Julian Carroll

Julian Carroll is a native of McCracken County, Kentucky. In 1954 Julian Carroll graduated from the University of Kentucky and in 1956 received a law degree from the university. Upon his discharge from the U.S. Air Force, he returned to Kentucky to practice law.

In 1962, Julian Carroll was elected to the Kentucky House of Representatives and from 1968 to 1972 served as Speaker of the House. He was elected Lieutenant Governor in 1971 and succeeded as Governor in December of 1974, to fill the last year of Governor Wendell Ford's term. On November 4, 1975, Julian Carroll was elected to a full four-year term.

In 2004, Julian Carroll was elected to the Kentucky State Senate 7th District. When the General Assembly is not in session, Senator Carroll continues to farm and practice law in Franklin County. Family time is shared with his wife Charlann of fifty-five years, and their four children's families.

Rotary Profile - Orman Wright



Orman Wright was born in Dixon, Kentucky but has lived in Prattsburg, New York; Lebanon, Lexington, and Louisville, Kentucky; Phoenix, Arizona; Dallas, Texas; Cambridge, Massachusetts; and Brooklyn, New York. He went to high school in Lebanon and attended the University of Kentucky, Pratt Institute, Harvard College and the University of Louisville. He enjoys basketball and boat racing. Among his hobbies are writing, having authored a history of his military unit, a personal memoir, book of poetry, and 14 articles in the field of Industrial Psychology. His positions held include Assistant Financial Editor of the *Louisville Times*, Executive Director of United Cerebral Palsy of Kentucky, Deputy Director of the Arizona Personal Commission, chief of the Performance Improvement Center, the United States Civil Service Commission, Dallas Regional Office. He has served as Adjunct Professor at three different universities. His most notable accomplishment is being primarily responsible for the first two telethons in Kentucky as Executive Director of the United Cerebral Palsy of Kentucky in 1952-53. They were both pattern-setters and highly successful. He is the widower of Kate Fleming Wright and the father of daughter Ann Austin Wright. Both his parents are deceased and he has no siblings. Finally, Orman notes that all his published works have been sold out and the book of poetry (*Leider Street*) was published by Larkspur Press and has now become a collector's item. He also won the national championship in his boat racing class in 1966.

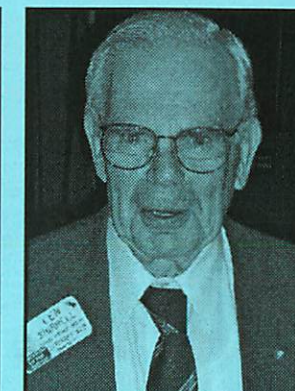

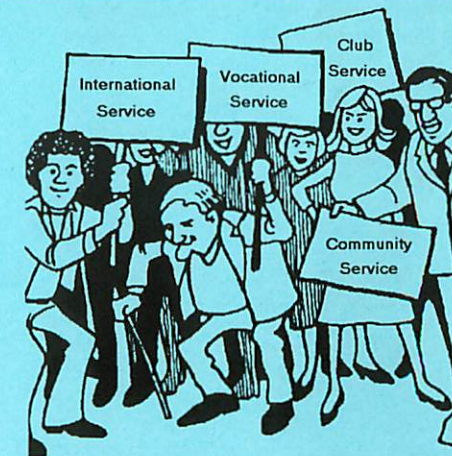

Major (Retired) Marty Pinkston

Major (retired) Marty Pinkston attended the University of Kentucky on an Army ROTC scholarship and was commissioned as a second lieutenant, armor branch upon graduation in 1979. After commissioning he served on active duty for four years in 1st Cavalry Division at Fort Hood, Texas. He was appointed in the Kentucky National Guard in 1984 where he served in a full-time capacity until his retirement in 1999.

In the course of his military career Pinkston served in various leadership positions in tank units including: platoon leader, company commander, battalion s-3 operations officer, battalion executive officer and armor battalion commander, as well as various positions in the human resources office of the Kentucky National Guard.

Pinkston's military education includes armor officer basic course, armor officer advanced course as well as command and general staff college. His awards and decorations include: army achievement medal with one oak leaf cluster, army commendation medal, meritorious service medal with oak leaf cluster, and he was inducted into the U.S. Armor Association's Order of St. George.

After military retirement, Pinkston was first appointed in the Kentucky Department of Veterans Affairs as an executive's staff advisor in 2001. He assumed the role of chief of staff in 2004 and was appointed as Deputy Commissioner on 1 December 2005. Pinkston is married to the former Fran McHargue of Frankfort, Kentucky and they have one daughter; Emily Grace.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was former Governor and present Senator Julian Carroll, who spoke about the state budget as it relates to the stability of Kentucky state government and state agencies. He stated that in the last several administrations there has been a shift in power from the executive to the legislative branch regarding the state budget. The first budget originates with the governor, the second is written by the House, the third is written by the Senate, the fourth is written in caucus and finally the fifth ends up back in the governor's office when the legislature is not in session. Although the executive branch is

more knowledgeable as to the needs of state government, the state legislature is unfortunately getting to be more like the federal government where each legislator gets at least one project to take back home. The result is that funds which are meant for one project get channeled into other projects. This is not conducive to efficient government and this system has led the state to the brink of bankruptcy. The problem is that the General Assembly has raided all existing trust funds to the tune of \$800 million. This is one-time money, but it is being spent like it is available every year. The state has borrowed from the Teachers' Retirement Fund, and the amount borrowed would equal the annual cost of the teachers' health insurance. The teachers were investing at the rate of 9½% but the state is paying back at an interest rate of only 7½%. As a result, the teachers are being denied 2% interest they would otherwise be earning. Senator Carroll stated that a "Rainy Day" fund makes no sense in the context of state government where the state is investing at a 4½% rate. Senator Carroll suggests that this fund could be better placed in the Teachers' Retirement Fund. Concerning state retirement, it has not been funded adequately for the last several years so that it is several hundred million dollars underfunded. He stated that the state couldn't continue to support state and county governments, and barely funds the public universities. There is at present about \$1 billion in state debt in a budget where \$16 billion is already spoken for. The state presently pays health costs for one of every four Kentuckians, or one million citizens of this state.

Major General Donald C. Storm, Kentucky National Guard

Major General Donald C. Storm was appointed as the 51st Adjutant General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky by Governor Ernie Fletcher Dec. 9 2003. Gen. Storm began his military career in 1970 as an enlisted soldier, serving with Military Assistance Command Vietnam. After leaving active duty in 1972, he enlisted in the Kentucky Army National Guard and has been employed full time by the Guard since 1974. Since he was commissioned as an Infantry officer in 1981, the General has commanded and served in staff officer positions at the company, battalion, brigade, and state headquarters level. His senior-level leadership assignments include: Director of Army Personnel; State Surface Maintenance Manager, Director of Plans, Operations and Training; and State Counter-Drug Coordinator. Gen. Storm served as the Kentucky Army Guard's Chief of Staff from October 2001 to December 2003.

This Week's Speaker....

The speaker for the day was Major (Retired) Marty Pinkston, the Deputy Commissioner for the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs. He stated that there are about 360,000 veterans in Kentucky with 52,000 still living from World War II, 50,000 from the Korean War, and 120,000 from the Vietnam War. The Gulf War totals are still open. There are several ways his agency serves veterans. First, there are three Veterans Centers across the state in Wilmore at the Thomson-Hood facility at which there is no waiting list, the Western Kentucky facility at Hanson, and the Hazard facility with again no waiting. These nursing homes provide special dietary meals and many activities for the residents. There are daycare facilities for workers in the home, and there is interaction between the kids and the residents who are truly "living history." Also on site are physical therapy, a physician, and pharmacy. The second

way his agency is helping is with a benefits operation. Veterans are assisted in obtaining federal and state benefits. These benefits include education, compensation and pensions and insurance as well as medical benefits for a total of \$1.1 billion coming into the state from the federal government. There is a local field representative in Lexington who is in Frankfort every Wednesday. A third area is cemeteries. There are seven federal cemeteries in Kentucky, but four are now full. Five new state cemeteries are being opened with one in Hopkinsville which is now open and new state cemeteries at Fort Knox, Williamstown, Greenup County, and Leslie County are planned. A fourth way veterans are being helped are through special programs. There is a high school diploma program for veterans whose education was interrupted by war. Other special programs include a Trust Fund and the Korean War MIA project. There are over 8,100 MIAs from the Korean War, and DNA samples are taken in identification efforts when remains are discovered. The United States is the only country with such a program for which some \$100 million is spent annually. Finally, another special program is the Leestown Homeless Veterans Transition Facility. The goal of his agency, which in the words of George Washington, is to "Serve Those Who Have Served."

Rotary Profile: Duane Ellis



Duane was born in Frankfort on September 30, 1936 and has been here all his life except for a stay in Connersville, Indiana and a hitch of six years in the Army at Fort Stewart, Georgia. He graduated from Elkhorn High School and got his BS in business and accounting from UK. While in high school he played basketball. Duane was Division Director of Accounting for the Transportation Cabinet as well as City Treasurer for a time. He likes to play at golf and never misses the Club Golf Scramble. He served as board member and president of the Coalition of

Committed Christians and has worked for years for the Soup Kitchen and Shelter. He and his wife Marie have two children, Kent and Robin, as well as two grandchildren who give him plenty of babysitting time. Duane is most proud of his term as president of the Frankfort Rotary Club, with 31 years of perfect attendance, a Paul Harris Fellowship and his Pat Ireland Fellowship.

Next Week's Program...

Lewis Nichols (Nicky) Hughes is curator of historic sites for the City of Frankfort, Kentucky. He supervises the Downtown Division of the city's Department of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Sites. He is responsible for several parks, including the Leslie Morris Park on Fort Hill, which preserves two Civil War earthwork forts and the site of an 1864 skirmish, both in a 125-acre forest preserve. Hughes recently supervised the renovation of an 1810 log structure there to house exhibits and a re-created Civil War era roadside inn. He completed the first phase of Frankfort's new Capital City Museum late in 2004. The museum tells the history of Frankfort. Hughes co-authored the book Historical Images of Frankfort, published late in 2004. The second volume of Historical Images of Frankfort came out in the autumn of 2005. Both were top-selling books at the Kentucky Book Fair. He is a partner in Victoria & Albert Historical Consultants, which wrote much of the text for the Cincinnati Museum Center's major temporary exhibit Liberty on the Border: The Civil War and the Ohio River Valley and designed the re-creation of the state library in Kentucky's 1827 Old State Capitol. Victoria & Albert Consultants also planned the exhibits in the

recently opened Big Sandy Regional Museum in Pikeville. During his 27-year career with Kentucky state government, Hughes was curator of the Kentucky Military History Museum, curator of the Old State Capitol, and museums division manager for the Kentucky Historical Society. He worked on initial plans for the museum portion of the new Kentucky History Center. Later, he was historic preservation specialist for the Division of Historic Properties. Hughes retired from state government in 2000 to take his current position with the City of Frankfort. Born in Nashville in 1950, Hughes grew up in southern Kentucky. He graduated from Western Kentucky University in 1972 and attended UK College of Law. Hughes and his wife Susan Lyons Hughes live at the mouth of Benson Creek inside the City of Frankfort's Kentucky River View Park. They collect antiques and enjoy classic and high-performance Mustang automobiles.

This Week's Speaker...

The May 24 speaker was Major General Donald C. Storm of the Kentucky National Guard, the 51st Adjutant General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. A Viet Nam veteran, Gen. Storm enlisted in the Kentucky Guard in 1972 and has been employed full time by the Guard since 1974. General Storm spoke about those serving in the armed forces today, focusing on the Kentucky Guard. He also addressed the global war on terrorism and operations in the Middle East. Since 9/11, more than 8,800 soldiers and airmen have been mobilized from the KY National Guard. That number exceeds the Guard's authorized personnel strength, which means some members have been mobilized multiple times. The KY Guard has also had to respond to the natural disasters in the US Gulf region. 1354 soldiers and airmen went to assist the Gulf states at a time when KY had over 1300 troops in overseas locations. The Guard also responded to KY tornado victims while providing hurricane Katrina relief. Gen. Storm emphasized that it's important to keep up the Guard's strength in KY and the nation to respond to problems at home as well as internationally. He described the global war on terror as a long war that is here to stay. While Iraq and Afghanistan are currently the main front, the enemy is borderless, transnational, and real. Gen. Storm said that we need to look at all 27 countries in the Middle East, with 650 million people, important natural resources, and the nexus of vital transportation routes. It's the site of a great struggle between extremists and moderates. The challenge is to make sure the moderates succeed in managing change without resorting to violence. Gen. Storm reviewed US armed forces accomplishments that have benefited the people of Afghanistan - providing education for girls as well as boys, health care, and infrastructure development. The people's reaction to our soldiers, in both Afghanistan and Iraq, is far better than news reports of suicide bombings suggest, he said.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Nicky Hughes, Curator for Historic Sites for Frankfort. He began his talk by telling us about the Union uniform he wears, which the Federal government adopted in 1851 to save money and fought the Civil War in it. Needless to say, it was quite hot in the summer and the government did not go back to the summer cotton uniform until the 1870s. In honor of Memorial Day, he spoke about a Frankfort hero known as Sanford Goins (later Goin) who had a major role in saving Frankfort from the Confederate forces led by John Hunt Morgan. He first told about Goins' adventure out West where he led a herd of cattle to California with the goal of using the money thus earned from the sale of the cattle to finance an ill-fated gold digging operation. Then in 1861, being pro-Union, he enlisted in the local militia and helped prepare the

cannon at Fort Hill to defend Frankfort. Frankfort was saved and this little-known hero was at least remembered at Rotary in honor of Memorial Day.

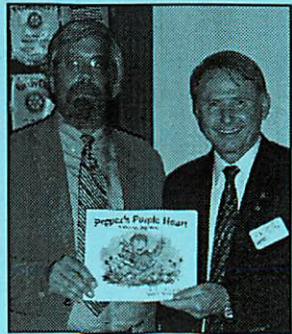
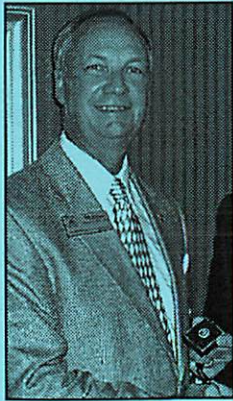
