



This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Louis Allegra, a Management Consultant. Formerly with Topy, Louis spoke about manufacturing and its importance to the American economy. About 10% of the workforce is in manufacturing but the average wage of a worker is \$54,000 a year. 84% of these workers have health insurance, and manufacturing pays 30% of the corporate taxes. \$1 of manufacturing creates \$1.43 in demand for goods and services. He commented on whether outsourcing or off-shoring was a good or bad thing and it all depends on one's perspective. Most workers found work elsewhere, since the unemployment rate stays about the same, and outsourcing enables workers to move on to obtain higher skills. The purchasing power of the American consumer is enhanced through outsourcing, since goods are cheaper. However, the real threat is from China today. It is about the same geographic size as the United States but has four times the population. The per-capita income is only \$1000 per year and about one-half of the workers are in agriculture today. 69% of the population has safe drinking water. On the other hand, China is now manufacturing automobiles, petrochemicals, microchips and computers. 350,000 new engineers are added each year compared to only 85,000 in the U.S. Innovation is the top objective in China and productivity has averaged 17% in the last five years. The U.S. has a \$150 billion trade deficit with China. According to Napoleon 200 years ago, China is a sleeping giant. It appears also to be more sensitive to world opinion in the following ways: (1) China is helping to diffuse the nuclear crisis. (2) China appears to be moving away from a policy of selective abortions. (3) There is more religious freedom today. With the collapse of the Soviet Union, China has recognized the importance of improving its economy, and 60% of the goods it manufactures are in joint ventures plants. What is the United States to do? (1) We need to be competitive in the national/global economy and need awareness of the importance of manufacturing to our economy. (2) We need to educate our children to work in the global economy. We suffer from a lack of skilled employees. (3) We need to engage the brains, instead of the backs, of workers and pursue productivity and innovative methods for improving output. Employees need to be engaged more in decision-making. Concerning the budgetary process in Kentucky, we need to think more strategically. Although there have been many negative things about China's past that could still come back to haunt them, China is still an economic threat to the U.S. and the question is whether China will dominate in this century like the U.S. did in the last.



This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Jake Colston, director of sports at the YMCA. His motto is "Everybody Plays, Everybody Wins." He spoke about the pros and cons of competitive versus non-competitive sports. The YMCA depends heavily on volunteers and sponsors which involves referees and coaches with over 500 volunteers involved. This helps the organization off-set costs like uniforms. Parents often do not want their child to be in a competitive environment. In non-competitive sports, there is no emphasis on winning and no one is a "loser." This enhances the enjoyment of playing, and everyone gets to play regardless of ability. The cons of non-competitive sports are that no standings are kept and that there is no win/loss record. The pros of competitive play are that the top teams show, standings are kept, and there is a win/loss record. The cons are that not everybody will play and the last place team will show. There is a loss of selfesteem and the fun is taken out in competitive sports. Winning becomes everything. Soccer is the biggest program at the YMCA with 600-plus kids, 100 volunteers, and 50 teams. It is offered in the fall and spring. 1600 kids involved is the goal. Another sport is NFL Flag Football, where the

kids wear uniforms of the NFL. It is for 6-14 year olds and has 90 players with 15 volunteers. Another sport is Tee-ball for 3-6 year olds with 350 players, 39 teams and 80 volunteers. Basketball has 31 teams, 315 players and 60 volunteers. Cheerleading is another sport with 7 squads, 70 cheerleaders and 14 volunteers. Finally, there is Rookies Sports which has been newly renovated with over 100 participants. It is for 3-6 year olds and is a six week program. It teaches motor development skills and the skills of different sports. There were 115-120 involved this spring to learn what sport may be their particular sport. Future sports teams will be volleyball, youth golf, tennis and adult basketball. He asked Rotarians for suggestions and ideas about future sports at the YMCA. He is trying to grow the YMCA to make it better for everyone with a new Motto: "A place to be, a place to belong, a place to become."
