**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Dan Wood, Executive Director of the National Christian College Athletic Association. A basketball tournament begins next week in Frankfort at the Civic Center, with the women's teams coming first and then the men's. The intercollegiate championship is used for outreach for Christian service projects in the community. The idea is to put young people in service roles. There are 108 Christ-centered colleges, and the member schools have quality athletes. Athletics, academics, and outreach are the objectives that center on Christian higher education. This is part of the education opportunity. In the Christian service projects, Christian athletes are put to work in various projects across the country. The schools work with the United Way and local ministries. Concerning projects abroad, the groups have sponsored clinics in soccer in Amsterdam, Russia, and the Czech Republic, and everyone wants to see student-athletes who excel. Their lives are changed forever. The projects put kids in service, and it does not matter who wins the games. Community service projects involve things like the food bank. These are athletes inside the academic institutions and not outside

or larger than the academic programs. The Christian service projects involve: (1) Meeting with local ministries; (2) Work with the Stewart Home School; (3) Work with the Salvation Army, P.U.S.H. and The King Center. Sixteen teams will be right here in Frankfort which, in addition to the outreach, will confer an economic benefit. The athletes will perform some 1400 Christian service hours. Don appealed to us all to put ourselves in a service project. He encouraged us all to be a part of a game plan for life and seek to serve rather than to be served.

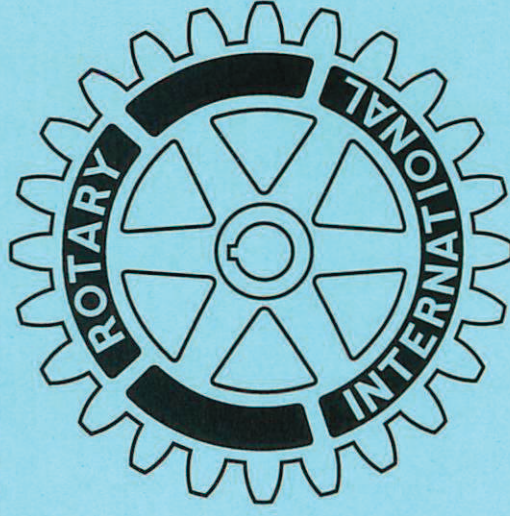

## *Next Week at Rotary...*

Lisbon Hardy last spoke to the Frankfort Rotary Club when she served as President of the Frankfort Area Chamber of Commerce in 1999.

Lisbon is Senior Vice President for Retail Banking with Farmers Bank & Capital Trust Co. Her duties primarily involve the delivery of products and services through the Bank's branch network, but she also oversees a number of product lines and does project administration. She has been able to participate as a volunteer with a number of organizations while employed at the Bank including United Way, CASA, Frankfort Bank including United Way, CASA, Frankfort Rehabilitation, CAKY, American Diabetes Association and the Kentucky Historical Society. She is a member of the First Christian Church.

Lisbon is married to Rob Hardy, General Counsel, Investors Heritage Life Insurance Company, and they have two children, Houston Waterfield Hardy, 16 years and Hallie Davis Hardy, a new teen at thirteen. Hallie was onset with Type 1 diabetes in 2001. This event has changed the Hardys' lives, and Lisbon has been



invited by Sarah Gowins to talk about her experiences with Hallie and diabetes.

Diabetes is a chronic disease that has no cure and it affects 18.2 million people in the United States. She will define the types of diabetes and review who is at risk as outlined by the American Diabetes Association (ADA). ADA materials concerning diabetes will be available at the meeting.

### **This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Jamey Bennett who is Executive Vice President of Farmers Capital Insurance Corporation. He spoke about the health care crisis in this country and about how the costs of insurance are continuing to escalate. His comments are based on the premise that our health care delivery system is a measure of society's values. In this country, we value life and

the quality of life. Women have a greater chance of being disabled than men are since they are burdened with having to take care of men. We keep people alive longer today including people who have chronic illnesses. 14% of our Gross Domestic Product is absorbed by health care. He pointed to Taiwan as the best place to get sick since you pay a doctor until you get sick and then pay no more. From the Second World War until 1983, our health care system was mostly a pay as you go service. However, in 1983, we experienced managed care otherwise known as HMOs. This did not work and the costs of health care are still going up drastically. In 1992, health care reform came to Kentucky and the General Assembly issued mandates on health insurance companies. At that time we had 20 health insurance companies, but today we have six. Health care mandates should share part of the blame. As of this year, the trend is that health care costs are going up 16% per year. Things simply cannot continue to go the way they have been going. He listed several things that have to change: (1) The delivery of the health care system has to be looked at. Specialization in hospitals will be more effective; (2) Concerning medical malpractice, many doctors are practicing "scared medicine" by which doctors order many tests; (3) Pharmaceuticals make up 35% of total health care costs. This industry needs reforming. We have financed research for the world. This is a \$400 billion a year industry and he gave examples of aggressive pressure tactics by drug company representatives. Direct advertising by drug companies needs to be curtailed; (4) For too long, insurance agents have kept consumers in the dark. We need to become better-educated consumers. There is not one quick easy fix but things should improve as the consumer has more information and becomes better informed. Also, there is excessive use of emergency services and he cited one case of a patient going to the emergency room with bad dandruff! Lastly, we all need to develop healthier life styles and prayer would not

hurt either. Thank you Jamey for a very informative and educational program.

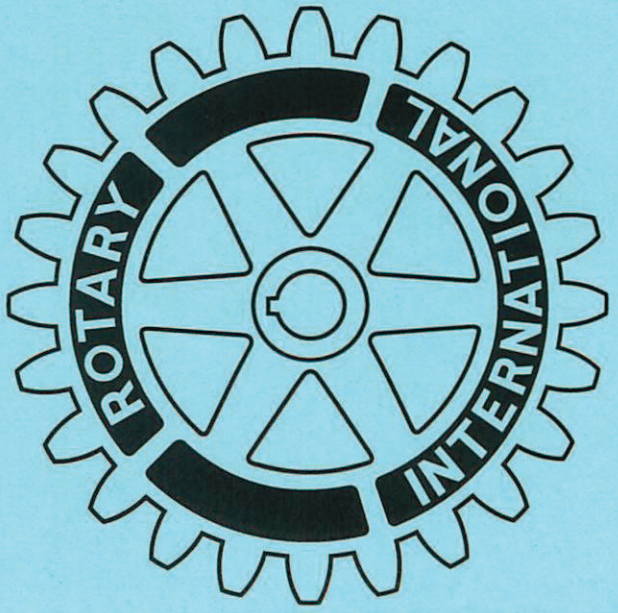

### This Week's Speaker...

Lisbon Hardy spoke of her experiences and those of her extended family in dealing with the news that in 2001 her 11 year old daughter, Hallie, was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes, which is the inability of the body to manufacture insulin. Roughly 5% of diabetics are Type 1. The rest are Type 2, where the body cells don't recognize the insulin. Lisbon and Hallie wrote the "Hallie Book" (which Hallie illustrated), with copies to all their friends and relatives, so that they would understand Hallie and her special needs, and help Hallie to lead as close as possible a normal life — traveling, spending the night, etc. Hallie's insulin pump is great, in that she controls

her insulin, and get a small dosage all day long. Lisbon said that exercise and diet are extremely important for a diabetic to maintain a healthy life style. She noted that the incidence of diabetes has increased 61% since 1990, and that \$1 out of every \$7 is spent on diabetes.

**Sam Blackburn, candidate in the Democratic primary for the 56th District House Seat**



Blackburn began his career in the finance industry in 1965 managing Capital Finance for nine years. He managed the Commonwealth Credit Union for two years before joining Farmers Bank where he worked for twenty years rising to Senior Vice President. Blackburn retired last August after seven years as Executive Director of the Kentucky Real Estate Appraisers Board. During his tenure at the Appraisers Board, Blackburn was elected National President of the Association of Appraiser Regulatory Officials.

Blackburn is a graduate of the Stonier Graduate School of Banking for senior banking officers and served 11 years on the Board of Directors of the Lawrenceburg National Bank.

Blackburn has been active in his community, and was recognized for his civic endeavors by being nominated in 1984 for President Reagan's Volunteer Action Award. Blackburn served as

Chairman of the Frankfort/Franklin County United Way, Chairman for Walk America March of Dimes, President of the Frankfort Lions Club and Chairman of the Kentucky State University Advisory Council. He was twice elected President of the Frankfort/Franklin County Chamber of Commerce, Chairman of the Capital Expo Festival and served several years on the North Woodford Water District. He served as the first Chairman of the Frankfort/Franklin County Crime Stoppers and was instrumental in getting the organization started. The speaker for the day was Tom Midkiff, who is a financial advisor at the Farmers Bank and Capital Trust Company. He spoke about several types of investments such as money markets, certificates of deposit, municipal bonds, corporate bonds, variable annuities, mutual funds, Treasury notes, and junk bonds and their respective rates of return. He stated that while certificates of deposit have relative low rates of return, they are FDIC insured. Just because the investment is high rated does not mean it is 100% guaranteed. **Chris Derry, Founder of**

**Bluegrass Institute for Public Policy**

The Bluegrass Institute is Kentucky's only politically non-partisan, privately-funded public policy "think tank." Derry, who is president and founder of the Institute, describes it as a resource of analysis of government efficiency. His goal is for the Institute to become an information and analysis resource for all Kentuckians.

The aim of the organization is to provide local and state policy-makers with a rigorous, objective, and understandable analysis of specific policy initiatives. It also identifies practical alternatives for action on critical state and local issues.

Derry envisions the Bluegrass Institute, based in Bowling Green, as an association of writers, speakers, and thinkers committed to the pursuit of free market solutions consistent with respect for individual liberty, economic freedom, personal responsibility and respect for others.

Derry, a former stockbroker who is a regional director for an institutional asset management firm and high school economics teacher, recently became concerned with a proposed hike of the occupational tax in Bowling Green. The city

council action increased the occupational tax as a last alternative to generating necessary revenues to fund Bowling Green city government.

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Sam Blackburn, who is a candidate for the 56th District in the House of Representatives. He stated that there is a need for improvement in the way we make laws and he wants to have input in the Kentucky General Assembly. Only one in five voters turn out in elections, although in the Bluegrass the percentage is somewhat higher at 30-35% This voter apathy can be ascribed in part to the fact that many

persons do not believe that their vote counts. His challenge is to a long-term incumbent who has many PACs as contributors. He fears that many legislators do not have the will to tackle this state's problems. He had a lot of praise for state Representative Derrick Graham and for all the hard work he has done in the legislature. Kentucky is facing many tough issues, but unfortunately many legislators forget they are there to represent the best interests of the state. He listed the following issues the legislature is facing: (1) The budget is the most pressing problem and in the struggle for tax reform, everything must be on the table. Tax revenues must grow with the economy. Jobs have been lost in Franklin County like Fruit of the Loom; (2) Affordable health care is another pressing issue. There is a need for more competition to bring more health care providers to Kentucky; (3) Public employees and teachers deserve better compensation; (4) The condition of roads in Kentucky needs addressing. Bad roads will have a negative effect on tourism. We need to elect officials who are not afraid to make long-term decisions. Too many elected officials forget they are elected to serve the people. Partisan politics played too big a role in the 2004 Session but the people have come to expect nothing better. We need political courage back in the General Assembly. He responded to the following questions raised by the audience: (1) Negative ads are the cause of much voter apathy. We should vote against candidates who resort to negative ads; (2) People should pay their fair share of taxes for tax reform to be effective. Everyone should be on a level playing field; (3) Kentucky desperately needs money and the revenue neutral concept gives him problems. Thank you Sam for a very interesting and informative program.

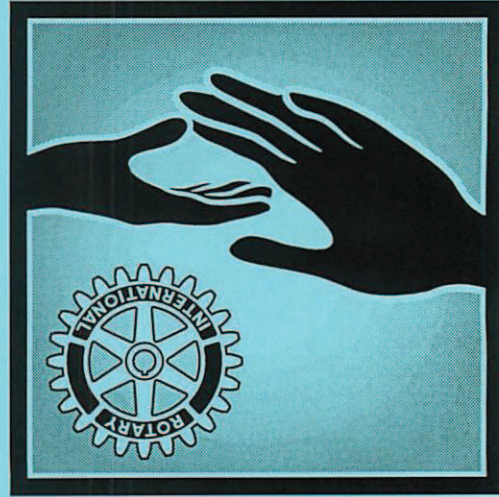
