# Chicago unveils sign honoring first Rotary club

On 23 February, the day Rotary marked its centennial, the City of Chicago, Illinois, USA, honored the Rotary Club of Chicago by unveiling a street sign that bears the honorary name of "Rotary Club of Chicago Way."

Located on the southeast corner of North Dearborn Street and West Randolph Street in downtown Chicago, the sign is on the block that used to house the Unity Building, where four Chicago businessmen created the first Rotary club 100 years earlier. Today, a plaque in the sidewalk dedicated in June 2004 marks that spot.

Dozens of Rotarians were in attendance, including the centennial year president of the Rotary Club of Chicago, Robert Knuepfer, who unveiled the sign with Chicago Alderman Burton Natarus.

Although the Unity Building was demolished in 1989, the sidewalk space at 127 North Dearborn Street in Chicago's Loop commemorates the site where Paul P. Harris, Silvester Schiele, Gustavus H. "Gus" Loehr, and Hiram E. Shorey held what would become the first meeting of the Rotary Club of Chicago on the evening of 23 February 1905.

The contents of Room 711, Loehr's office in the Unity Building where the meeting took place, were carefully relocated to RI headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, before demolition of the building began in 1989.

### This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Dick Stoops, who works for the Eagle Wings at Bluegrass Field. He spoke about his trip to Guyana in South America October 9-November 3, 2004 in the rainforest. He went with the Remote Area Medical Volunteer Corps and gave a little of the background of the Corps. It began with Stan Block who, at the age of 17 in 1953, went with his father to British Guyana and worked on a 3000-acre ranch with 30,000 head of cattle. He got to know the Indians who worked on the ranch, known as the Wai Wai Amerindians. By the time he left in 1966, he had cut a trail 35 miles long. Block later worked for the Wild Kingdom television show and traveled the world. The RAM headquarters is located in Knoxville, and was founded in 1985 to help people without adequate medical care. Dick saw an ad by RAM for parachutists, where the volunteers would go into remote areas and help carve out a trail. The government would not allow parachuting, so most volunteers dropped out. It boiled down to five RAM volunteers who would work on an airstrip at Gunns south of the capital at Georgetown and five RAM volunteers would work on the Para Bara Trail in teams. A

Cessna aircraft was requisitioned, and the team then went to the cattle ranch at Letham. The Indians all ride barefoot and in Guyana, all cowboys are Indians. Dick showed the Club slides of the expedition and at a store at the ranch, there were Puma skins, a spider monkey and a jaguar. They then traveled to Para Bara with 12 Indians, two Guyana Defense Force volunteers and three RAM volunteers. The airstrip was only 1500 feet long and they stayed in a community house there.



#### Afghan boy receives Gift of Life

A 14-month-old Afghan boy, Qudrat Ullah, successfully underwent open-heart surgery at Riley Hospital for Children in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA, on 8 March. The Rotary Club of Greenfield facilitated Qudrat's trip to the United States through its Gift of Life program and helped cover costs for the boy's \$50,000 surgery.

Gift of Life International was launched in 1974 by the Rotary Club of Manhasset, New York to provide surgeries to children with life-threatening heart conditions. It has since helped some 4,000 children from more than 60 countries worldwide. The Greenfield club, which established its Gift of Life program seven years ago, has provided lifesaving surgeries for more than 60 children.

Lt. Col. Terry Snow, a Greenfield Rotarian and National Guard member, discovered Qudrat unexpectedly when he was deployed to Afghanistan with the 76th Infantry Brigade in 2004.

"At that time, I wondered what on earth was in store for me," says Snow. "I had been in the National Guard for 29 years and was 56 years old. Well, on October 18, I found out why I was in Afghanistan."

Snow learned of Qudrat's condition from

doctors at a troop medical clinic where Snow was being treated for a stomach ailment. Qudrat's father, Hakim Gul, had traveled 15 miles on foot to bring his son to the clinic where doctors diagnosed the boy with a serious heart condition untreatable in Afghanistan. Snow immediately contacted his club back home, and within three days Gift of Life approved Qudrat's case. The boy, his father, and a translator made the journey to the United States on 23 February.

In Indiana, doctors identified Qudrat's condition. The main artery and vein of Qudrat's heart had switched functions, causing oxygenated blood to travel back to his lungs instead of into his body. As a result, the boy's growth was stunted, and his color was a sickly blue.

Qudrat underwent a difficult, three-part operation to save his life. The surgery went extremely well, and Qudrat's color immediately changed to a healthy pink as he began to receive the oxygen he needed.

"At that time, I wondered what on earth was store for me," says Snow. "I had been in the Qudrat's story is attracting national attention and raising awareness about Rotary and the Gift of Life program.

For now, the club is celebrating Qudrat's success and hoping for a fast recovery. His doctors say the surgery has given him a chance at a normal life.





### This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Master Chief Warrant Officer Dean Edward Stoops, who has most recently assumed the duties of the Kentucky Army National guard Aviation Standardization Officer, After 9/11 the Kentucky National Guard has experienced the largest mobilization since World War II. Although the enemy is different, it is no less evil. The federal mission of the Guard is to provide trained units and qualified persons available for mission active duty in times of war or national emergency and at such other times as the national security may require. The state mission of the Guard is to provide trained and disciplined forces for domestic emergencies as required by state laws. The Guard is no longer regarded as strategic reserves but is now a critical force in the war on terror. 46% have been mobilized and some 400,000 of the reserves and guards have been mobilized in the strategic forces since 9/11. At the end of 2004, the Kentucky National Guard has exceeded its goal in new recruits. 5000 Kentucky soldiers in the Guard are now fighting the global war on terror. These are the same soldiers you see responding to fires and floods and other disasters. These soldiers have been mobilized for duty in Afghanistan, Iraq, Germany, Korea, Kosovo, Uzbekistan, and Bosnia-Herzegevina. He mentioned several Kentuckians who died serving in Iraq. First, there is First Lieutenant Robert L. Henderson II who led his troops to safety in spite of being gravely wounded. Secondly, there was Staff Sergeant Barry Holt who reenlisted for another tour of duty have been severely injured. Thirdly, there is Specialist Jonathan A. Hughes. He showed pictures of all these brave men who have served their country so admirably. To date, some 1,522 soldiers have died serving their country in Iraq, and some of the fruits of their sacrifice can be seen in emerging democracies in Lebanon and the Ukraine and with some 18 million voters who turned out in Iraq despite terrorists' threats. He implored us to ask service men and women how the war is succeeding, as opposed to what we read in the newspapers. This is indeed the next greatest generation after the greatest generation which served in World War II. The Guard and Reserves are your co-workers, neighbors and friends.





# This Week's Speaker...

Dr. Patrick Peters, co-owner of the Family Dental Center in Frankfort, provided an informative assessment of dental hygiene with a slide presentation titled "Children: The Common Oral Diseases that Face Them." Dental decay is a significant problem with a baby's teeth negatively impacted by sweet liquid clinging to them and adolescents who eat too many sweets thereby making the prevention of tooth decay a challenge. Baby teeth are important to children because they maintain space for permanent teeth to mature, so care should be taken to preserve them as long as possible. Lack of dental care is called a "silent epidemic" in young adults because many lack the necessary insurance or funds to receive adequate care. Insufficient federal and state assistance to subsidize dental care for everyone and complex and burdensome paperwork create numerous problems for dentists. To insure proper dental care, parents should make sure that children are exposed to fluorinated water, brush their teeth and floss twice a day, always brush again after late night snacks, and see that tooth decay is treated promptly, even in baby teeth. Dental injuries are the most common type of facial injury, with sports being the main venue in 60% of the cases. One-half of these injuries could be prevented with adequate protective measures such as using a mouth guard. Some problems with dental injuries may not show up for months. If a permanent tooth is knocked out, put it into a glass of milk and see the dentist ASAP because they may be able to save it.


