**Kathy Carter** has been a Frankfort resident since 1965. She was born in Hazard, Kentucky, and lived her childhood in Breathitt County. Her father was a Greyhound bus driver, and was transferred to Louisville after she completed her sophomore year at Breathitt County High. She graduated from DuPont Manual High, attended one year at Eastern Kentucky State College, now known as Eastern Kentucky University.



Following one year of business school, Kathy accepted a position as principle clerk stenographer with the Department of Education in Frankfort. During her 27+ years with the state government, Kathy held several supervisory roles which included branch manager, and acted in the position of assistant to the Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction. She also worked in the Department of Highways, Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources, Office of Attorney General, and retired from the Department of Education.

Kathy was married to Frankfort native, Bernard Taylor (Bernie) Carter for 19 years, and has one son, Mark. Since Bernie's untimely death in 1990, she has retried from state government, volunteered for 8+ years with the US Forest Service in Morehead working in the visitor's center and with the interpretive services program. She also volunteered with the opening of the Salato Center at the Game Farm, and volunteered for the Nature Preserves Commission.

She is the chair of the Code Enforcement Board for the City of Frankfort, board member of the Holmes Street Neighbors Association, a member of the Kiwanis Club, Kentucky Real Estate Investment Association, Order of Eastern Star- Hiram Chapter 93, Chamber of Commerce, Kentucky State Police Professional Association, and has been a member of the Civil Air Patrol.

Former State Representative Gippy Graham enlisted her assistance with his campaign for Secretary of State in 2003. Kathy became his campaign manager, traveled throughout the state, and represented him at several statewide candidate forums.

During the past four years, Kathy has been involved with the revitalization of Chinn Avenue in the Holmes Street area. She has purchased six of the ten houses on this street, gutted them, and restored them to very livable and desirable homes. Former and current tenants include a state representative, a director of a state agency, a captain with Kentucky State Police, a Frankfort City Police officer, an assistant to the Speaker of the House, and a manager of a local business, plus other responsible persons/families.

With her revitalization project recently completed, Kathy is, with the encouragement of her friends, now a candidate for City Commissioner.

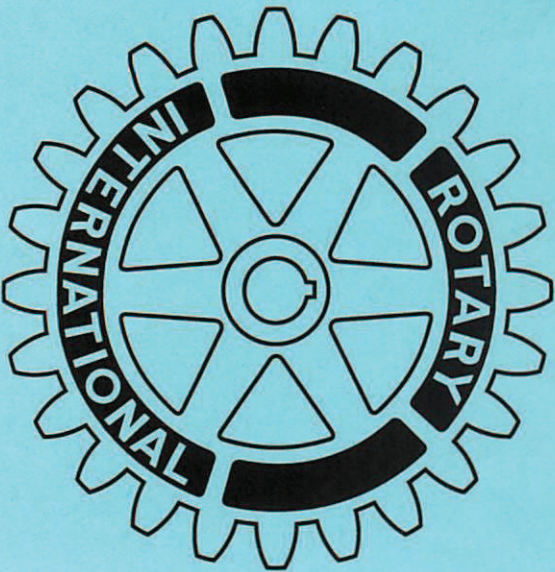

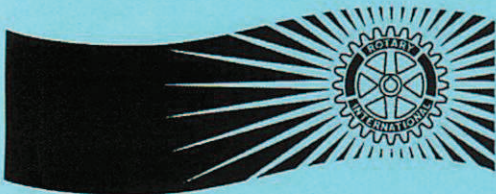

**This Week's Speaker...**

Kathy Carter described one of her successful efforts in community activism: a project to rehabilitate some ten homes located on Chinn Avenue in the Holmes Street neighborhood. Her presentation, presented from the perspective of what one determined citizen can do, encourages all that success can be yours but it means getting involved to get things done! She moved to the Holmes Street area in 1972, but it was in 2000 that she started thinking about what she could do personally to upgrade the neighborhood environment.

To date, she has purchased seven "shotgun" style homes at their appraised value, with the goal of developing affordable housing while maintaining a desirable appearance. The houses were orig-

inally constructed in the early 1920's for the workers at a local shoe factory. Her renovation of each included new plumbing, new carpet, new light fixtures, insulation, remodeled interiors, computer accessible wiring, and white picket fences. The exterior of each building is color coordinated to provide a pleasing view and each house has off-street parking. Her goal during renovations was "to do it right the first time." Her lease agreement stipulates that each tenant must comply with all local codes and regulations, and she includes security and grass mowing in the rent. Every action she takes is focused on the goal of developing and maintaining a safe and desirable environment in the neighborhood.

While encouraging all Rotarians to do their part in making Frankfort a very desirable place to live, Ms. Carter recited a phrase that exemplifies her own approach to life. "Only those who risk going too far will ever know how far to go."

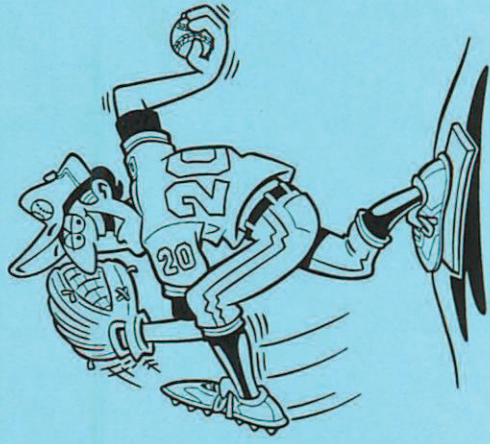

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Rosie Miklavcic, who is the director of the Franklin County Health Department. She stated that while many people think of vaccinations and restaurant inspections when they think of the health department, not many people think of disasters. However, the health department is prepared to give smallpox shots if needed and has already vaccinated health workers, and EMS personnel. Of course, smallpox is only one of many weapons of mass destruction with which we may be confronted in the event of a bioterrorism attack.

The goal of the health department is to have a mock disaster drill at one of their sites. Funding comes through the Center for Disease Control, which in turn is funded by Homeland Security. The health department currently has 78 employees, but more are needed for mass vaccinations. Rosie spoke of family and personal preparedness in case of an attack and she described a disaster

box which everyone should have. It should include food items like crackers and tuna, a battery-operated radio, garbage bags, a utility knife, paper plates and utensils, a can opener, scissors and one gallon of water per person for drinking and personal hygiene. Also included should be important documents like insurance policies, and credit card and bank card numbers. There should also be a contact person outside the city or state for family members to contact should they become separated. In responding to questions from the floor, she stated that there are classes available in the community to teach first aid, how to put out different types of fires, and how to respond to disasters. Judge Palmore raised the question of pets and she stated that dogs and cats and other animals should be taken into account in emergency preparedness in terms of food and water. She also stated that Franklin County has an emergency operations center, which is located in a conference room at the health department but could also be in a central location like the county courthouse. Thank you Rosie for a very informative program about situations none of us want to think about but about which we need to know.

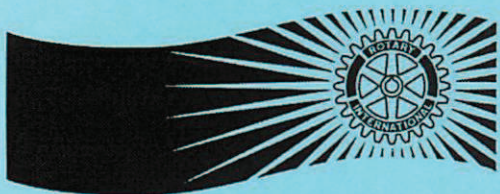

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was District Governor Bob Boudreau, who was introduced by Past District Governor Bill Miller. He stated that the theme for this centennial year is "Celebrate Rotary." In order to be an effective and balanced Club we need to support the Rotary Foundation. President Glenn has laid the groundwork for effective service. The term "celebrate" means respect, festivity, rejoicing or merry-making. The upcoming District Conference will be in Owensboro with the International Convention in Chicago. Also, an effective club strives to be all that it can be. The four Avenues of Service and good administration are built from values and high ideals. as this club has done. The key word here is "balance" concerning the local and international sides of Rotary. Support for the Foundation entails supporting the programs of the club such as PolioPlus, Group Study Exchanges, and Ambassadorial Scholarships. Support for the Foundation also means that the programs are worthy ones and the Rotary Foundation is an effective charity where the money is used effectively and not on administration. He referred to it as "our" foundation where local Rotarians raise the money and select the projects as well as evaluating them. In other words, Rotarians identify the needs and define the projects. We should support the Foundation because it is who we are. This makes high ideals come alive with both local and international emphases. Support for the Rotary Foundation means a focus on annual programs which is summarized by the slogan "Every Rotarian, Every Year." Each Rotarian is urged to study the programs and see if you can support them. Make the Foundation one of your personal charities. President Bob is devising stickers that we can put on our badges that says you have made your contribution to the Foundation for the year. As we go into the second century of Rotary, we will all be a part of that answer. What we do in Rotary today, determines what we will be tomorrow. Thank you Governor Bob for a very inspirational program and it is hoped we learned much from this talk and can profit from it.

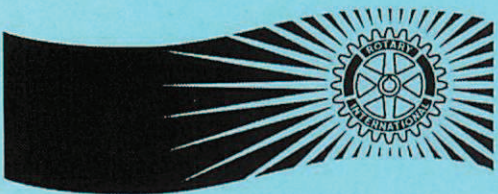
