This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was author Ron Elliott, who spoke about Irvin S. Cobb and was introduced by Ron Bryant. Cobb worked for a Louisville newspaper at the time of Goebel's assassination, but could not keep humor out of his writing even when it concerned serious subjects like murder. He knew how to create mental images such as describing a "slant-wise cruise over the Atlantic". In his biography, he created mental images and knew the perfect word to use with wit and humor. Although he described himself as "mathematically helpless," he knew how to describe a real estate salesman bitten by a dog as the dog was flying through the air. He described the dog as a "parabola." Cobb was a war correspondent in 1914, and described an argument he had with a policeman in Belgium. He stated that Europe has a dense population but the densest of them all were on the Belgium Police Department. These are all examples of Cobb's wit, humor, and writing. In fact, he is so witty; he is quoted many times in Bartlett's Familiar Quotations. Although he knew most words in the dictionary, he would often make-up words if he could not find a word good enough to meet the occasion. For example, he said he could not use a tape recorder when his "wordage" outran his "thinkage!" As a war correspondent, he was forced to describe what he saw and heard. He could describe the sound of a coyote perfectly and how he rode a homicidal mule into a canyon. He said it was so hot in Arizona that he saw a coyote chasing a rabbit and they were both walking. Another example of his humor is that he described someone as such a liar that he had to get a neighbor to call his hogs for him at feeding time. He described a prospective lawyer who was reading the law and only knew a statute book. He was told by a judge that the legislature would soon meet and might erase everything he knew. Cobb was such a marvelous writer that he wrote 70-80 million words excluding his newspaper articles. He gave up being a newspaperman to write short stories for the Saturday Evening Post.

His books and articles about France are incredible. He later wrote subtitles for movies and actually appeared in movies himself. He also joined the "Democrats for Wilkie" when he had a falling out with Roosevelt. In responding to questions from the floor he stated as follows: (1) Cobb died at the age of 67 in 1944 and in his opinion was an even better writer than Faulkner and Hemingway. (2) He commented on the Judge Priest books on a point raised by Richard Taylor. (3) Judge Palmore recalled Cobb speaking at the Democratic Convention in 1932 and Ron remembered that this was in Chicago. (4) In Ron's opinion, Goebel tore apart the Kentucky Democratic Party and, had he lived, would have done the same on the national level. He told the story which was a Cobb invention that although he would vote for a Democrat even if he was a yellow dog, he would go no lower than that. Thank you Ron Bryant for the first of what promises to be a month of excellent programs.

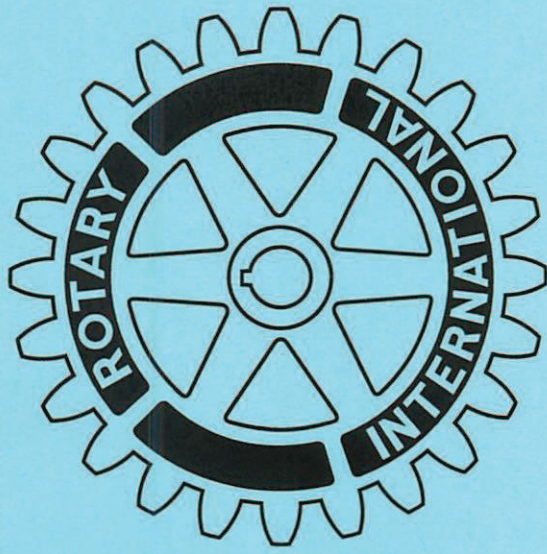

This Week's Speaker...

Jesse and Frank James rides again as historian Jim Prichard told the audience a stirring tale of

their adventures and misadventures in Kentucky during the late 1800s! Whether you brand them as errant knights like Robin Hood or desperate outlaws depends on which side of their guns you were facing. The legend and folklore surrounding the "James Gang" takes on a distinctive local flavor when you learn that both their parents were born in Kentucky and were married in Scott County before moving the family to Missouri. Because of their family connections and friends who had previously settled in Kentucky, they were very successful in eluding law enforcement efforts to track them down while in the state.

The brothers were ardent Confederates during the Civil War and turned to a career in crime after their surrender in 1865. Tagged by some as the "last rebel of the Civil War" and others as "the last rebel who would not surrender" Jesse James developed a successful career of robbing banks, trains, and stagecoaches. Posing as "cattle buyers" in Russellville, Ky. in 1868, Jesse, Frank, and others staged a daring bank robbery in a style that became a trademark for their method of operation. They would dress well, stay with friendly locals, rob a bank, and successfully make their escape. If one was caught, they did not tell on the others. Although raised in a preacher's family, the gang was ruthless during a robbery, killing those who got in their way or did not cooperate.

The end to their 17-year career in lawlessness was hastened by a badly botched robbery in Northfield, MO. in 1876 during which many of the gang was killed, wounded, or captured. Jesse and Frank escaped, both making a pact to "go straight." By 1880 they were back to their old tricks and held up a stagecoach in western Kentucky, once again making a clean getaway. In 1882, Jesse was killed by the Ford brothers for the reward, and Frank negotiated surrender for himself. Never convicted of his past crimes, Frank led a peaceful life and died of natural causes in 1915.

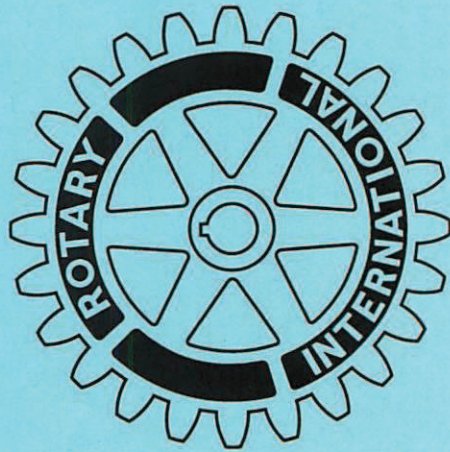

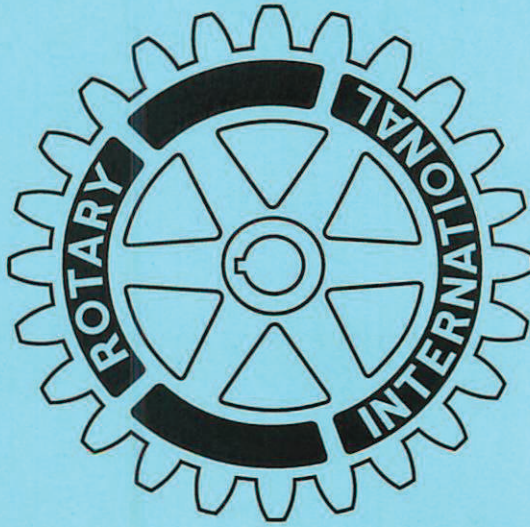

3,000 Florida children fight polio

For a growing number of Rotary clubs, the image of children with fingers stained in gentian violet is now indelibly associated with polio fundraisers.

The Purple Pinkie Project of the Rotary Club of Lake City, Florida, USA, is a perfect example of what a group of Rotarians can achieve for polio with just a few bottles of purple dye. The effort involves recruiting students to participate, with their parents' permission, in fundraising and polio education events.

For every 60 cents a child donates, he or she gets a finger painted with the same type of dye used at National Immunization Days (NIDs) around the world to identify those children who have been immunized. Gentian violet is typically used, though the iridescent dye sometimes appears to be green.

In May, about 3,000 students raised more than \$3,000. Baya Pharmacy, a local business sponsor, contributed an additional \$1,000 toward the initiative.

"Painted purple pinkies has certainly struck a chord with school children," says club member John R. Wheeler, who first got the idea of using gentian violet for a fundraiser from an article in The Rotarian magazine. "We have an aging club. This project has re-energized our members significantly. Particularly, members have a wonderful time interacting with the school children."

Purple Pinkie fundraisers are a rewarding experience, Wheeler explains, that involve many participants. Prior to last month's drive, a video production class at Ft. White High School created a series of one-minute videos in DVD format that featured images from past purple pinkie events and NIDs across the world, as well as footage from Rotary public relations videos. The DVDs were played every morning for four weeks at the 13 participating schools.

"When our 47 Rotarians and 20 Interactors eventually descended upon the schools armed with bottles of gentian violet, Q-tips, latex gloves, and collection buckets, the students all were ready to donate to the polio eradication fund," says Wheeler. "They knew what polio is and what Rotary is doing to eradicate the disease. We raised money and simultaneously educated the next generation about Rotary and polio. Plus we had tremendous fun."

Several Rotary clubs in Florida plan to organize similar fundraisers in the fall. The purple pinkie idea has also spread beyond the borders of the United States - not entirely surprising, considering that the original inspiration came from an NID photograph of Ethiopian children with dyed fingers. For example, in April, the Rotary Club of Brighton, Ontario, Canada, sent the local community on a finger-painting spree for polio.

"Boy, we have started a grass fire here. The whole town is going purple," said Brighton club member Dave McKibbin in April. "Our project raised C\$1547 from student donations in three elementary and one high school. Hard work by a high school class raised an additional \$600 to bring the total to \$2147. Support from two banks and a grocery store raised an additional \$650."

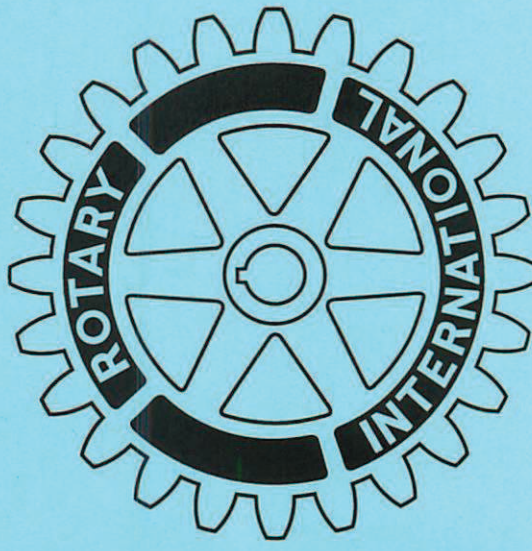

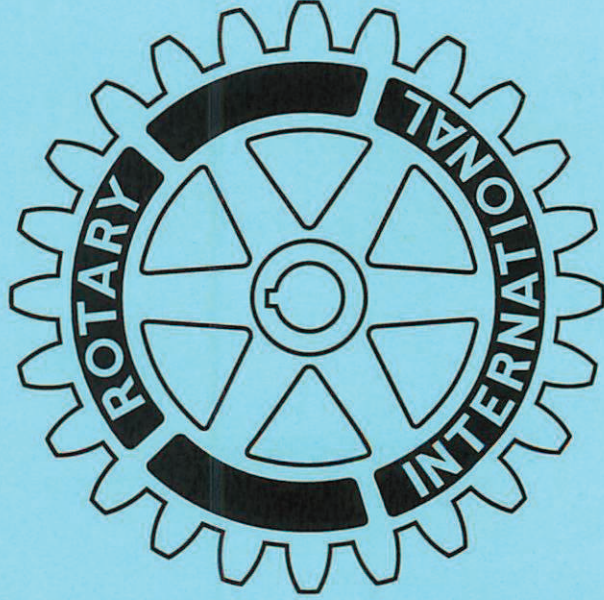
Kathy's belief is similar to former President John F. Kennedy's statement in his inaugural address:
