**Marcie Puckett, Chair, Franklin County
American Cancer Society Relay for Life**

Marcie Puckett currently serves as Education Consultant for the Education Professional Standards Board. She is the former CEO/ Executive Director with the Kentucky Industrial Development Council (KIDC) in Frankfort, Kentucky. Marcie, a graduate from the University of Kentucky, has a long history with more than 15 years working with government, business and industry leaders across the state of Kentucky. Prior to coming to back to Frankfort she served as a Community & Economic Development Training Consultant with the Kentucky Community & Technical College System in Northern Kentucky. While in Northern KY she was diagnosed with a rare form of cancer and underwent two stem cell transplants. During and after her recovery she became active with the American Cancer Society chairing and starting an ACS sponsored children's day camp. She has served extensively on the boards of the American Cancer Society and United Way. She was twice named Volunteer of the Year in both the Northern KY and the Mid-south Region here in Frankfort.

Marcie is now serving her second year as Chair of the Franklin County ACS Relay for Life.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Dr. James Ramsey, President of the University of Louisville. He started his talk by referring to the "uglies" in Kentucky which include an unhealthy lifestyle as exemplified by smoking, high cancer rates, and the fact that Kentuckians have 83% of the national per capita income. The General Assembly has given the University of Louisville a mandate and a public agenda to be the preeminent metropolitan research institution in the state. This is to be achieved in five ways: (1) Educational quality and excellence. We need to attract great students to U of L and this has been seen in the rise of ACT scores. U of L is no longer an open institution. Good community colleges are carrying much of the load. We need to attract the best students to the state and give them the opportunity to be successful. We need to improve

graduation and retention rates. This will enable us to make an investment in human capital and have a better-educated work force. The Wall Street Journal has listed U of L in the top 30 institutions for preparing students for professional degrees. (2) Research. It is a statutory mandate that the University be a top research metropolitan institution which will translate into more economic development. This will mean creating new knowledge, which can be commercialized. An example is that a drug has been developed which only attacks cancer cells and not healthy cells. The Phase I clinical trials were successful and a company in London, England provided the money to complete Phase II of the clinical trials. The four major research areas are (a) Life sciences; (b) Logistics distribution; (c) Entrepreneurial concerns; (d) Early childhood. (3) Diversity. The University needs to reach out to the public schools and be racially diverse. This also means to be diverse in terms of opinion from the right and left. (4) Partnerships. U of L has more than 100 partnerships with UK. For example, in the respective engineering schools, there have been joint patent applications. There are also partnerships with Murray, Eastern, and Western. There is now a Louisville Medical School Development Corporation which will build a health care and life care center. Louisville has lost many manufacturing jobs and we need to replace those lost jobs with new jobs in the health and medical care fields. (5) Good stewards of the resources. U of L needs to be accountable to the taxpayers. U of L needs to achieve these preceding five goals to achieve its public agenda to increase economic opportunities within this state. Dr. Ramsey also mentioned other matters for which U of L has received publicity such as excellence in the athletic programs. Also in the news is a cancer campaign called "Finding Answers for Cancer". There are numerous outreach cancer programs throughout the state. The University has obtained a federal grant of some \$11 million for environmental cardiology. The last session of the General Assembly was a good

one with all budget cuts being restored. A new medical research building will be built for the medical sciences and the 1-cent cigarette tax will go for cancer research. Of course, the University will have to match this money in order to get the state funding. Other areas he discussed were a new arena. There is also a need to expand Papa John stadium. However, such projects will not be allowed to crowd out academic concerns and endeavors. The City of Pikeville sees a kinship with Louisville as Pikeville looks to Louisville as a model for a medical center to replace lost mining jobs with health care jobs. Thank you Dr. Ramsey for a very interesting update on exciting happenings at the University of Louisville.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Marcie Puckett, Chairperson for the upcoming American Cancer Society Relay for Life to be held at Lakeview Park on May 20. She herself is a cancer survivor, having been diagnosed with a rare form of cancer 11 years ago which has been in remission for eight years. She first found out about her cancer after a white-water rafting trip when she was feeling very bad. She went to Arkansas to a treatment facility. For her form of cancer, the typical survival rate is for about three years. Two Nobel Prize winners have done research into cancer treatment. She stated because of her own experiences, Relay for Life is very personal to her. The number to call about cancer treatments and concerns is the American Cancer Society number 1-800-ACS-2345. They will provide information about the cancer survivor's network and children's camp. She encouraged Rotarians to join one of the Relay for Life teams, now in its 20th year. Concerning stem cell research, she is very

much for it and said she would not be here today without the two transplants she has received. Relay for Life is the signature event of the American Cancer Society, and the event is hoping for a cure for cancer to be found. The overnight, twelve-hour event is symbolic of that which a cancer patient goes through. The theme for the event is "Cancer Never Sleeps." The Relay for Life starts with people going through various activities like walking, and constitutes a celebration journey. As the night gets longer, one experiences what a cancer patient goes through with the treatment. There is much soul-searching through the early morning hours. At daybreak, one experiences the dawn of life which is also symbolic of the hope that someday a cure for all forms of cancer will be found. In other words, it is a celebration of: (1) Hope; (2) Community; (3) Ways to take care of yourself; and (4) How to get involved politically to advance the cause of promoting a cure for cancer. Last year, Relay for Life raised \$108,000 at the Lakeview Park event, which far exceeded the goal. Thank you Marcie for a very informational and interesting update on Relay for Life, and also to Bobbye Brown a fellow cancer survivor and the person responsible for this excellent program. Best wishes for success in this year's Relay for Life campaign!

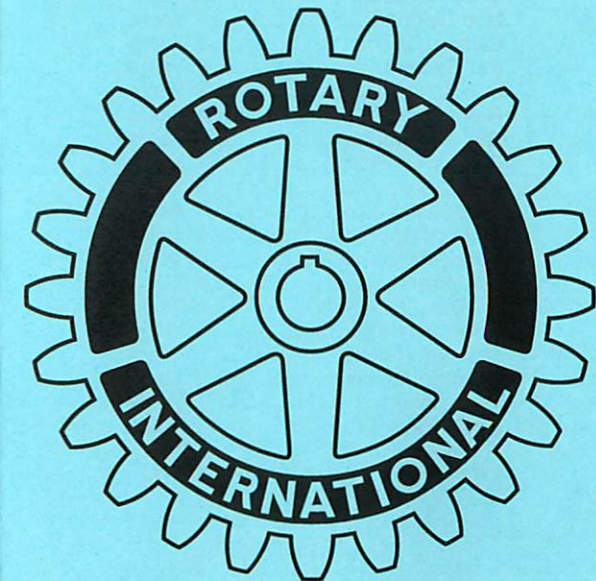

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Veronica A. Nunley, Manager of the Environmental Strategies Prevention Enhancement Site. She stated at the outset that her talk about smoke-free air was not about the tobacco farmers, for the reason that if everyone in Kentucky stopped smoking, the impact on Kentucky burley farmers would be less than 2%. Most burley is exported outside the state. She also emphasized, however, that there is no constitutional right to smoke and that this right is superseded by the right of non-smokers to breathe. The right to smoke can be restrained just like free speech, where you cannot yell "fire" in a crowded theater. 430,000 persons in this country die every year from the effects of smoking, the leading cause of preventable deaths, with secondhand smoke being the third cause of deaths. Alcohol is second. Nothing kills like

tobacco. It is ironic that we spend billions to remove asbestos from buildings and then allow smoking in those buildings which is an even more dangerous cancer-causing activity. Secondhand smoke is a public and worker health issue.

"Motorcycle Bob" Rides Into Town

Rotarian and polio survivor Bob Mutchler has embarked on his fifth marathon motorcycle/sidecar ride to raise awareness of the success of Rotary International's PolioPlus program. Motorcycle Bob is riding into each state capital and provincial capital before the Rotary International Convention in Chicago in June.

Motorcycle Bob will visit Central Kentucky Riding for Hope at the Kentucky Horse Park on Monday, May 23 at 5:30 PM to see how other kinds of "horses" work for Kentucky and for people with physical and other handicaps. Central Kentucky Riding for Hope is a non-profit agency whose mission is to enhance the lives of children and adults with disabilities using horses. More information about the program is a www.ckrh.org.

District 6710 Rotarians here in Frankfort are working to establish a meeting place with Bob and make other final arrangements for hooking up with him during the ride from Charleston, West Virginia and then travel with him during some of his ride to Nashville the next day. Frankfort Rotary President Clay Hulette and Capital Sunrise President Mike Scrivner have both expressed interest in riding their motorcycles with Bob on one or more of those days.

May 23, 2:30 p.m.: Stop One in Charleston, WV
May 23, 6:30 p.m.: Stop Two in Frankfort, KY (overnight in Frankfort)

May 24, 2:00 p.m.: Depart Frankfort, KY

Bob rides a BMW motorcycle outfitted with a special "leaner" sidecar. The motorcycle controls are specially modified to allow hand control of the rear brake, as Bob is limited in the use of his legs due to the effects of polio that he experienced as a child. Bob's "Centennial Ride" in

Jane Eller, Executive Director, Kentucky Environmental Education Council

Jane Wilson Eller is currently Executive Director of the Kentucky Environmental Education Council, a state agency whose mission is to improve, increase and coordinate environmental education in the Commonwealth. She has held this position since 1995. Prior to 1995, she served as director of a child abuse prevention program, and before that as associate director of a research center at the University of Kentucky. Ms. Eller holds a bachelor's degree and two master's degrees from the University of Kentucky.

Ms. Eller just completed her second term as a member of the National Environmental Education Advisory Council, a federal commission that advises the EPA and Congress on issues related to environmental education. She is currently a member of the board of directors of the North American Association for Environmental Education, and also served for eight years as a member of the State Education and Environment Roundtable, a consortium of 12 states that conducted research on the most effective strategies for teaching about the environment.

Ms. Eller is married to Dr. Ronald Eller, a Professor of History at the University of Kentucky. They have three children and two grandchildren and live in Jessamine County.
