This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Ron Crouch, director of the state data center. He stated that he was presenting a program about change, which is not necessarily good or bad. He spoke about changing demographics in Kentucky and the nation, and how the northeast is experiencing a decline in population with the southeast experiencing an increase. He stated that the difference between reality and perception is that reality changes. The census data shows us where we are going in the future. Twenty states are experiencing slower growth than Kentucky. Kentucky may lose a Congressional seat because this state is not growing as fast as many other states. Of course, there are factors that may change the dynamics, such as a water shortage in the West and hurricanes in Florida. Kentucky is on the edge of having great opportunities. Again, the changes taking place are neither good nor bad, but it does mean we will have to rethink our policies. For example, only one in three households today have children in them. Other changes are that most of the population growth in Kentucky is between I-65 and I-75. We have new rules for a new ballgame. The

greatest population growth today among persons under 45 are black, Asian, and Hispanic. Change is going on today as we become more diverse. Other changes are that we will have to redesign housing patterns, as there will be a slow-down in suburban sprawl. As the population ages, we can look for more movement back to cities and towns and there will be more need for mass transportation. Living in the city is not dangerous. It is the commute from the suburbs into the city that is the most dangerous activity. Although the economy changes, we are not ready for the new-age economy. There are too many young people who are not ready for the future. The greatest increase in unwed mothers is among women in their twenties. Pension plans are becoming more scarce as the baby boomers are approaching retirement. All these changes are taking place and we had better be ready to address them. People are living longer today due to better hygiene, sewers, and drinking water. Thank you Ron Crouch for giving us a sober look into a changing future for which we may not be adequately prepared.

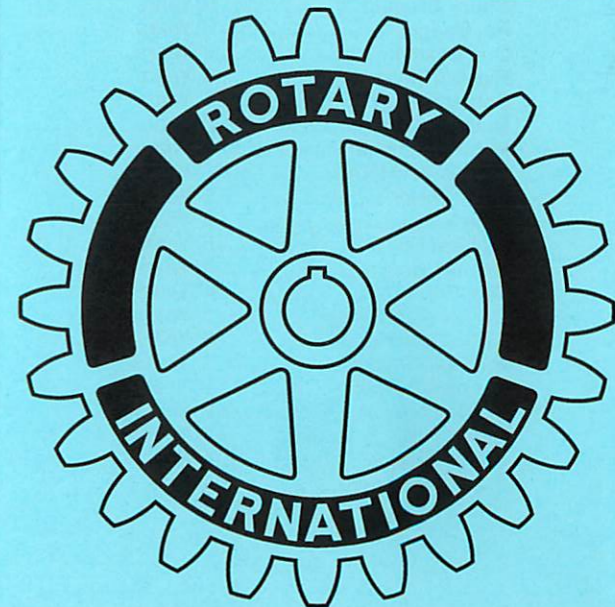

Commissioner Ellen Williams

Ellen Williams is the first female commissioner of the Governor's Office for Local Development. She was appointed by Governor Ernie Fletcher in May 2005.

Before her appointment, Williams served as Vice Chairman of the Public Service Commission. Prior to her work at the Public Service Commission, Williams served for five years as Chairman and Executive Director of the Republican Party of Kentucky. During her tenure as Chairman, she was chosen by President George W. Bush to chair the Site Selection Committee for the 2004 Republican Convention.

Williams was elected as the Chairman of the Southern Chairman's Association of the Republican National Committee and also served as the Chairman of the Defense Subcommittee of the Platform Committee at the 2000 Republican National Convention. Ellen was also named one of the 12 Most Influential Women in Kentucky by Kentucky Monthly Magazine.

Williams also served as a government relations consultant to the Lexington Board of Realtors. She spent 10 years in government ser-

vice in Washington, D.C. She began her career as a staff assistant to U.S. Representative Larry J. Hopkins (KY-6). She then worked for President Ronald Reagan and Vice President George Bush in the White House and then for U.S. Senator Bob Kasten (WI) and U.S. Senator Don Nickles (OK).

As Commissioner of GOLD, Williams serves as the Governor's Alternate to the Appalachian Regional Commission and the Delta Regional Authority. She also serves as a member of the board of the Kentucky Housing Corporation and PRIDE.

Williams is active in the Anderson County Independent Youth Soccer Association and is a volunteer in the Anderson County Public Schools. She is the mother of two sons.

The Board of Directors meeting will be July 18 at 5:30 p.m. at the Association of Independent Colleges & Universities, 484 Chenault Road.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Rodger Bingham, the Crittenden farmer, teacher, and developer who was "Kentucky Joe" from CBS' Survivor and is Deputy Executive Director of Agriculture Marketing and Product Promotion in the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. He stated that one of the biggest changes in the farming industry is the elimination of the tobacco quota system. Farmers are moving to alternative methods of farming, and there will be 30% less tobacco grown this year than last year. The emphasis now is on products grown, produced, and packaged in Kentucky, and the Department of Agriculture is attempting to promote it. Look for the "Kentucky Proud" label, which shows the product came from Kentucky. Farming is very important to the Kentucky economy. In responding to questions from the floor about being Kentucky Joe on the Survivor Show, he told how he stayed 36 of 42 days on the show and how he was rewarded with a blanket and a toothbrush. Temperatures in the Australian Outback would range from over one hundred degrees at day and in the thirties at night. The experience taught him to appreciate all the good things we have in this country and not to take them for granted. Thank you "Kentucky Joe" for a most interesting talk both about the state of agriculture in Kentucky as well as your experiences on Survivor in the Australian Outback.

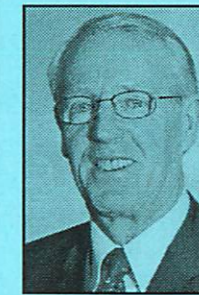

He represented the RI president many times at district conferences in locations stretching from Finland to Africa and the United States to India. He was an RI director in 1996-98, and as such was a member of the Executive Committee, chair of the Finance Committee of the Board, and vice chair of the Audit Committee.

He has been a member of the Audit and Operations Review Committee of RI and a member of the 2001 San Antonio Convention Committee. He was also moderator of the 1999-2000 Regional Magazine Editors Seminar, chair of the Permanent Fund Committee for Europe and RIBI, chair of the Presidential Celebration in Stockholm 2003, general coordinator for the 2003-04 Literacy and Education Task Force, PolioPlus national advocacy adviser, and member of the Polio Eradication Advocacy Task Force.

Carl-Wilhelm has been married to Monica since 1962. Monica was a physio-therapist by profession, specializing in orthopedics and sports medicine. During the last 10 years, she has worked as a volunteer with the World Wide Fund for Nature (known in North America as the World Wildlife Fund and recognized by the panda logo).

Monica and President Stenhammar have two sons, two grandsons, and one granddaughter.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Ellen Williams, the first female commissioner of the Governor's Office of Local Development. Her job is to work with communities to bring in economic development and revitalize downtowns. One example of this is to renovate downtown façades. She also works on land and water programs and recreational trails in state parks to keep people on the move. This also includes bike trails. There is a new program involving a community economic growth grant of some \$10 million for special local projects such as land acquisition and debt retirement. One example of this grant project in action in Frankfort was \$25,000 for renovation of the Grand Theatre. Frankfort is a Renaissance

City and is the focus of revitalization and renovation of its downtown. In 2006, Frankfort will be eligible to apply for a \$150,000 grant for the Grand. There is an additional \$100,000 in the state budget for a riverfront study to benefit Frankfort to attract people to Frankfort's riverfront. There is a waterway project, and she will be working with the City Commission and Fiscal Court on these and other projects. There are also past projects in Franklin County which are ongoing such as water lines in Choateville and the Bald Knob areas. Other ongoing projects include Cove Spring, the Clark Kentucky History Museum, and the Frankfort City Museum. Improvements to the Wildlife Center are also ongoing. Her department makes various loans throughout the state, and this is a truly bipartisan effort on the part of Kentuckians of all political persuasions. She concluded her talk by stating that she feels she has the best job in state government. Thank you Ms. Williams for a very interesting presentation on various projects which impact the Frankfort community.
