This Week's Speaker...

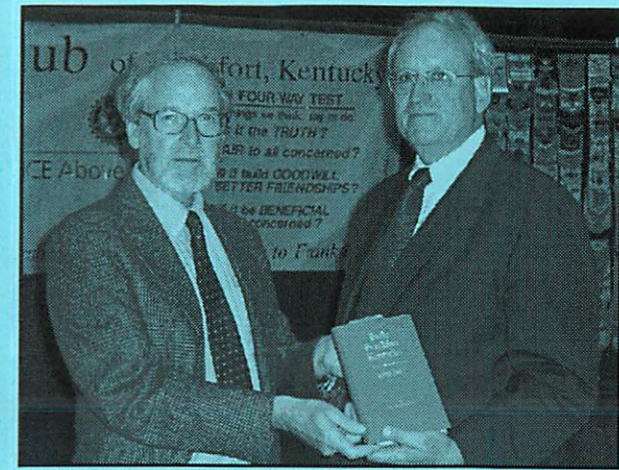
The speaker for the day was attorney Bill Cull, who spoke about recent happenings at the Grand Theatre. He praised Rotarians for buying some of the 170 seats that have been sold, and talked about the incremental plan to move the Grand forward. Contracts have been finalized for the marquee to identify the theatre. On January 19, programs were begun toward obtaining the certificate of occupancy. In a four-month period, there have been 2665 paid admissions - 500 coming to the Wizard of Oz alone. It will be an arts and education center when completed, in addition to showing movies. There have also been events for legislators with Senators Williams, Kelly, Carroll, and Clark attending. The legislature has appropriated over \$480,000, but \$3 million more is needed. The final schematic design will be ready by July or August. We are looking forward to a multipurpose visual and performing arts center. They are in the process of acquiring the Hendrick Building next door. A hole will be knocked out between the buildings to make room for dressing rooms. \$2.5 million of the additional amount needed will go to restoration, with the balance going to acquire the building next door and for other uses. \$1.6 million has been invested so far, including funding from Farmers Bank and from Renaissance grants. Although there is still a long way to go, Bill expressed his appreciation for the numerous volunteers who have pitched in as well as the sponsorships. The Grand is continuing to make progress and Bill reminded us of the upcoming Taste of Frankfort event.

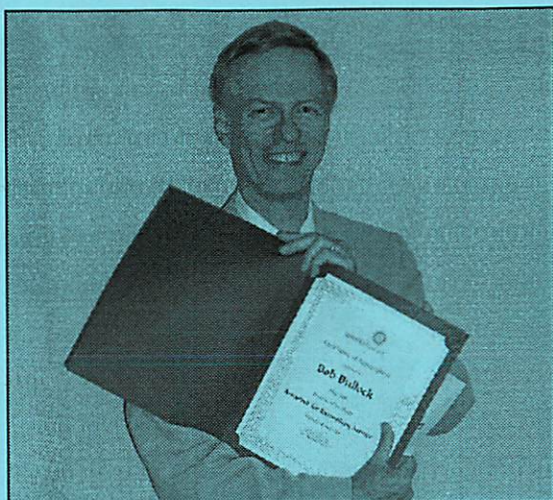

Rotary Profile: Steven Gale



Steven H. Gale is the Endowed Chair in the Humanities at Kentucky State University. He received his B.A. at Duke University, his M.A. at UCLA, and his Ph.D. at USC. He has been a Professor of English at eight different universities. Steven has written 22 books, 70 articles in books, 45 journal

articles, and 43 essay-reviews. His dissertation was on "Thematic Change in the Stage Plays of Harold Pinter, 1957-67." Steven has also many production reviews to his credit, as well as film reviews and numerous scholarly and professional papers. His administration experience includes a graduate program and curriculum developer at the University of Liberia, where he was also a director of the University Players/Little Theatre. He also has a United States Information Service lecture series there. His honors and awards include Humanities and Nobel Laureate Lecturer at the University of Calgary, a Danforth Associate, a Fulbright Scholarship to Liberia, United States Information Agency Academic Specialist Program, State of Florida Certificate of Recognition, Missouri State Board of Education Certificate of Appreciation and the JC Penny/United Way Golden Rule award. Steve has for many years been an invited participant at the Kentucky Book Fair. He was also involved with Project India U.S.I.S. cultural exchange tour, awarded the title of "Fonzingena (sub-chief) in Awing, Cameroon as well as the title of "Sufo." Locally, Steve has been president of the Frankfort Arts Foundation, President of the Joplin-National Affiliation for Literacy Advance Board of Directors, coordinator and speaker for the public lecture/film series "The Films of Harold Pinter," and discussion leader at the Kentucky Historical Society. He is married to his wife Kathy and they have three children. Kathy is a ballet teacher and children's' storywriter, Shannon is owner of the Frankfort School of Ballet, Ashley is a medical

physicist at the Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville and Heather is a M.A. student in environmental biology at U.K.

John Hockensmith, Equine Photographer

John Stephen Hockensmith studied art and photography at Georgetown College. Mr. Hockensmith began his career working for the Commonwealth of Kentucky as a state photographer. With training and experience from state government, he left to begin a business career in 1978 in Georgetown as an independent photographer. At this time, he opened a studio and art gallery. Throughout the 1980s he pursued fine arts, exhibited paintings, sculptures and photographs. In 1986 he had one-man-exhibit of paintings at the Headley-Whitney Museum in Lexington.

In 1994, Mr. Hockensmith focused his career on the equine theme. From the mid 1990s to the present, he has published, exhibited and distributed fine equine art throughout the United States and internationally. Since 2000, he has been under contract with Churchill Downs to do the official Kentucky Derby Winners Print and Winners Collection.

In 2004, Mr. Hockensmith had a one-man exhibition at the International Museum of the Horse. This exhibition, Rare Breeds from

Figurative to Abstract was critically acclaimed. Currently he is working on another exhibition for the International Museum of the Horse on Gypsy Horses and The Road to Appleby Fair. This major exhibition will accompany his first book, Gypsy Horses and the Traveler's Way. The book, designed by Frankfort's Bob and Sallie Lanham, features Hockensmith's photography as he traveled by wagon with the gypsies along the road to Appleby Fair. Mr. Hockensmith's current client base includes such notables as Toyota, Churchill Downs, Lexmark, Universal Studios and the Governor of Kentucky.

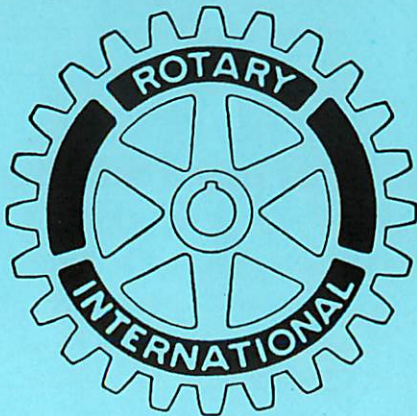

This Week's Speaker...

Our speakers were John Stephen Hockensmith, KY Equine Photographer, and "Colonel" Gordon Boswell, owner/curator of the Gordon Boswell Romany Gypsy Museum in Spalding, Lincolnshire, England. (Colonel Boswell is a recently inducted member of the KY Colonels; hence, his new title celebrated by all!). Through beautiful photographs, narratives, and poetry, Steve Hockensmith reviewed his experiences of the Gypsy culture and the delightful, recently recognized breed of black and white horses presented in Gypsy Horses and the Travelers' Way. (The book is designed by our own Bob and Sallie Lanham, available at Poor Richard's Books, and currently celebrated at a KY Horse Park exhibi-

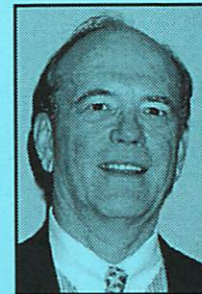
tion). Key to the presentation were accounts of the Appleby Fair: a horse sale first chartered by King James II in 1685.

As a Gypsy, born and raised in a tent in England, subsequently elevated to living in caravan trailers, and, more recently, the successful owner of a museum of wonderful gold-embossed Gypsy caravans, Colonel Boswell joined Mr. Hockensmith in celebrating the "black and white" horses that now number 1000 in the US. Small in stature (14 hands), small of head, beautifully "feathered" (legs), flowing manes, and a jaunty gait distinguish these horses, bred from the small Scots Clydesdale and other breeds to "perfection." Our speakers' review of Gypsy culture and history treated us to a short, but intriguing history of fascinating people.

As part of our literacy program, our speakers generously donated an autographed copy of Gypsy Horses and the Travelers' Way to Paul Sawyer Public Library.

Rotary Profile: Ron Christopher



Ron Christopher was raised in Somerset, where both parents were teachers and built a Dairy Queen in the early 1950s. He attended two years of high school and two years of college in Murray where his father became a faculty member at Murray State University. He received his B.A. and J.D.

degrees from the University of Kentucky. His legal career started as an Assistant United States Attorney in both Louisville and Brooklyn, New York. He practiced law as a private practitioner for 28 years in Murray. He was elected Commonwealth's Attorney for Calloway, Marshall, and Livingston Counties and served from 1974 to 1981. Ron served on the Board of Regents at Murray State University from 1977

through 1983 and also served as its Chairman. He served on the Board of Directors of the Boy Scouts of American National Museum. He was president of the Kentucky Commonwealth's Attorney Association in 1979. He served as a delegate to the Democratic National Convention in New York City in 1980. He was a member of the Murray Rotary Club for 12 years and joined the Frankfort Rotary Club in 1997. He has four daughters and four granddaughters (a fifth one is on the way). Ron is married to Wilma Rose Christopher, a retired state employee who has two sons. They spend a good portion of their time traveling to visit with their children and grandchildren. Ron currently serves as Assistant General Counsel in the Office of Financial Institutions. His previous state Government service included serving as Director of the Special Fund in the Labor Cabinet, and as General Counsel for the Transportation Cabinet.

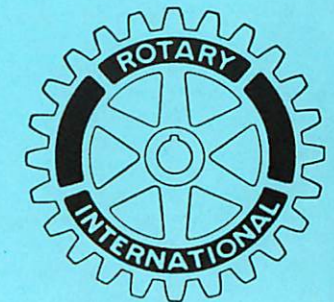
