Rendell Butler, Executive Director of CASA, will be our guest speaker. Concerned over making decisions about abused and neglected children's lives without sufficient information, a Seattle judge conceived the idea of using trained community volunteers to speak for the best interests of these children in court. So successful was this Seattle program that soon judges across the country began utilizing citizen advocates. In 1990, the U.S. Congress encouraged the expansion of CASA with passage of the Victims of Child Abuse Act. Today more than 900 CASA program offices are in operation, with trained women and men serving as CASA volunteers.

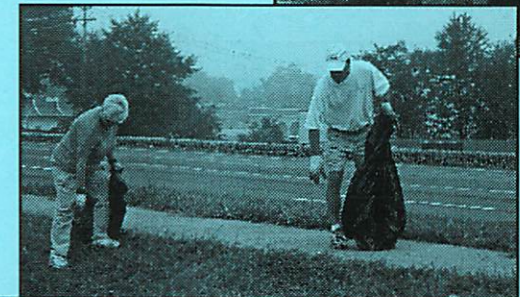

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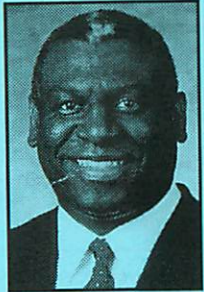

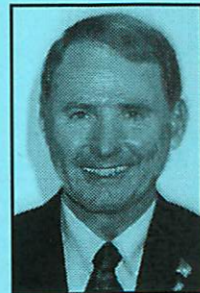
**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was CASA director Rendell Butler, who spoke about his work with neglected and abused children in Family Court. In 2003, there were 600 cases of child abuse reported in Franklin County with about one-third being substantiated. On an average, the police daily investigate four reports of domestic violence and Social Services investigates seven reports a day. Sixty children are presently committed to the Cabinet in foster homes or relative placement. Domestic violence and child abuse and neglect are all related. Colonel Larry Arnett was born in Oneida, Kentucky and in 1969 was commissioned an officer in the Army after graduating from EKU. He was a highly decorated veteran of the Vietnam War, serving in active duty until 1973 when he joined the Kentucky Army National Guard. During a 30-year military career, he commanded troops at platoon, company, battalion, and brigade levels. During the 1991 Persian Gulf War, over 500 soldiers assigned to his command were mobilized for duty in Saudi Arabia. Colonel Arnett was select-

ed in 1997 as the outstanding alumnus for the Department of Military Science at EKU and in 2003 was inducted into the Kentucky National Guard Hall of Fame. He has been highly decorated for meritorious service. Presently, he is awaiting promotion to Brigadier General and retired from a 27-year public service career with Kentucky State Government in 2000 where his assignments included serving as the Directors of Veterans Affairs, Air Transportation and Office of Kentucky Veterans Centers. He holds a BS degree from EKU with teacher certification and a Masters of Public Affairs from KSU. In 1998 he completed a course of education to become a Kentucky Certified Public Manager. He has served on the Board of the Frankfort Area Chamber of Commerce and Chairman of the Franklin County Ethics Commission. He is a respected military historian and the author of a book on Kentucky military history titled "Call to Arms." He is currently working on a book about Kentucky recipients of the Medal of Honor. He is married to Mary Arnett, a retired teacher, and they have two children, Jeff who is a captain on active duty in Afghanistan and Heather who completed a PhD. at the University of North Carolina and works as a medical research scientist in Seattle. Colonel Arnett is an announced candidate for Franklin County Circuit Court Clerk in upcoming elections.

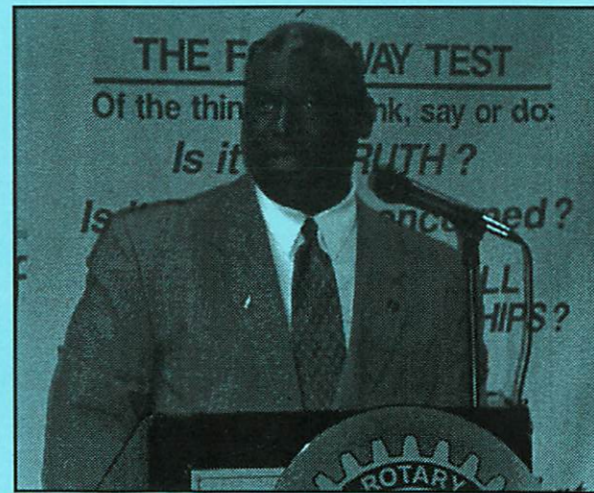

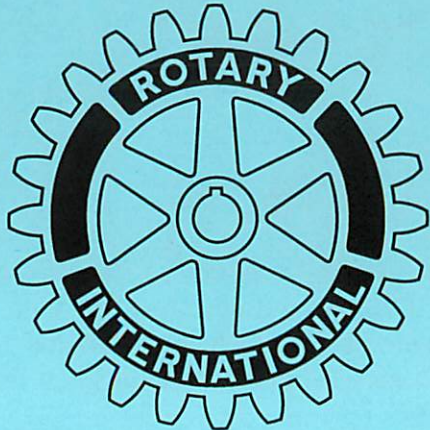

**David Orange** was hired as a contractor for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve, ESGR, in June of 2005. A position that, in his words, is very important to the success of Kentucky's soldiers. "I serve as a liaison between our Guard and Reservists and their employers," Orange said of his duties. "It is my responsibility to ensure both our military members and their employers are trained in the duties and obligations associated with periods of active duty." In mobility and de-mobility briefings, Orange explains to soldiers the importance of knowing and understanding the laws protecting their civilian employment during times of active duty. With thousands of Kentucky National Guard troops deployed, Orange often answers questions from both soldiers and employers on what to expect during an active duty tour. Because civilian employers play a huge roll in the life of the soldier, Orange says it's also important to reward them for always positively supporting activated soldiers. "We recognize our employers for supporting our Guard and Reserve members. Our ESGR Awards program (gives) The Patriot Award, Above and Beyond Award, The Pro Patria Award and special plaques," to those who give

support and maintain a good working relationship with the ESGR program. He retired in 2001 from the Kentucky Air National Guard as a Command Chief Master Sergeant, after 30 years of devoted service to the United States. In addition to the variety of career fields he experienced in the military Orange also holds a bachelor's degree in Business from McKendree College. There are also three associates degrees behind his belt, two from the Community College of the Air Force and one from Watterson College. Orange is also certified by the Federal Aviation Administration as an Airframe and Power plant mechanic. Before acquiring the full time position as ESGR Orange was active in assisting high school students in Richmond, Ky. As a senior instructor in the About Face Program, Orange lives in Shelby County and has three sons and two grandsons.

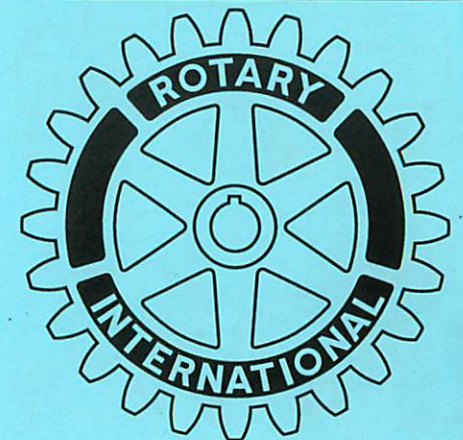
