Williams, a Grief Management Specialist from New Leaf Resources in Louisville, KY, will discuss ways employers can work with employees and provide on the job support that enables bereaved employees to heal and once again become productive and invested in the work environment.

Bill is presently the Manager of Frankfort Operations for Greenheck Fan Corp. here in Frankfort. Greenheck Fan Corp. is a leader in the institutional, commercial and industrial air movement and control industry.

A native of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, Bill graduated from South Dakota School of Mines & Technology with a B.S. degree in Mechanical Engineering. Following graduation, he worked for Trane Co. in Lacrosse, Wisconsin for seven years. While at Trane, he worked in Manufacturing Engineering and Production Management. When he left Trane he was in charge of a 600-person factory.

Bill started with Greenheck Fan Corp. in the spring of 1979 as Production Manager. Since that time, he has held several different manufacturing management positions in GFC before moving to Kentucky in 1999. While in these positions, he became certified in pre-determined time standards, participated in several successful union contract negotiations and managed the scheduling of the Wisconsin Facilities.

Corporate headquarters for GFC is located in

Schofield, Wisconsin. When Bill started with GFC, the annual sales were \$15M. Since that time, GFC has grown to \$300M. The Frankfort facility opened in August of 1996 with about 24 employee/owners. Presently there are about 150 employee/owners in Frankfort.

Bill has two children and four grandchildren who live in Wisconsin. He also is a past "Big Brother," strong Green Bay Packer fan and enjoys golf. In addition to his job at GFC, Bill has participated in the Industrial Round Table and has been on the Board of Directors of FHI for 5 years. He is the past President of FHI.

The speaker for the day was Sherry L. Williams who spoke about her work with New Leaf Resources, which deals with, and attempts to manage issues associated with grief and loss in the workplace. This involves not only grief over the loss of a loved one but also divorce and even the loss of a pet. She stressed the need for employers to have Grief Recovery programs

since grief costs industry an estimated \$300 billion per year when all the hidden costs are considered which include the employees' ability to perform in the workplace, company finances, physical injuries due to grief, and all other physical problem affecting performance in the workplace such as obesity, alcohol abuse, and depression. Employers must learn to empathize with and support employees who experience grief and losses of many kinds.

The RI Board of Directors has chosen Salt Lake City, Utah as the site for 2007 RI Convention, slated for the state-of-the-art Salt Palace Convention Center, from 17-20 June.

The 3 November decision by the Board essentially switches New Orleans, now designated to host the convention in 2011, with Salt Lake City.

In August, Hurricane Katrina not only destroyed much of the New Orleans infrastructure, but also jeopardized the ability of local Rotary clubs to organize and host such a large-scale, international meeting. The switch gives New Orleans Rotary members ample time to rebuild their lives and businesses without taking on the formidable task of planning and hosting an international convention.




