

Next Week at Rotary...

James C. Cobb is the State Geologist of Kentucky and Director of the Kentucky Geological Survey at the University of Kentucky. He was appointed in 1999 following the retirement of Donald C. Haney. The permanent state geological survey was founded in 1854. There have been twelve successive surveys in Kentucky and Jim is the Twelfth State Geologist of Kentucky.



Jim has been at the Kentucky Geological Survey for 25 years. Previously he was head of the Coal Section and later Assistant State Geologist. He attended Eastern Kentucky University (MS) and the University of Illinois (Ph.D. & BS). The Kentucky Geological Survey under Jim will emphasize the creation of a comprehensive database of maps and information on Kentucky's water, fuel, hazards, and mineral resources accessible to the public on the Internet. Traditional areas of excellence at KGS have been coal, oil and gas, karst and groundwater hydrology, and seismology. These areas will remain an important part of the KGS program.

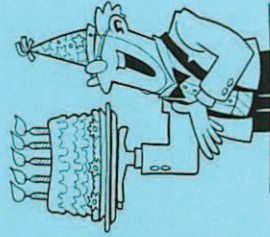

This Week's Speaker....

The speaker for the day was Byron Crawford, who was introduced by Bill Elam. He started out his talk by stating that most people do not care what an opinion columnist thinks and he asked how many people do you know go to an opinion columnist to get advice on a particular issue? Opinion columnists do not usually change people's minds. He also talked about how our parents often form our opinions, in that his mother is a fire-breathing Democrat and his father a Lincoln Republican. He also talked about 24-hour newscasts and how they look for the most sensational story on a slow news day. They use professional analysts to help you interpret the news. After Watergate, investigative reporting became a fad that lasted a while with reporters looking for "literate Watergates" where they could find one. By

contrast, Byron stated that he is a "just the facts, please" reporter. One does not need to read the opinion page first but one should first read the facts from all sides. A good reporter should give people the entire story, as impartially as possible, and then let the reader decide. An editorial position should not look to be supported by a news story. When they do, the result is that then we have writers writing about stories that never happened. This, unfortunately, is the end product of the rush to be the biggest, the best, and the first in writing about the story of the day. The goal seems to be how compelling one can write a story. He talked about the "pipeline syndrome." The typical attitude today appears to be that, if it feels good then this is right. With this philosophy, when kids come out of the pipeline into the work force, we have examples that he recently experienced of a front wheel coming off his car when he drove it out of the shop or someone's \$600 Derby box tickets being sent to Louisville instead of Shelbyville simply because he had the same post office box number as the other individual. He fears there is often inattention to detail when a load is not properly tied down on a truck with terrible results. He fears that often people only pay attention to their own little area of interest but do not know where the ship is heading. America is like a pyramid with thoughtful and wise people at the top but it seems that the top is getting smaller while the bottom is getting bigger. He ended his talk by urging us all to stay at the top of the pyramid. Thank you Byron for a very thoughtful talk and Bill Elam for bringing Byron Crawford to us.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Dr. James Cobb, chief geologist with the Geological Survey at the University of Kentucky. The Geological Survey was founded in 1837, which looked for resources like timber, water, salt and iron ore. Many of the old iron furnaces can still be found around Kentucky. Experts in geology made maps and found where valuable resources are located. In turn, the public can build an industrial base on this information. This is an American idea, which goes along with democracy to put into the hands of the public something they can use. For example, hillsides in Kentucky are not stable and this is the kind of thing that geological surveys work on. The Geological Survey receives funding from state and federal agencies. In times of national crisis, people want to be secure in their resources. This kind of information is put on computers so people will have access to it. Dr. Cobb is the twelfth state geologist, with W.W. Mather being

the first. The first official geological survey was operated from New Harmony, Indiana. Dr. Robert Peter was hired in Lexington and he analyzed the chemistry of rocks, and he produced the first geological maps of Kentucky. After the Civil War, coal became more important and in turn oil and gas came in. Incredibly, they actually dumped oil in the river where it drifted downstream to be collected below! In 1904, a Dr. Norwood was the geologist when coal was big but unfortunately there were many fatalities from mineshaft collapses. Thus, the first Department of Mines and Minerals came into being. Dr. Gilson was a later day geologist who was also a founder of the state parks system. He published some 400 publications. The Geological Survey has been broadened into the area of the study of earthquakes. An example is the New Madrid fault, which is of concern to far western Kentucky. Today more than ever, there is a need to convert coal into clean resources. Kentucky produces 35% of the natural gas we use but only 2% of the oil use here. Kentucky also produces much cement, limestone, and clay. Maps have been converted to computer use. This information is important because sinkholes and landslides can now be found on computer. Maps and other publications are available at the UK office and on line. This was another great program brought to us by Bill Elam as evidenced by the numerous questions at the conclusion of Dr. Cobb's talk.

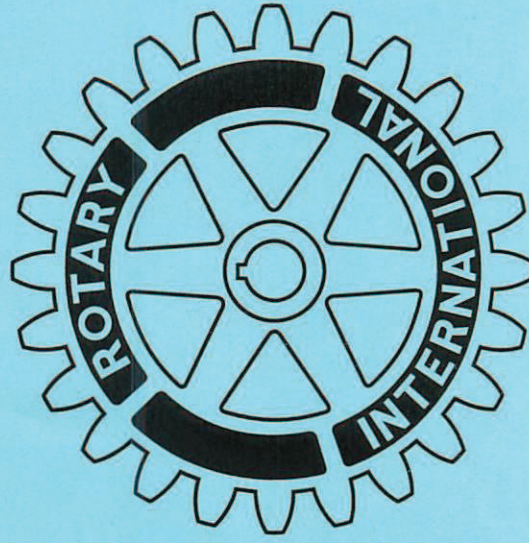

Next Week at Rotary...

Phil Danhauer is the Chief of the Finance Division of the Kentucky District Office for the U.S. Small Business Administration. His duties oversee the SBA's Loan Processing, Servicing and Liquidation for both the 7(a) and 504 loan programs in Kentucky.

Before being transferred to his present position in Louisville, Mr. Danhauer was the Director of the SBA One Stop Capital Shop (OSCS) located at the Center for Rural Development in Somerset, KY. The SBA established an OSCS in each Empowerment Zone as an economic development initiative. The mission of the OSCS was to promote small business through the SBA loan guaranty programs, provide technical assistance with the Business Information Centers (BIC) and Small Business Development Centers (SBDC).

Using his background in banking and financial management for service-based companies, Mr. Danhauer previously was the Director of the Jackson County Entrepreneurship Center operated by Eastern Kentucky University. This Empowerment Zone initiative assisted over 75 new businesses to start or expand as a result of its 12-week entrepreneurship training programs. His work was recognized nationally by the National

Association of Management and Technical Assistance Centers (NAMTAC) and the SBA Office of Advocacy by receiving the Outstanding Project of the Year Award and being named the Vision 2000: State Model of Excellence Award winner in Rural Development.

Speaking engagements have included national and state forums. He presented Developing an Entrepreneurial Community at the annual White House Conference on Empowerment Zones and Entrepreneurship Training as an Economic Development Tool at the joint statewide meeting of the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce and the Kentucky Industrial Development Council. He was appointed to the Kentucky Appalachian Regional Commission's Entrepreneurship Issue Team.

Mr. Danhauer holds a Master of Business Administration degree from Eastern Kentucky University and an undergraduate Bachelor of Arts degree from Bellarmine College. Following his undergraduate studies, he served in the United States Marine Corps. An Owensboro, Kentucky native, he has been married to his wife Jeanna for 35 years and they have two adult children. Personal interests include fly-fishing, golf, and backpacking.

This Week's Speaker...

Mr. Harold Fletcher provided fellow Rotarians with an interesting and informative slide show and discussion of his February 20th mission trip to Jamaica. Participating as a member of the First Christian Church of Frankfort, he and others determined that there was a need for assistance to this impoverished part of Central America. Initially started as a medical mission, the effort has expanded into the earlier construction of a house and most recently a playground in the Mansfield Heights neighborhood, a very impoverished area of the country. Designed by Mr. Fletcher, the playground equipment was constructed on the grounds of the Love Basic School. Partnering with the local Rotary and Kiwanis Clubs in the area, local laborers were hired to assist in this project. All who participated walked 2½ miles to the work site. Once the work was finished, the tools brought with them were given away to local laborers to help them with future jobs. A plaque was affixed to the playground equipment that read "In Honor of Mary Simons", a faithful member of the church.

The work group also had an opportunity to tour the island and was treated by local Rotarians and officials to authentic Jamaican meals and entertainment. Devotionals were conducted each day as an integral part of the work effort. Mr. Fletcher stated, "Missions should be a way of life for everyone. They are life changing and will make a difference in one's life!" It was evident to everyone of his commitment to helping the underprivileged through his work in the church.

He urged everyone to become involved and mentioned the Gene Hilien First Christian Church Golf Scramble to be held on May 28th with the proceeds to support mission work. He noted that the church will host a large group of Jamaican children in July.

Mr. Fletcher answered many questions reflecting the Rotarian's interest in his presentation. President Dykman noted afterwards that Mr. Fletcher is a candidate for the state Senate in the elections to be held in November.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Phillip W. Danhauer, Chief of Finance with the United States Small Business Administration in Kentucky, and was introduced by Bill Elam. He told the humorous but true story of "lawn chair Larry" who was a retired truck driver who chose not to use the SBA loan program to finance his venture to attach weather balloons to a lawn chair and float above the ground which ended up being a several hour ordeal to a height of some 15,000 feet. Rather, he self-funded his venture and also failed to use the technical assistance of the SBA. He also ignored the licensing requirements in flying his lawn chair as well as the SBA advocacy program because he was self-motivated. He used a pellet gun to pop several of the balloons for his descent. When asked why he did this, he replied "You can't just sit there!" 10% of small businessmen go into business for themselves because they lost or retired from their jobs. The SBA has numerous success stories for which they are proud. There is an upturn in small businesses today and the SBA can be a part of funding new businesses through making loans. We often hear about the business failures, which are in the 70-80% area, but many of the respondents had started four or more businesses and then moved on to something else. Many sell their businesses and the buyer then sets up a new corporation so in fact the business has survived. It is a statistical misnomer to say that the businesses failed. The naysayers will often come back and say later that they said the business would be successful so we are all encouraged to be supportive of new ideas although not every concept will be successful. Even if you are on the right track, you will get run over if you just sit there. Today, 90% of new jobs are in small businesses. 95% of Kentucky businesses are eligible for small business loans.

U.S. senators introduce Rotary Centennial stamp bill

U.S. Senators Russell Feingold, of Wisconsin, and Richard Lugar, of Indiana, introduced companion legislation this week on a resolution urging the United States Postal Service to issue a commemorative stamp in honor of Rotary's 100th anniversary and the organization's efforts to eliminate polio worldwide.

A similar resolution was introduced to the House of Representatives by U.S. Representative Brad Sherman, of California, in February. The resolution has 67 congressional co-sponsors.

"Rotarians are volunteers who support thousands of humanitarian and educational projects that benefit each of our communities," said Sherman. "The commemorative stamp will recognize Rotary's first 100 years of public service."

At least one other Rotary-related resolution has been introduced on Capitol Hill. On 18

November 2003, Rep. Joe Wilson, of South Carolina, introduced a resolution "recognizing the establishment of the Rotary Club of Capitol Hill and the important contributions of Rotary clubs to society."

Rotary has a presence in the U.S. capital through its advocacy for polio eradication and the activities of Washington, D.C.-area clubs. For several years, the organization has honored many members of Congress with the Polio Eradication Champion Award for their support in securing critically needed funds to achieve a polio-free world.

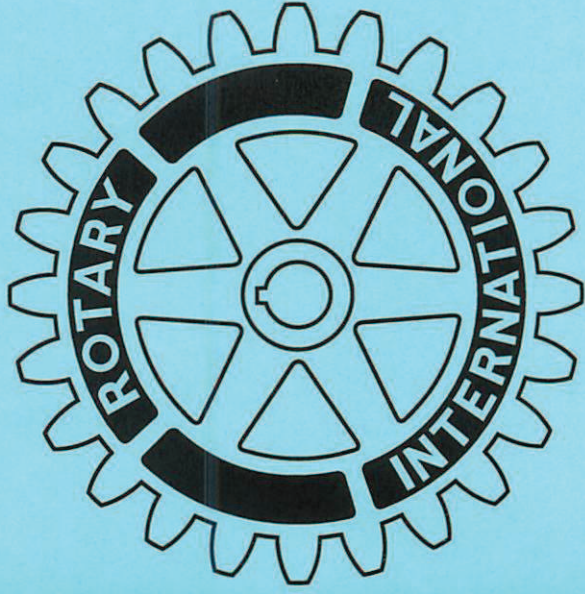

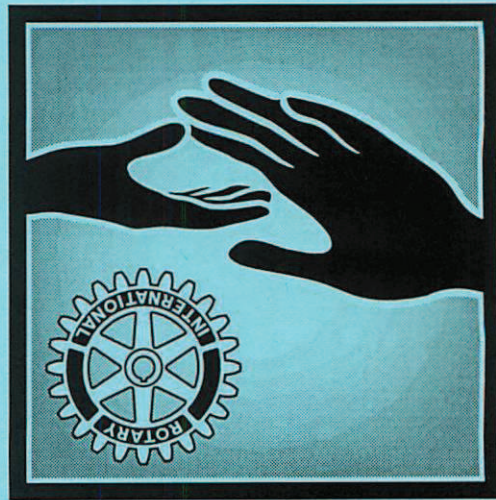
