This Week's Speaker..

The speaker for the day was George R. Burgess, Jr., Deputy Commissioner for the Department for Existing Business Development in the Economic Development Cabinet. He stated that his Cabinet has a partnership with various community organizations - specifically with the Capital Community Development Authority headed up by last week's speaker, Phil Kerrick. The past director was Darrell Gilliam, who first put Frankfort on the right path for economic development. He gave a little of the background on his Cabinet, which aims to create new jobs by entering into partnerships with local organizations. Secretary Gene Strong is now in his 13th year in that position. The Cabinet has four departments: (1) The Department of New Business Development with offices in Tokyo and Brussels; (2) The Department of Financial Incentives

which has an emphasis on tax credits to stimulate businesses and bring new businesses to this state; (3) The Department of Commercialization and Innovation; (4) The Department for Existing Business Development. Sixty percent of new jobs come from existing businesses. This fourth department is broken down into several divisions: (a) Regional offices in Prestonsburg, Madisonville, and Frankfort; (b) International Trade Division with offices in Mexico and Chile to help Kentuckians sell products overseas; (c) The Small Business Services Division with the need to do more for small businesspersons. As part of this is the Kentucky Procurement Services; (d) Small Business Counseling Division; (e) Small Business Loan Program; (e) The Kentucky Business Finder which helps Kentucky businesses find other Kentucky companies with which to do business. He noted that economic development is often difficult in rural communities and having an educated workforce is of particular concern.

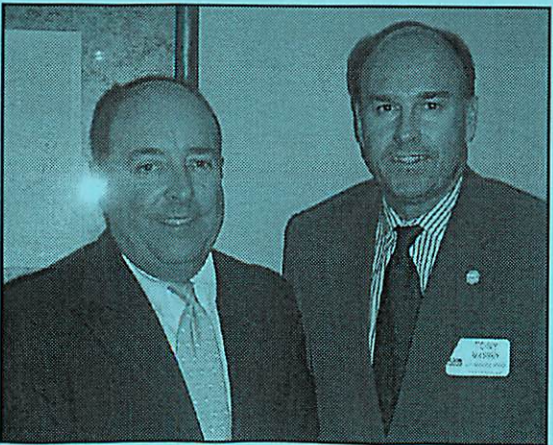

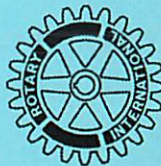

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Angela Traver, Public Relations Manager for Buffalo Trace Distillery. She is responsible for all media relations at the distillery, web site development, and brand- and tourism-building activities. She announced that the George T. Stagg gallery is now open and the gift shop has been extended. There are free year-round tours at the distillery. The tour guides do not follow a particular script and you never get the same tour when you go. For example, there is a "Hard Hat" tour which gives one a behind-the-scene look at the distillery where the guide talks about the distilling process and one actually goes to the back side of the distillery. One tank of mash holds 92,000 gallons and one gets to see how bourbon is made. She is an official taster and informed us that five people taste each barrel and the barrel is rejected if any one of the five do not like it. The distillery has received 150 honors, and Buffalo Trace has been named Distillery of the Year for three years. It is the oldest continuing operating distillery in the country because it continued to produce during Prohibition when the product was produced for medicinal purposes. The age of the bourbon ranges from four to 23 years. Of the 23 gallons in

23-year-old bourbon, only five to seven gallons is left. A 23-year-old bourbon costs \$22, since a lot of taxes have been paid on it in that time. Brands of Buffalo Trace include Buffalo Trace, Blanton's Bourbon, and Ancient Age. There are 13 different labels including even vodka. There are 110 buildings located on 110 acres. Buffalo Trace has long been involved in many community events including the Folk Life Festival, the annual Easter egg hunt where over 10,000 are hidden for hundreds of children, the 5K race which proceeds are donated to the VFW fireworks display event, the Haunting of the Distillery at Halloween, and the lighting at Christmas.

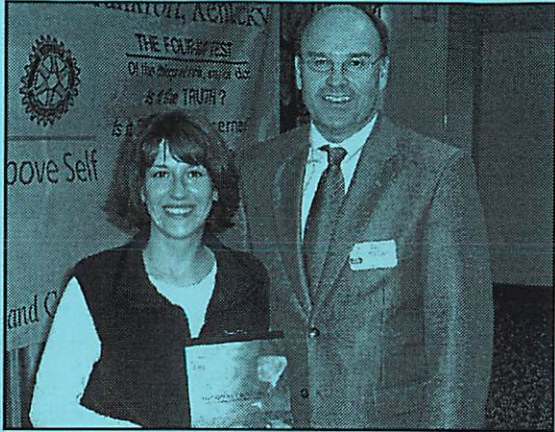

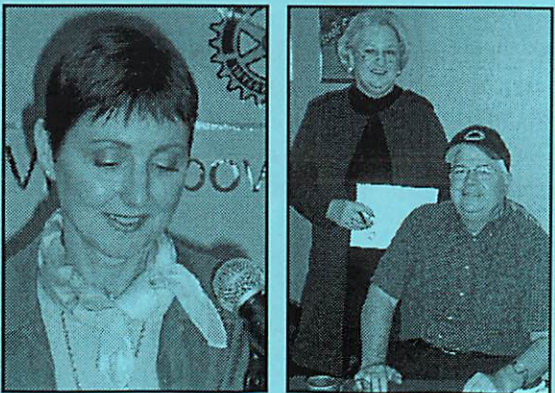

This Week's Speaker...

The April 26 speaker was Allen Downs, Vice President of Operations for Ohi Automotive of America (OAA). A 1981 UK graduate, Allen has over 24 years of experience in manufacturing operations and product engineering. He has been employed by OAA since 2000. OAA was established in 1988 as Ohi Atwood and started production of automotive parts in Rockport, IL in 1989. Its parent company is located in Japan. Ohi completed its Frankfort facility in 1990 and a satellite facility in Winchester in 1994. OAA has 739 employees and \$192 million in sales. 311 of its permanent employees work at the Frankfort plant, with an annual payroll of over \$14 million. The Frankfort facility also has about 60 temporary employees. About 65% of the Frankfort employees are residents of Franklin County. Anderson County residents comprise most of the rest. Allen reviewed OAA's various products and customer base. Nissan, Ohi Atwood's sole customer when it was first established, still accounts for 84% of OAA's sales. The company also supplies Toyota, GM, Subaru, Chrysler, Mitsubishi, and others. Products include such items as side door locks, sunroofs, door hinges, power slide door, and seat adjusters. OAA has received 3 certifications for product and production quality: ISO 9001 (1999), QS 9000 (2000), and ISO14001, an environmental protection certification (2004). The company is also a partner in the local community. OAA contributes \$10,000 directly to the United Way and its employees collectively contribute \$5,000-\$10,000 more. OAA also makes \$7,000 in direct contributions to local youth sports, Project Graduation, and the Salvation Army. It relies on local suppliers for machine repair and operations, local freight and warehousing, and some of material purchases (primarily steel). Allen signed the book, First Dictionary of Cultural Literacy, which the club will give to a local school library in honor of his presentation.

Rotary Profile: Len Shirrell



Len Shirrell grew up on a farm in Green County, on Green River, near Greensburg where he graduated from high school in 1942. He received one year of college at Western State University before he was drafted into the army. He served as an infantry sergeant during the Battle of the Bulge where he

was twice wounded in battle. After returning to civilian life he graduated from Western where he was selected for Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities. He graduated from Iowa State University with a degree in veterinary medicine. He and his wife lived and worked briefly in Lebanon and Owenton before moving to Frankfort where he worked as a veterinarian for 34 years. Len served as Secretary, President, and District Governor of the Rotary Club. He served as Secretary and President of the Kentucky Veterinary Medical Association. He served on the City Commission for three terms. He is elder emeritus of First Christian Church and served two years as president of the administrative board. Other community activities include Kentucky Board of Agriculture, Board of Veterinary Examiners, Chamber of Commerce, Boy Scouts and Community Council. When asked about his most notable accomplishment he said "Service to my country and community." Len has three children and four grandchildren. His hobby is photography. He has 53 years of perfect attendance.

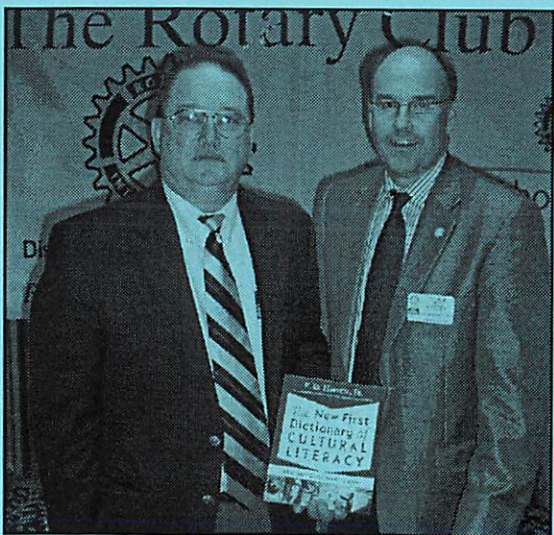
