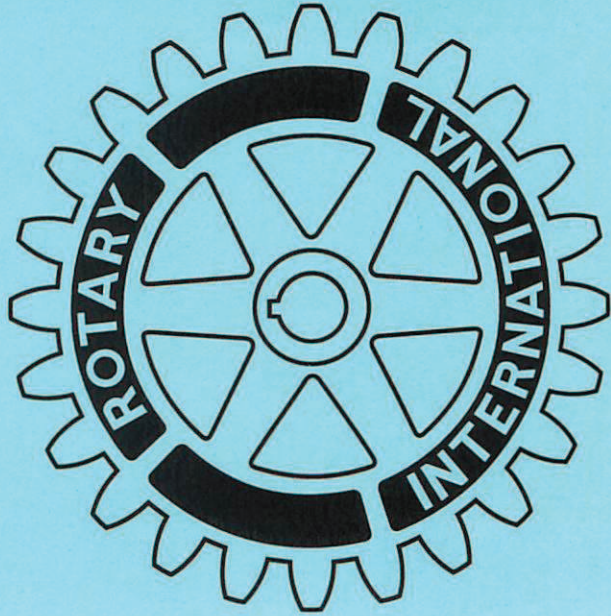

### **This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Peg Dickson, who is the Director of the Thom Hill Learning Center. She started out by asking the Club how much it knows about the Learning Center. It is a part of the Frankfort/Franklin County Community Education and has after-school programs. Lillian Nunnelly started the Learning Center as an opportunity for people to continue their education. For example, life skills and resumé writing are taught. The Learning Center serves a diverse population. Over 11,000 people in Franklin County have less than a high school diploma. The Learning Center is trying to reach out to the community and work with industries to provide needed workplace skills. The Center

needs community support, and there is always a need for volunteers. There is a great need for volunteers to increase student's learning skills and to help people working on their GED. If a student is reading at less than a fifth grade level, there is a need for one-on-one assistance. The Center also works with at-risk persons and offers the WIN ("Whatever Is Needed") program to obtain life skills. Some students have problems other than a lack of education, so there are other classes such as those dealing with anger management. There are also family-nurturing programs and English for speakers of other languages programs. There is what is known as the FLIP program to provide family literacy courses and which provides day care for mothers mostly working on their GED. Both fathers and mothers are involved in the programs and there is even a teacher for the jail to help inmates get their GED. Peg also mentioned the ROAR ("Reach Out And Read") program. (Our club has a committee working in this program.) This is a literacy program for children from birth to five years of age. Only 50% of parents read to their children and this program is designed to encourage reading. Thank you Peg for a most informative and interesting program.
