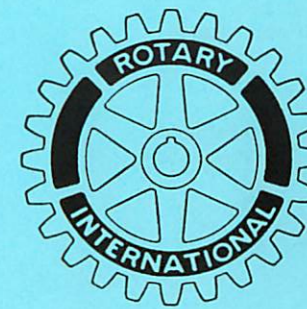

**Stephen Wrinn, Director of
The University Press of Kentucky**

Stephen Wrinn has been director of The University Press of Kentucky since 2002. He serves as the Press' third director since its creation in 1943. He succeeded Kenneth Cherry, who retired from the Press in August 2001, after 23 years of service.

Previously, he was vice president of editorial and executive editor for history and political theory at Rowman & Littlefield Publishers in Lanham, Md. In addition to his responsibilities at Rowman & Littlefield, Wrinn was also editorial director for Lexington Books.

Wrinn has worked with a wide range of prominent scholars and public intellectuals during his time at Rowman & Littlefield

and Lexington Books, including Jean Bethke Elshaint, Amitai Etzioni, James T. Patterson, Lance Banning, William Kristol and Jonathan Yardley.

Books that Wrinn has acquired have won awards, including the Washington Post Notable Book of the Year in History, the Herbert Hoover Library Prize for the Best Book in American History, and the Philadelphia Inquirer Book of the Year in Cultural Studies.

Born and raised in Wallingford, Conn., Wrinn earned a bachelor's degree in history at Kenyon College and an advanced degree in history at the University of Vermont. Before pursuing a career in publishing, Wrinn instructed classes in American history at the University of Vermont, Champlain College, and The American University in Washington, D.C.

Wrinn is also the author of a book, "Civil Rights in the Whitest State: Vermont's Perceptions of Civil Rights, 1945-1968," and he has written about the book-publishing industry for The Washington Post. He and his wife, Julie, have a 15-month-old son, Eli.

The University Press of Kentucky publishes about 60 books a year in the fields of history, political science, film studies, Kentucky and Appalachian studies, and folklore, among others. The Press is a consortium that represents Kentucky's eight public universities, five private colleges, and two historical societies.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Brent Sweger, transportation-planning engineer with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet. He asks the question "What makes Franklin County special to you?" He noted some of the assets of Franklin County including water resources for recreation, fishing and fish and water habitats, farms and markets, local businesses, rural scenic beauty, history, community events like Capital Expo, parks and open space like Cove Spring, and institutions such as the Department of Library and Archives. He then listed some of the downsides of this county which includes run-down and underutilized commercial centers, large developments which are poorly

planned and do not function, loss of farmland, big roads where there is congestion, "cookie cutter" subdivisions which are unattractive with no parks, and high taxes. However, we should endeavor to create the kind of community we want where kids can walk safely to school, where generations can live in the same neighborhood, where buildings are again designed to be beautiful, and where stately government buildings are placed in areas of prominence. He would like to see a community where ones work is only a 15-minute walk away, where parks are within walking distance with club houses and swimming pools. We need more open space regulations where one can sit on one's front porch and talk to neighbors. We need affordable and attractive houses for persons of all income levels. We need healthy, vibrant farms and streams and forests, which would provide a great place to live and play. The questions are: (1) What do you see? (2) What would you like to see change? (3) What do you see for the future? He encouraged Rotarians to attend Envision Franklin County, where these issues are addressed the last Tuesday of each month at 6:30 at the Farmers Bank Community Room.

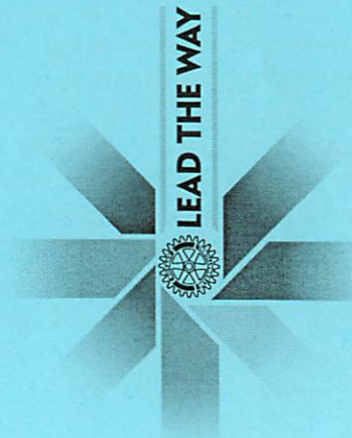

Dr. Tammy Horn was born in Harlan County, KY, in 1968. She moved to the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in 1976, returning to Kentucky in 1980. In addition to graduating from Berea College in 1990, she received a M.A. and Ph.D. from Alabama. None of these experiences or degrees prepared her for the experience of bee-keeping! While finishing her dissertation, she assisted her grandfather with his bees one summer and became fascinated with both bees and beekeepers. Bees in America: How the Honey Bee Shaped a Nation (2005) is the result. Tammy is currently working on a second book about bees: Piping Up: A History of Women and Bees, while serving as the NEH Appalachian Scholar at Berea College. Her primary research will be examining the effects of mountain top removal on honey bees.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Stephen Wrinn, director of the University Press of Kentucky. Originally named the University of Kentucky Press, it was founded by Dr. Tom Clark in 1943 and was reorganized in 1964 as the University Press of Kentucky. The University Press publishes 50-60 new titles each year out of some 2500 submissions. The Press specializes in books about Southern History and Appalachian Studies. It generates about \$2 million a year in net sales. However, the goal of the University Press is to publish scholarship without regard to sales. Manuscripts are sent to three peer readers who make recommendations and then there is a review process and approval by an editorial board.

Rotarian Richard Taylor is a member of the editorial board and he represents KSU. There are some \$30,000-\$50,000 overhead expenses to publish a book. The Press often publishes books that no one else will publish, and the books receive about a 15% subsidy from UK. The University Press is the only university press in the state and the future impact of these works transcends book sales. The books represent excellent research for future generations. In fact, this past year broke a new sales record. His friendship with Dr. Clark has meant the most with regard to his work with the Press. Dr. Clark instilled in him a love for Kentucky, and Wrinn wants to demolish the stereotypes of the region. The University Press is important for the image of the state to let people know that this is an intellectual center. Unfortunately, bookstores can return books for full refunds since the books on the shelves are on consignment. The University Press stands at the crossroads of commerce and ideas and once again the value of the Press transcends sales. The University Press is an intellectual outlet for all of Kentucky and Kentucky has the most vibrant writing community in the nation. The best seller for all time was the Kentucky Encyclopedia.

**President Boyd encourages
Rotarians to Lead the Way**

New RI President William B. Boyd is encouraging Rotarians to *Lead the Way* in the 2006-07 Rotary year, calling his choice for the RI theme "an affirmation of my belief in the power of Rotarians to change the world, one positive act at a time."

Boyd, who is a member of the Rotary Club of Pakuranga, Auckland, New Zealand, stresses sustainability in Rotary projects. "As Rotarians, we understand the truth of the old saying that when you give a person a fish, you feed him for a day; when you teach him to fish, you feed him for a lifetime," he told incoming district governors at the International Assembly in February.

Boyd has selected water as his first emphasis. "Without clean water, little else is possible. If you are thirsty, nothing else matters," he says.

Citing high childhood mortality rates caused by illness and malnutrition, Boyd has chosen health and hunger as his second emphasis. "Without food, there is no health," he says. "And without health, there is no hope."

His third emphasis, literacy, is fitting for Boyd, who used to work in his family's bookstore. He sees literacy as "the escape hatch from the cycle of poverty" and a natural complement to his emphases on water and health and hunger. "Literacy enables communities to take care of their water resources, address their own health and hunger issues, and teach the next generation," he says.

Given Rotary's need to think about the future, Boyd is also emphasizing the family of Rotary, which he says includes Rotaractors, Interactors, Rotary Youth Exchange students, Inner Wheel club members, Rotary Foundation alumni, and Rotarians' families.

"We are the ones who must Lead the Way," Boyd told 2006-07 district governors at the International Assembly.

This Week's Speaker...

Dr. Tammy Horn, author of "Bees in America" and the NEH Appalachian Scholar at Berea College, discussed the importance of bees to our well-being. Bees are at the heart of our food supply, pollinating many of the plant foods we eat and crops for animals. The Frankfort area is fortunate to be able to be self-sufficient for food and water if we have to be. Mountaintop removal, which is occurring in her own backyard in Eastern Kentucky, has long-term consequences for the environment and is detrimental to bees. For example, it is destroying the terrain that supports the sourwood tree, a plant unique to KY that contributes to the economic value of KY honey. Dr. Horn urged us and policymakers to seriously consider alternative sources of energy to coal. At present, only one percent of our state is using alternative energy. In response to questions, Dr. Horn said that there is a belief, but no medical evidence, that consumption of honey produced from local pollens provides health benefits in dealing with allergies. There is a slight risk of infant botulism in children under one year old who eat honey. African bees are migrating north at a slower rate than originally expected. While they are a threat to people, it is possible to work with them. They are hardier than domestic honeybees. Rotary is presenting "Bees in America" to the WHHS Library in honor of Dr. Horn's visit.

GSE Report

Group Study Exchange (GSE) team member Tanya Monsanto described her experience as a member of the KY team that visited France during June. The team was based in an agricultural region in south central France. Tanya's vocational interest in being part of the GSE team was learning more about the French political/governmental system. Through LRC and the National Conference of State Legislatures, Tanya assists

with parliamentary staff development in countries with governmental systems based on the French model, including Algeria and Lebanon. She described the French political system as complex and multi-layered, but with power very centralized. Tanya noted that GSE is very much a goodwill tour as well as a vocational and cultural exchange program.

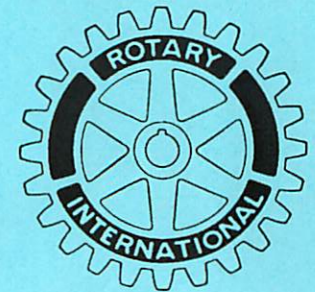

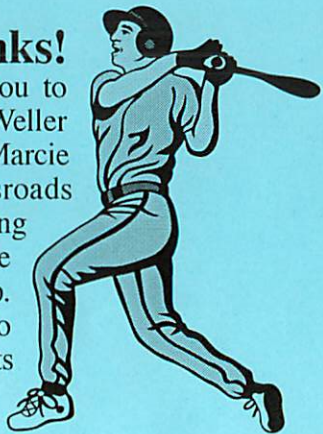
Is this ever gonna start?

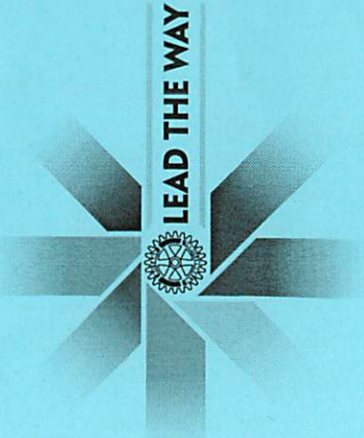
