This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Jane Eller, Executive Director of the Kentucky Environmental Council, a state agency whose mission is to improve, increase, and coordinate environmental education within the Commonwealth. She used demonstrative aids using glasses and an apple to show that the Earth is made up of 97% salt water, 2.9% glaciers and ice caps. 0.6% underground water which is too far to be recovered or too polluted to use. Not even a drop of what is left is water we can use for personal consumption. Using an apple, she showed that the peel from 1/32 of a slice represents the top soil we can use to grow food. We have very little water and land for which to grow our food. Her job is to help people better understand how precious land is, and to help us make decisions on protecting the environment. Her agency was created in 1995 to improve, increase, and coordinate environmental education. She has to assess knowledge of the public about environmental issues and report to the legislature her findings. One example is that only 17% understand that run-off is a major source of pollution. Only a small portion of pollution comes from factories and industry. There is more oil pollution from

changing the oil in our cars than from tanker oil spills. Fewer that one half of respondents can identify the major source of power generation (coal). 17% thought that oil, coal and gas were renewable resources. This ignorance says something about behavior. Although women are more concerned about the environment than men, more men are likely to answer questions about the environment correctly. 96% of respondents say that environmental education should be taught in our schools. The higher the educational level, the better is environmental knowledge, but this fact is not likely to translate into changing one's behavior. She has found that the less people know, the more they think they know. Environmentalists are being trained so they can be certified and impart better education about environmental issues to the public. She is starting Green Schools programs, which consists of using existing schools to take environmental inventories and new schools which are energy efficient where lights are automatically turned off when one leaves the room. The idea is to coordinate what is going on, and improve what people know about the environment. Kentucky is the only state with a certification program and one of the few states with a state agency such as hers.



Col. William Gerald Willis, AUS (ret)

Wm. Gerald (Bill) Willis, a Certified Radio Marketing Consultant (CRMC), is owner and general manager of WFLQ Radio (Q-100) in French Lick, IN, which he put on the air in April 1983. He is an active member of the National Association of Broadcasters, Radio Advertising Bureau, Indiana broadcasters Association and Broadcast Pioneers.

Prior to construction of WFLQ Radio he had been on active duty as a colonel with the US Army at headquarters, Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC) at Fort Monroe, VA. He retired with 30 years commissioned service, which included command of an infantry rifle company and a cavalry squadron, staff positions at two different four-star commands (TRADOC and Mary Material Command) and tours at the Pentagon with the Department of the Army and in the Office of the Secretary of Defense.

He is a graduate of the Army War College at Carlisle Barracks, PA, the Army's highest educational institution. His military awards include the Legion of Merit, OSD Identification Badge, Expert Infantryman and Parachute Badges, and the Fort Benning OCS Hall of Fame. He is a member of the Senior Army Reserve Commanders Association, Officers Christian Fellowship, a Life member of the Association of the US Army, the American Legion and is past president of the Indiana Department of the Reserve Officers Association (ROA), which in 2001 gave him the Nathan Hale Award, the highest departmental award.

Bill received a BSC degree from the University of Louisville and a Master of Arts in Business from Central Michigan University. He has been a radio ham for over 50 years, holding an Amateur Extra Class license with his initials N4BW and is a life member of the American Radio Relay league (ARRL).

He has served on the Small Market Advisory Committees of the National Association of Broadcasters and the Radio Advertising Bureau, a director of the West Baden Historical Society, founder of the Springs Valley Dollars for Scholars, chairman of Liberty Day Indiana (providing copies of the Constitution to students throughout Indiana, is an area director for Gideon's International of Indiana, and a trustee of the Indiana Lions Cancer Control Fund, he is a lions Club past District Governor, past president of the French Lick-West Baden Lions Club, past director of the Indiana Broadcasters Association, past director of the Indiana affiliate of the American Heart Association, past District Commissioners, BSA, and was named 1990 Outstanding Citizen by the Spring Valley Jaycees, he is a member of Woodville, Baptist Church and frequently speaks for the Gideons. 





Trey Grayson, Secretary of State, on the International Center Convention in Chicago



Secretary of State Trey Grayson was elected to office on November 4, 2003, becoming the first Northern Kentuckian to be elected to an existing statewide constitutional office since 1919. He is the currently the youngest Secretary of State in the country and is serving a two-year

term as Chairman of the Republican Association of Secretaries of State.

Secretary Grayson graduated with honors from Harvard College (A.B., Government, 1994) and from the University of Kentucky (J.D. /M.B.A., 1998) where he was one of the first two Bert Combs Scholars, the College of Law's top scholarship. Prior to his election, he was an attorney with Greenebaum Doll & McDonald and Keating, Muething & Klekamp, where he focused on estate planning and corporate law.

Secretary Grayson is a fifth generation Kentuckian and lifelong resident of Northern Kentucky. He currently resides in Boone County with his wife, the former Nancy Humphrey of Lexington, and their two daughters, Alex and Kate.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Colonel William Gerald Willis, who is retired from the United States Army and is now a certified radio marketing consultant with WFLQ in French Lick, Indiana. He spoke about the history of the American flag also known as Old Glory. June 14th was the 228th anniversary of the flag, which became the official emblem in 1777. June 14th is also the 230th anniversary of the United States Army. On June 14, 1775, the Continental Congress created the Continental Army. The first official flag had 13 stripes and 13 stars. The person who designed the first American flag was Francis Hopkinson, also a signer of the

Declaration of Independence. The person who made the flag which inspired Francis Scott Key to write the immortal words to The Star Spangled Banner was Mary Pickersgill, who made a flag large enough that it could be clearly seen by the British at Fort McHenry. This flag was 30x42 feet and three stories high. It was completed in 1813 and was so huge it was completed in a local brewery in Baltimore. It was given to Major Armstead who commanded Fort McHenry in Baltimore harbor. In the war of 1812, the British made a three-prong attack: Down through New York; up through New Orleans; and an attack at Baltimore Harbor in an attempt to divide the country. The British boycott was so severe that New England threatened to leave the Union. After the British burned the Capitol, they attacked Baltimore that, if successful, would have threatened the very survival of the American nation. On September 13, the British attacked Fort McHenry, which took quite a beating from the British warships just out of reach of the American guns. Key happened to be on one of the ships in a successful attempt to gain the release of a physician friend, but they were not allowed off the ship until after the battle, out of fear they would give the Americans the British plans. He put the words of The "Star Spangled Banner" on the screen for all to see. The words of the second verse answer the questions of the first verse and the third verse tells of the defeat of the British. He ended his talk with an inspirational poem, a tribute to the flag and all the brave men and women who have given their all defending this country and the flag that represents this great land.



The speaker for the day was Secretary of State Trey Grayson, who spoke about three exciting things happening in the Secretary of State's Office. First, is the new web page which is the second most visited web page in Kentucky. Attorneys can access corporate information on it and it also contains election data and land grant information. It is a working web page that even features a translation service into several foreign languages. He urged Rotarians to check it out. Second, his office is promoting a civic literacy initiative which addresses the educational needs of youth. The program is going around the state to learn which schools have good civics classes. He emphasized that schools are not doing enough in this field of study. Students are encouraged to attend Board of Education and city commission meetings. His office is also doing regional summits which involve students, teachers, and administrators. The goal is to encourge greater participation by all citizens and determine what you as an individual can do in your community. This is a non-partisan effort. Third, Election 2006 aims to make all voting precincts accessible to persons with disabilities. Some polling places will change to make them more accessible to all voters. He warned us that this year's ballot will be a long one with all local offices and all judgeships except two up for election.

Keeping kids off the streets

A Q&A with Jim Thompson, founder/president of StreetKeepers and member of the Rotary Club of Guelph Trillium, Ontario, Canada

Rotary International: What is the Street-Keepers project? Thompson: StreetKeepers is an organization of Canadian Rotarians from District 7080, who are working with children that have no parents and are living on the streets in India, Nepal, and other Southeast Asian countries. Our purpose is to find ways of taking as many children off the street as we can.

RI: What motivated you to start StreetKeepers? Thompson: While in Kathmandu, I remember seeing a tarpaulin on the side of the road. I went over and lifted the corner of the it, and what I saw under there made my heart stop. There were three or four, maybe five little kids under the tarpaulin—about 7 to 9 years old — and they were all huddled together like a litter of puppies. And when I saw that, something just happened in my heart.

RI: How do you raise money for the project? Thompson: We encourage Rotary clubs all over the world to contribute C\$500 to our project each year. Our board gives feedback to participating clubs about every two months so that they can see what their Rotary dollars are doing. They can also meet the children they are helping.

RI: Do you work with local Rotarians to help these children? Thompson: We work with local Rotary clubs in India and Nepal and with partners we know are very reliable and are skilled in working with street children. So we raise the funds, the local Rotary clubs mentor the children and oversee the projects, and local organizations with sound reputations, such as Good Shepherd Sisters in India, provide the day-to-day care.

RI: Has there been a lot of interest in your project at the convention? Thompson: There has been tremendous interest, because it's a project for kids that can literally save lives.





Ron Crouch, Director, Kentucky State Data Center, University of Louisville

Ron Crouch is Director of the Kentucky State Data Center located at the University of Louisville. The Kentucky State Data Center (KSDC) is the official clearinghouse for Census data for the Commonwealth of Kentucky. KSDC provides data on population, housing, education, employment and other social indicators. Historical data, current data and projections are provided to help understand trends and issues facing individual states and the country as a whole.

Each state, as well as the entirety of the United States, is undergoing major demographic and economic revolutions. The populations are aging. The economy is moving from a manufacturing base to a knowledge base. Populations are growing more ethnically diverse and there are major differences in census data across regions.

Mr. Crouch's background is in data analysis and information development with an emphasis in enhancing data understanding and usability. He characterizes his vocation as "knowledge dissemination." Mr. Crouch provides approximately

150 presentations each year in Kentucky and across the nation.

Mr. Crouch is a graduate of the University of Louisville with a major in Sociology and minors in Political Science and Economics. He also holds MA in Sociology and MS in Social Work form the University of Louisville as well as an MBAS from Bellarmine University. Mr. Crouch has also done doctoral work at the University of Kentucky.






