



of Kentucky. While in school, she worked as a medical transcriptionist which sparked her passion for a career in health care.

In 1998, she partnered with her husband as he moved from the Kentucky House of Representatives to the United States Congress. Then in December of 2003, she began yet another chapter in her life when her husband became the Governor of Kentucky.

As First Lady, she is devoting her time to encouraging and promoting healthier life-styles for all Kentuckians. Improving the health of Kentuckians, primarily children, is one of Mrs. Fletcher's main focuses. She serves as special advisor to the Get Healthy Kentucky! initiative. This initiative was created to address the health

issues facing citizens across the Commonwealth such as heart disease, obesity, asthma, lung cancer and diabetes.

The speaker for the day was Tim Hodge, who works with the Special Needs Adoption Program (SNAP) for the Cabinet for Children and Family Services. He helps to recruit families to adopt hard-to-place children who sometimes have physical or mental disabilities. Tim walked the Club through the adoption process which begins after the termination of parental rights, when the child is available for adoption. The SNAP program was begun in 1979 and today has six workers and 400 children statewide. The state is roughly divided in half between Louisville and Lexington offices. He also works with families from other states, but most adoptions are primarily in-state. For a com-


Literacy Book



His most notable flight was in the front seat of a tenton truck. Jim has been a Rotarian for twenty-one years and served as president 1995-96 and Sgt. of Arms for five years. He served as Post Commander of the VFW, Sister Cities program, Chairman of the renovation project to the Kentucky Veterans War Memorial as well as a number of other service projects. 

Nancy Newberry, Dept. of Education

Mrs. Newberry works in the Division of Early Childhood Development in the Kentucky Department of Education as a Branch Manager. In this role, she works with policy and program development in the Early Childhood Initiative, KIDS NOW.

In 2000 the General Assembly unanimously passed historic early childhood legislation, know as KIDS NOW (Kentucky Invests In Developing Success). The KIDS NOW early childhood initiative strives to support families within communities so each child reaches their fullest potential. Component parts of the KIDS NOW initiative include assuring maternal and child health, supporting families, enhancing early care and education, and building the support structure.

Mrs. Newberry has been involved in the field of early childhood development and education for almost three decades. She began her career teaching in an Ohio public school program where she trained students to work in early childhood settings and directed a laboratory classroom.

A Kentuckian since 1976, Mrs. Newberry has had varied opportunities in both the public and

private sector. Her career has included teaching in early childhood settings including child care and public school, providing early intervention for children with disabilities in home based programs, directing a program serving infants through kindergarten, training early childhood professionals, and providing technical assistance to early childhood programs. She holds a Masters Degree from Ohio University and has done additional graduate work in early childhood special education. The last ten years of her career have been at the state level in early childhood public policy and program development in several capacities.

Crit Luallen was elected the Commonwealth of Kentucky's 47th Auditor of Public Accounts in November of 2003. Ms. Luallen won statewide office on her first foray into elective politics after a distinguished career in public service. Luallen also served as State Budget Director,

Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet, Secretary of the Kentucky Tourism Cabinet, Commissioner of the Kentucky Department of the Arts, and Special Assistant to the Governor. She also spent four years in Louisville and served as President of the Greater Louisville Economic Development Partnership, a regional economic development agency. In 2001 Luallen was awarded the National Excellence in Leadership Award by Women Executives in State Government. She played a key role in developing and securing passage of the historic Higher Education Reforms of 1997 and the Early Childhood Development initiative. Ms. Luallen chaired EMPOWER Kentucky, a government efficiency initiative that produced savings to

Kentucky taxpayers of \$600 million. In response to allegations of wrongdoing in the Transportation Cabinet, Ms. Luallen spearheaded the creation of an Office of Inspector General. Ms. Luallen also played a leadership role in developing the Governor's School for the Arts, the Kentucky Information Highway, the Kentucky History Center, the Northern Kentucky Convention Center, and the expansion of the Commonwealth Convention Center in Louisville. Luallen is a native of Frankfort, a graduate of Centre College where she serves on the Board of Trustees and is married to Lynn Luallen, retired CEO of the Kentucky Housing Corporation and current president of The Louisville Housing Partnership.

These factors are: (1) Percentage of low weight babies; (2) Infant mortality which in Kentucky fairs worse than the national average; (3) Teens dropping out of school; (4) Teens not in school and not working; (5) No parent working year around; (6) Households in with children in poverty; and, (7) single parent households. 
