**Send holiday cheer through newly issued Centennial cards**

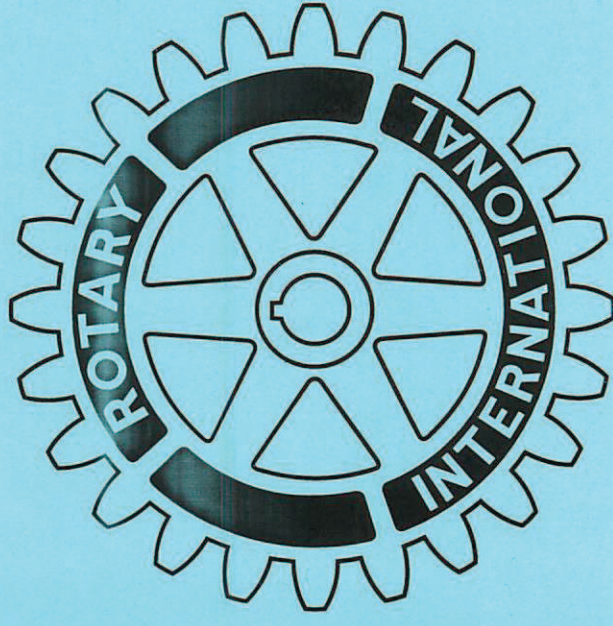

**This Week's Speaker...**

The program for the day was presented by YMCA Director and fellow Rotarian Pete Walsh who told us that he first went to the YMCA when he was eleven and attended a summer camp where he learned swimming and horseback riding. His first membership was financed by a local butcher who was a patron of the YMCA. The mission of the YMCA is to put Christian principles into practice to produce a productive body and healthy lifestyle. He took a look at the past, present, and future of the YMCA. First the past: (1) For years, Carl Fudge gave swimming lessons to countless children and actually used a pole to keep them away from the side! (2) There were dances at the YMCA back at the height of Rock n' Roll. (3) There were basketball clinics conducted by Adolph Rupp and Joe B. Hall (4) There were sack lunches and summer fun trips with interaction with children of all backgrounds regardless of race and gender. (5) There was roller skating at the old Bridge Street building. The YMCA has always emphasized the core val-

ues of honesty, respect, caring, and responsibility. Looking at the present: (1) There are now 400 children in after-school and summer day camp. (2) An early childhood facility center is being built off Hanley Lane. (3) The YMCA emphasizes today healthy lifestyles and fellowship with racquetball programs to combat obesity, high blood pressure and cancer through exercise. (4) Volunteerism and positive role models are emphasized in sports leagues and he named numerous Rotarians who have been active in the YMCA over the years. (5) The YMCA is teaching children to swim at the rate of 35 per month, and there are also adult swimming lessons. (6) The YMCA is working with 50 organizations in the community to provide healthy programs. (7) The YMCA is currently providing camping experiences which include riding horses, fishing, and hiking. Regarding the future: (1) The focus will be on those with special needs. (2) There is a new regional family YMCA to be built which will upgrade facilities for generations to come. (3) For the future the goal is to teach every child how to swim. (4) The goal is to join with other community groups to maximize services. Everyone is welcome at the YMCA, which tries to identify the needs of the particular neighborhoods and prepare young people for the future to accomplish the mission of the YMCA. It is the largest child care provider in the nation, and the goal is to build the spirit, mind, and body for total wellness. The services are open to all regardless of ability to pay and there will be facilities for those with special needs. \$700 million is raised annually to support activities of the YMCA. It is interesting to note that basketball and volleyball were invented at the YMCA. It is a safe place with caring adults where stress can be relieved and a community is built for adults as well as children. There is a new building project underway although the location has not yet been settled upon. The Frankfort YMCA serves 12,500 people a year. Thank you Pete for an update on the past, present, and future activities of Frankfort's YMCA.

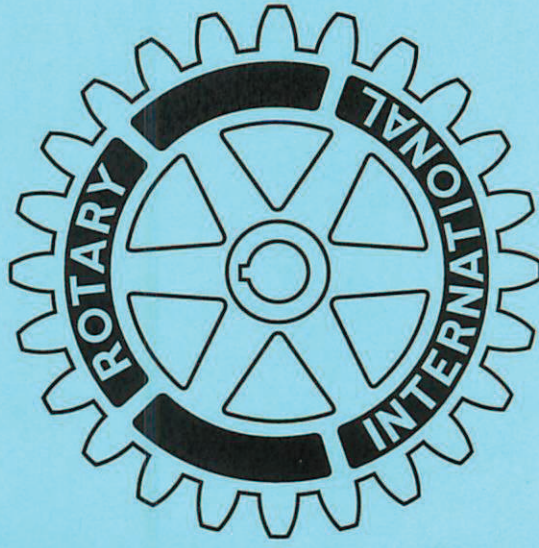

**Berkeley Scott, Trust for Life**

Mr. Scott will be discussing Organ Donor Awareness.

The Trust For Life was created by the Kentucky Circuit Court Clerks Association in 1992 after they successfully sponsored legislation through the Kentucky General Assembly that afforded every person obtaining a Kentucky driver's license an opportunity to donate \$1.00 to promote organ and tissue donation.

Since 1993, the first full year of operation for the Trust, more than \$4 million has been raised by the clerks in Kentucky's 120 counties. In 2003, more than 46% of all Kentuckians obtaining a license contributed. Since the beginning of the program, the number of organs donated in the state each year has risen 62%.

The Trust For Life was the first such program in the U.S., and since inception, more than 30 other states have requested information about the program. Funds raised at the driver's license counters are used to increase public awareness and to encourage organ & tissue donation.

In 1999 the Trust established the Judge Satterwhite Memorial Fund to raise money to

directly aid Kentucky transplant recipients and their families. Money for this fund comes from events like the annual Satterwhite Golf Outing and fundraisers conducted by the clerks as well as individual donations and bequests.

These figures were received from the national Coalition on Donation on May 20, 2004:

More than 85,000 men, women and children currently await life-saving transplants. More than 730 here in Kentucky! Every 12 minutes another name is added to the national transplant waiting list. An average of 17 people die each day from the lack of available organs for transplant. Every day about 70 people in America receive an organ transplant. In 2003, over 25,000 lives were saved through successful transplantation. It is thought that that more than twice that many could have been saved if more people said 'yes' to donation. 49,792 cornea transplants and nearly 950,000 tissue transplants were performed in 2003.

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Berkeley Scott, Executive Director of the Kentucky Circuit Court Clerk's Trust for Life, which promotes organ and tissue donations. More needed than money are organs, and this is the 50th anniversary of the first organ transplant, which was a kidney. The trust allows for a \$1 donation when you renew your driver's license. \$4 million dollars has been

raised one dollar at a time, which is used to buy advertising, support educational programs and promote organ and tissue donations. Nationwide, 70,000 people are on a waiting list for an organ and about sixteen people die each day waiting for one. There are simply not enough donated organs because people must die in a certain way like in an ICU or emergency room. There is a limited group of people from whom to obtain organs and only one-half of families will agree to donate organs although 90% of Americans are in favor of organ donation. The difference here is because potential donors have not talked to their families about it. The decision must be made quickly and it is rare that family members go against the wishes of the donor. Everyone is encouraged to sign the back of his or her driver's license. There is no registry in Kentucky although 23 states do have registries, which record the names of prospective donors. There are several misconceptions to explain why people say "no". (1) Organ donations are only made from dead people. (2) The recovery of organs is only made after the person is "brain-dead". One's care in the emergency room does not vary if the person is an organ donor. That is handled by a different team of doctors. (3) The donation does not cost the donor, the family, or the insurance company anything. The procurement organization handles all the expenses. (4) No one can buy an organ, which is regulated by the federal government. No compensation is given to the donors. All major religious organizations are in favor of organ donations and it is in fact a very Christian thing to do. (5) You are never too old to be a donor and it does not matter that you may have been ill. Most person's organs are in very good shape and when you sign your license, you never know what can be recovered with further medical advances since you may not die for a long time. Tissue donations are also promoted here which includes, eyes, corneas and heart valves. Serious burn victims need skin to recover. Another example is there is a need for heart valves with bypass surgery and there is a need in knee reconstruction for athletes. A poten-

tial donor must include all family members in the discussion. Organ costs are controlled and in Kentucky all organ recoveries and tissue recoveries are performed by the same non-profit organizations. Thank you Berkeley for making us all aware of the need to sign our organ and tissue donation form on the back of our driver's licenses.

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was District Governor nominee Dave Weller, who spoke about the Rotary Foundation and its impact around the world. The great things that Rotary does through the Foundation contribute to the respect Rotary has around the world. The loss of life in Asia we have witnessed is roughly equivalent to the that of a war. Rotary has a disaster relief fund, as well as humanitarian grants. A success story is found in PolioPlus, where there were less than 1,000 cases of polio last year in about ten countries. This was achieved through the Foundation. The emphasis in the coming year will be in the areas of health, literacy, and water resources. Other examples of the Foundation in action are: (1) Ambassadorial Scholarships where the ambassadors tell Rotary clubs in the country to which they are sent about the values and culture found in their home district. (2) Grants for university teachers. (3) Peace scholarships. (4) Group Study Exchanges which consist of one Rotarian and four professionals. (5) Humanitarian programs.

There are two basic ways you can designate the funds you give. One is to the permanent fund, which is never spent, and only the interest is spent. The other is the annual programs fund which is invested for three years. 100% of these funds are spent for the purpose you intend, and the earnings are spent for administrative expenses. How are the funds spent? (1) The District Simplified Grant which goes for local Rotary projects such as an early warning system for Franklin, Kentucky. (2) Individual grants — but to qualify for this you must be a Foundation volunteer. (3) Matching grants where Rotary International will match 50% of what the Club gives and 100% for what the District gives. Most Rotarians give to the annual programs fund. The goal is 100% participation to the Foundation at some level. You may also give gifts to the Foundation in the form of stocks and bonds. Dave asks all Rotarians to give at least \$100 to the Foundation for this year. Thank you Dave for

a very timely and informative talk about the Rotary Foundation.

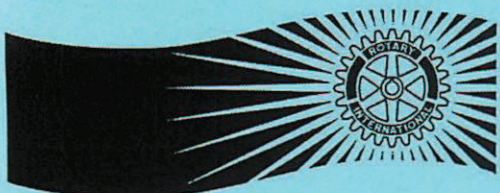
