This Week's Speaker...

The speakers for the day were Bill Miller, Richard Taylor and several South Korean visitors to kick-off the World Understanding Month. Bill stated that the Frankfort Rotary Club actually started Rotary Day at the United Nations on a suggestion sent by this Club to Rotary International. This provides a forum for the discussion of issues and topics of common interest to Rotary and the United Nations. These issues include literacy, potable water and health. November 5 is Rotary Day at the United Nations, and he appealed to Rotarians to attend this event. Unfortunate facts facing the world today include that 80 million have died in wars in the 20th century and there have been 250 conflicts worldwide. 800 million adults are illiterate and 2/3 are women. 31 countries are 50% illiterate and by this time tomorrow, 8000 will have died from AIDS. 4000 children die daily from preventable diseases, and over a billion people exist without safe water. Over two billion exist without proper sanitation. 5 million children are walking today but would not have been had it not been for Polio Eradication Campaign by Rotary International. Bill showed videotape with the theme of "connecting local to global". There is a 68-year collaboration between Rotary and the United Nations, and a Rotarian was elected Secretary-General four years after the founding of the UN in 1949. Rotary has the highest consultive status with the UN of any non-government organization. Rotary has worked with the World Health Organization, UNICEF and the Centers for Disease Control to eliminate polio, and there has

been an International Immunization Campaign. Rotary has also worked with the UN on the community level. For example, in the World Bank, needs have been addressed at the local level such as technology training centers with local level partnerships to train young people to provide competitive skills. The tape also showed shelter box tents, which have been donated by the Frankfort Club. Kentucky State University has an exchange with South Korea and Richard Taylor spoke about how he had taught English to English teachers at Kangwon National University in Chucheon, South Korea. Dr. Kwang Suh, Professor of Asian Affairs at KSU, spoke as did two South Korean students at KSU. Richard noted that 85% of South Koreans under 35 have a degree from an institution of higher education. Thank you Bill and Richard for a great kick-off to February, which is World Understanding month.



Frankfort Rotarian Greg Fuchs — Rotary Group Study Exchange (GSE) to Argentina

February is designated by Rotary International as World Understanding Month. The main purpose of this theme is for Rotary Clubs to focus on international activities that help to create a better world by promoting international peace, cooperation and understanding.

Frankfort Rotarian Greg Fuchs will be speaking about his Rotary Group Study Exchange (GSE) experience in Mendoza and San Juan, Argentina in April-May, 2004.

Greg has been a member of the Frankfort club since 1991. He has hosted 15 GSE guests for the Frankfort club and sponsored 13 GSE team members who have represented the Frankfort Rotary Club since 1993. Greg has been a member of the District GSE committee since 1996 and its chair since 1999.

This trip to Argentina was Greg's first opportunity to participate on a team. San Juan and Mendoza provinces in Argentina run along the Andes Mountains much closer to Santiago, Chile than Buenos Aires. Both are predominately desert and but for the use of irrigation would be almost

barren. However, with irrigation, the provinces are the center of Argentina's wine industry.

Greg is an Assistant Attorney General in the Office of the Attorney General since 1988.


Colgate Bright Smiles







On February 23rd, 1905 four business gentlemen met in Room 711 of the Unity Building in Chicago, IL, USA. The four men were Paul Harris, Silvester Schiele, Gustavus Loehr and Hiram Shorey.

On Feb. 23, 2005, a hundred years later to the day, the Rotary Club of Frankfort will celebrate this event with a reenactment of that first meeting. Five Frankfort Rotarians: Fred Snyder (an eerie look-alike for Paul Harris), Don Dykman, Richard Boyer, Dennis Van Horn and narrator Kelli Sorg will attempt to conjure up the spirit of that first meeting and spotlight those elements of the Rotary experience that 1.2 million worldwide members embrace. The Rotary meeting that day will be dedicated to fellow Rotarian Hub Perdew, who is about six months older than Rotary.

How some things have changed and some things have stayed the same! The average hourly wage was 22 cents in 1905, the average life expectancy was 47 years.

Come join this fun celebration of 100 years of service to the world.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was fellow Rotarian Greg Fuchs, who last year led a Group Study Exchange (GSE) team to Argentina for a month. He traveled to Mendoza and San Juan Argentina, which run along the Andes Mountains and are much closer to Santiago, Chile than to Buenos Aires. Both are predominately desert and, but for the use of irrigation, would be almost barren. Through irrigation, however, the provinces are the center of the wine industry. Mendoza is known as a city of plazas, but even has a Wal-Mart. A Brazilian team from Sao Pablo traveled with Greg's team. He showed the picture of a beautiful park, which contained much Argentine history. It also had a statue of San Martin who led the Army of the Argentines that liberated the country from Spain and broke colonial rule. Argentina's history parallels much United States history. There were massive water projects in the late forties like TVA in the United States. Although much of the land is desert, with irriga-

tion there is an abundance of fruits, dates, olives and grapes from the vineyards. There are also plum orchards. There is a "water Queen" and they studied about grapes from the vineyard to the bottle. The Argentines have a passion for football; not just Argentine's team but those from all countries. There was a downside to their visit. Security is a big problem, with bars and electric fences everywhere. Unemployment is rampant, and one finds street performers and even windshield cleaners desperate for money. However, the natural beauty of Argentina is really amazing in spite of such poverty. Greg also showed photographs of Rotary activities including the District Conference, replete with dance performances. The Rotary meetings went on for hours late into the night. Greg invited Rotarians who know young people who would like to participate in a future Group Study Exchange to contact him.



This Week's Program...

Rotarians and guests were greeted at the door by the four founders of the first Rotary Club. The program for the day featured the first meeting of the Rotary Club in Chicago on February 23, 1905 at an Italian meeting. The first attendees were Paul Harris (portrayed by Fred Snyder), Sylvester Schiele (portrayed by Richard Boyers), Gustavus Moore (portrayed by Don Dykman), and Hiram Shorey (portrayed by Dennis Van Horn). Rotary was born out of a city of contrasts, and was formed to promote social interaction among businessmen. Paul Harris was an attorney, Sylvester Schiele was president of Schiele Coal Company, the father of Gustavus Moore was born in Germany and Sylvester was a jeweler among many other professions, and Hiram Shorey was a tailor from Maine. Today, Rotary International has over 1.2 million members in 166 countries. Sylvester Schiele rode with the Rough Riders and knew Theodore Roosevelt. The men formed the club while discussing such a variety of subjects as the newly-invented automobile, the flight of the Wright Brother, and the Chicago Cubs with its new star, Ty Cobb, otherwise known as the "Georgia Peach." At the time Rotary came into being, the life expectancy was 47 years, there were 45 states in the United States, and wages were 22 cents an hour. There was no Mothers' Day and Fathers' Day. The object was to welcome all people from different professions into Rotary regardless of politics or religion. Meetings would be rotated between the respective businesses. Thank you Dennis Van Horn for orchestrating this entertaining and informative event which included writing the script and securing the costumes. Thanks also to narrator Kelli Sorg. The program was dedicated to Hub Perdew.


