Don M. Blandin, President

American Savings Education Council

Don Blandin was appointed president of the American Savings Education Council (ASEC) in January 1996. Established in July 1995, ASEC is a coalition of private- and public-sector institutions that undertakes initiatives to raise public awareness about what is needed to ensure long-term personal financial independence. ASEC is a program of the Employee Benefit Research Institute Education and Research Fund (EBRI-ERF), a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, educational organization.

ASEC works through its partners to educate Americans on all aspects of personal finance, saving, and wealth development, including credit management, college savings, home purchase, and retirement planning. ASEC develops and distributes multi-media educational materials, many of which are available via the Internet at: [www.asec.org](http://www.asec.org) and [www.choosetosave.org](http://www.choosetosave.org)

From 1981 to 1994, Don was at the Business-Higher Education Forum, including eight years as director from 1986 to 1994. The Forum, a group of corporate CEOs and university presidents, identified and acted on issues of mutual concern to the business and academic communities. Issues

addressed during Don's tenure included international competitiveness, technological innovation, education and training, the environment, and the economy.

Don serves on several boards including the JumpStart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy as Vice President of the Board of Directors and the Certified Financial Planner(r) Board of Standards as a member of the CFP(tm) Board of Governors and chairman of its national Consumer Advisory Council.

As an expert in the areas of financial education and on private- and public-sector coalition building, Don is frequently asked to speak at conferences, seminars, and other events. He has also been featured in numerous radio and television broadcast segments and publications such as NBC's Today Show, CNN, Bloomberg Radio, National Public Radio, ABC News, FOX News, USA TODAY, Reader's Digest, New York Times, Money, Time, Business Week, Kiplinger's Personal Finance, Fortune, Black Enterprise, The Washington Post, Parenting, Associated Press, and CBS MarketWatch. In addition, Don has testified before Congress for both the U.S. Senate and the House of Representatives on issues related to financial literacy and education.

Don holds a Bachelor of Arts in political science from California State University, Hayward, and a Master of Public Administration degree from The American University in Washington, DC. He and his wife, Nanette, reside in Washington, DC with their son Devon and daughter Sara.

Judge Larry VanMeter, a native of Winchester, served as Fayette District Judge from 1994 to 1999, and has served as Fayette Circuit Judge from 1999 to the present. Before this service, Judge VanMeter was a partner in the Lexington law firm of Stoll, Keenon & Park.

Larry and his wife, Lucy Bryans VanMeter, have four children. The VanMeters have lived in Lexington since 1981. Over the years, Judge VanMeter has been actively involved in the community, serving on the boards of Sullivan College Paralegal Studies and Tom Browning Boys and Girls Club, as well as coaching for the Lexington Youth Soccer Association, Lexington Parks and Recreation Department and Eastern Little League.

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Judge Lewis Paisley, who is a judge on the Kentucky Court of Appeals. He gave the Club a brief overview of the history of the courts. The new court system began with the passage of the Judicial Article in 1974 and became effective in 1976. Instead of two tiers, the court system now has four tiers with a new Court of Appeals, a Supreme Court, a Circuit Court and a District Court to replace the old county court system. There are seven appellate districts, and the Court of Appeals hears cases from the Circuit Court and the Workers' Compensation Board. The Court of Appeals renders 120 opinions per month. Judge Paisley initiated Night Court in Fayette County, which begins at 5 PM, and the LINKS system, which places

domestic violence cases on a computer. He has participated in the Drug Court program, which is important because many people commit crimes simply because they are on drugs. If you stop the drug abuse, you stop the crimes. In responding to a question from the floor, he stated that he is now of the opinion that cameras in the courtroom do have a subtle effect on the proceedings so that he banned them from his courtroom. Thank you Dave Weller for doing your usual superlative job in bringing us a month of excellent programs.

**Ben Chandler, Candidate for Governor**  
 Combining new ideas for Kentucky's future with the bold leadership necessary to see them through, Ben Chandler has delivered dramatic results for the people of the Commonwealth.



Chandler was first elected Attorney General of Kentucky in 1995, becoming the youngest Attorney General in the nation at that time. He has taken action to protect Kentucky seniors, winning the largest criminal penalty for patient neglect and abuse against a nursing home corporation in American history.

Chandler fought successfully for the passage of Kentucky's "Megan's Law" to protect women and children from sexual offenders, as well as legislation to increase the amount of restitution that all criminals must pay to the victims of their crimes. He also worked to strengthen Kentucky's laws against consumer scams, prescription drug abuse, and offenses against the elderly.

Chandler graduated with distinction from the University of Kentucky with a B.A. in history, and holds a J.D. from the University of Kentucky College of Law.

Born on September 12, 1959, Chandler lives in Woodford County, Kentucky with his wife Jennifer and their three children - Lucie, Albert IV, and Branham. The Chandlers are members of Pisgah Presbyterian Church.

## This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Don M. Blandin, president of the American Savings Education Council, which was organized by the Social Security Administration in 1995 in response to the sagging savings rate of Americans. Americans tend to overestimate their savings while underestimating their life spans. Social Security was never intended to be the sole source of retirement funds. It constitutes only about 40% of pre-retirement income, and we must save and invest *beyond* Social Security to maintain the same lifestyle. The four steps for prospective

retirees are: (1) Calculate your and your family's needs; (2) Plan how to accumulate money & other assets to help meet your needs; (3) Act on your plan and change your savings habits. (4) Reassess your financial needs annually using your Social Security statement. If you do not plan and save, you cannot retire as soon as you want or not at all. Finally, the quote that Don ended his comments with was from Yogi Berra and the "your" should be "you're".

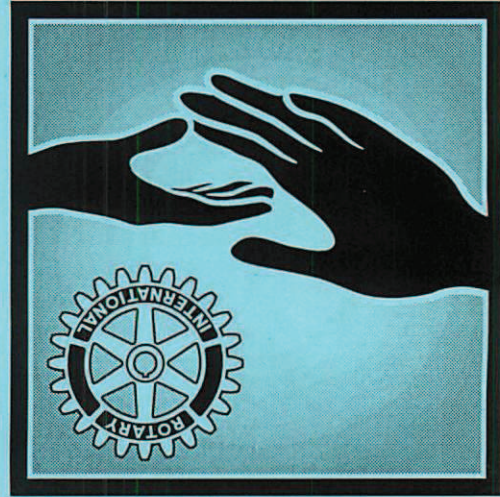
