This Week's Speaker...

Frankfort native and Kentucky Supreme Court Justice John Roach, who is seeking election to the Court in November, discussed the judicial process and his views on the role of appellate judges. There are seven singlemember Supreme Court districts in KY. There has been turnover in the Court's membership. When Governor Fletcher appointed Justice Roach to the Court in 2005 at the age of 38, he was last in seniority. Today, he is fifth in seniority. If elected to the bench, he will be who receive a sentence of 20 or more years, or death, have an automatic right of appeal to the state's highest court. These are "matter of right" cases. The rest are civil or criminal "discretionary review" cases, where an unsuccessful litigant at the Court of Appeals level petitions for the Supreme Court's review. The bulk of discretionary review cases are civil ones. Regarding the volume of work, Justice Roach said that in 2005, the Court issued 300 full-blown opinions. It has recently shortened the time between the filing of an appeal and rendering a decision, a process that historically could take over a year. In describing the role of justices, Justice Roach presented a case involving motor vehicle sales and liability, asking the audience to guess the outcome, based on the facts presented and the test of the KY statute. The 4-3 decision, in which he joined the majority opinion, centered on whether one views the role of a judge to be interpreting the law or making it. He feels that it is appropriate for judges to focus on the text of statutes, which also promotes consistency and certainty in the law. It also promotes judicial accountability and allows for debate about judicial decisions. The members of the three different branches of government should not encroach on the others' powers as a matter of constitutional law and democratic government. Judges do make mistakes. Supreme Court Justices aren't perfect; but, to quote a circuit judge, they are just last, having the final say in deciding a case. Judges need to be responsive to constructive criticism, he said. The job calls for judicial restraint, which he termed humility in action. In response to a question about the 4-3 split in the case he'd described, Justice Roach says that many civil cases before the Court have been decided on 4-3 votes recently. 

# Next Week's Program...

Phillip J. Shepherd brings a solid record of achievement and commitment to justice to his



campaign for the Franklin Circuit Court Division I. He is seeking to succeed retiring Judge Roger L. Crittenden.

Shepherd, a Frankfort attorney and former Secretary of the Kentucky Natural Resources and Environmental Protection

Cabinet, believes that the Franklin Circuit Court is crucial to our community and to the entire state.

Shepherd served as the chief environmental officer for the state from 1991 to 1995. In that capacity he supervised Kentucky's enforcement of the Clean Water Act, the Clean Air Act, the state and federal Superfund programs, solid and hazardous waste laws, the state and federal surface mining laws, as well as the state's soil conservation, forestry, and energy conservation programs.

Appointed by the President of the United States, Shepherd served as a federal

Commissioner on the Ohio River Sanitation Commission, an interstate environmental agency charged with improving water quality in the Ohio River watershed. He held that position from 1994 to 2001.

For more than 20 years Shepherd has litigated environmental cases in state and federal courts. He was a founding member of the Environmental Council of the States (ECOS), an organization of chief environmental officers from across the United States, and continues to serve as an alumni member of that organization.

Shepherd is a graduate of Asbury College (B.A., history, 1977) and the University of Kentucky College of Law (J.D., 1980). At the UK law school, he was selected for the staff of the Kentucky Law Journal, and Moot Court Board. He served as Law Clerk to U.S. District Judge Edward H. Johnstone (W.D. Ky.) from 1980 to 1982.

He was a member of the Judicial Nominating Commission for the 48th Judicial District of the Commonwealth of Kentucky from 1989 to 1991, and is a Life Member of the Judicial Conference of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit.

Shepherd served as the Chair of the Board of Trustees of the Kentucky Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church from 1999-2005. As Chancellor of the Church's Kentucky Annual Conference, he also serves as legal advisor to the Bishop of the Louisville Area of the United Methodist Church.

Shepherd is a member of the Prichard Committee for Academic Excellence, and serves on the board of the Kentucky Natural Lands Trust, and The Kings Center. He and his wife Audrey, a certified public accountant, have two married children and two grandchildren, and they make their home in Frankfort.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was former County Attorney Jim Boyd, who is a candidate for Franklin County Circuit Court Judge. He spoke about the Rotary Four-Way Test, which asks whether it is fair and whether it is beneficial to all concerned, principles which he applies in his work and will do so as a judge. In his job, he tried to make sure that both parties left with pride, dignity, and self-respect. He listed some of his accomplishments as County Attorney which included door-to-door garbage pick-up and the Lakeview Park development, in which Rotary played a pivotal role. He also gained vast experience working for the Department of Natural Resources and in private practice. He briefly outlined some of what circuit judges do, such as civil litigation, criminal cases and the issuance of injunctions and writs of prohibition. He also prosecuted felony child-support cases up through the Circuit Court. Concerning

his judicial philosophy, he believes in judicial restraint and is a strict constructionist. He stated that campaigning has been a humbling experience for him, as many people have told him how much they appreciated his job as County Attorney. He ended his speech with a plea for a Drug Court to be funded in Franklin County.







This Week's Speaker...

Fellow Frankfort Rotarian and candidate for Franklin Circuit Court Judge Phillip J. Shepherd was our speaker for the day. Phillip stressed the importance of the judicial system and, specifically, Franklin Circuit Court to both local citizens and the state as a whole. It's important for voters to be informed about judicial races. That's more difficult because the rules governing judicial races prohibit candidates from making campaign pledges about how they will rule on a case. The rule is a good one, because judges need to weigh the facts and the applicable laws on a case-by-case basis. Phillip described Franklin Circuit Court as the most important one in the state because it has the obligation to decide the constitutionality of statutes and state government disputes as well as standard civil and criminal cases. He said he

judges Bill Graham and Roger Crittenden, who have brought not only strong intellectual skills, but also compassion and a strong sense of right and wrong to their judgeships. That legacy goes back to 1960, when the workload of the Franklin Circuit Court coming out of state government had become so great that Franklin County became a separate circuit. In 1974, it became apparent that a second circuit judge was needed in Franklin County, hence the two divisions that currently exist. Phillip gave two examples of the importance of Franklin Circuit Court in two cases he litigated as a young lawyer who "tilted at a few windmills" after he first entered practice. One involved the constitutionality of a law exempting unmined coal from taxation, which depressed the revenue for schools in eastern Kentucky. Based on the Constitution's mandate that all property be taxed at fair cash value, Judge Graham ruled the exemption unconstitutional and was upheld by the Supreme Court. A second case illustrates how, when the courts have the backbone to stand up for enforcement of laws, the various elements of state government can ultimately work together for the common good. A permit was issued for a very large landfill, which would accept waste from out of state. The permit, to one of the Governor's largest campaign contributors, did not impose all the requirements of the law. A merit employee testified that the permit had been "rammed down his throat." Judge Corns reversed its issuance. the parties negotiated a scaled-back landfill that's still operating successfully today, and Governor Wilkinson responded by calling a special session that enacted a strong solid waste disposal law. In response to a question, Phillip said that drugs and crime are two related big issues he anticipates. He agrees that the county needs a drug court. The Club is giving Wendell Berry's "Three Short Novels" to the library of the Kings Daughters Apts. in Phillip's honor.

This Week's Speaker...

District Governor Kay Sharon of Elizabethtown was our speaker for the day. After presenting the Paul Harris Fellow award to Christina Harrison, DG Kay discussed the Strategic Plan and goals for Rotary District 6710. Key themes of her presentation were membership, the importance of the local clubs, and The Rotary Foundation. Rotary doesn't just seek members. it seeks Rotarians: those who internalize the spirit of Rotary. We need to educate new members about Rotary, which will increase their commitment to the organization. We also need to continue educating ourselves. DG Kay said that everything that happens in Rotary happens at the club level. We can do even bigger and better things by working with other clubs. Rotary needs to grow and improve by thinking

differently. The District is in the process of getting its strategic plan ready to implement. One of the key parameters of the plan is that nothing done at the district level will usurp the authority of the local clubs. Two aims are to serve the local clubs better and to improve the transition between district governors. DG Kay also discussed the 2006-07 District Goals. which will be posted on the Frankfort club's website. The District is working on a District Leadership Academy, which will be an educational tool, open to all interested Rotarians. It will involve one or two meetings at most and may be completed on-line. She asked the club to continue its support of the Multi-District President-Elect Training Seminar, which will be held again in March 2007. Other district opportunities for all Rotarians include the District Assembly on Nov. 18 in Bowling Green to discuss the Strategic Plan, and the May 18-20 District Conference also in Bowling Green. She reviewed RI President Bill Boyd's challenge ("Lead the Way to a Better World") and focus: literacy, water, health and hunger. and the family of Rotary. The club is presenting Paul M. Zall's book "Franklin on Franklin" to the Frankfort High School Library.

\* Listened to report from membership committee by Steve Dooley. He stated his committee is trying to get members more involved in proposing new members.


\* Listened to Community Service report from Nancy Edwards. She appointed Kelli Sorg to Chair this years King Center Project.
