John D. Stempel is Senior Professor at the University of Kentucky's Patterson School of Diplomacy and International Commerce. He was director of the school from 1993-2003. He served as Associate Director 1988-1993, coming to U.K. following a 24-year career in the U.S. Foreign Service. He consults on cross-cultural negotiation and homeland security issues. Focusing on political and economic affairs, he had overseas assignments in Africa (Guinea, Burundi, Zambia), Iran, and India, concluding with three years as U.S. Consul General in Madras, where he quadrupled U.S. commercial collaboration with South India. His Middle East service (1975-79) in Tehran provided much of the material for his book, "Inside the Iranian Revolution." His Washington assignments featured duty for both the State and Defense Departments, including a two-year tour as Director of the State Department's Crisis Center. Teaching stints at George Washington and American Universities, plus two years as "Diplomat in Residence" at the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis. Member of the New York Council on Foreign Relations, also U.S. Dept. of Commerce District Export Council for Kentucky. Appears in Who's Who in the World and Who's Who in America. AB Princeton, MA and PhD, University of California at Berkeley. Married to the former Susan Hodgetts of Lexington -- three daughters, Amy, Alix and Jill. Member of Lexington's Christ Church Cathedral (Episcopal)

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was International Service Director Joyce Honaker, who spoke about the activities of the Frankfort Rotary Club in the International Service area. First, the UNICEF project raised enough money to purchase 550 doses of the polio vaccine. Second, our Sister Cities partnership with the Dominican Republic will expand the potable water project. Bill Miller is en route to our Sister City. Third, Marcie Jeffreys gave us an update on the

February 22 annual International Dinner at the country club, which will begin with a silent auction to raise money for international projects. The speaker will be the head of the Heifer Project, which helps people around the world to become self-sufficient. Fourth, Terry Magel will again be heading up the World View Conference sponsored by the UK Patterson School for International Diplomacy. Also a Rotary Youth Exchange is scheduled for 2007-2008. Fifth, Chris Richards is in charge of the Group Study Exchange, which will bring six team members from Germany over the Derby Day weekend. Host families are needed. The Sunrise Club is helping out with this effort. Sixth, Dean Sorg spoke about the Ambassadorial Scholarship, which makes \$23,000 available to each of three students for nine months of international study. This is a "people-to-people" exchange, open to persons with two years of college who are interested in studying overseas. March 7 is the deadline and 100% of your donation goes to the program. The scholarship covers transportation, books and room and board, and the student is adopted by the Rotarians in the host community. Finally, our Club is contributing to the Rotary Foundation, which furthers many worthwhile Rotary projects. Joyce then showed a video concerning the partnership Rotary has had with the United Nations since its inception in 1945. On November 4, 2006 she attended Rotary Day at the UN, which the Frankfort club was instrumental in starting. The focus was on the development goals for the 21st century. Those goals include literacy and combating diseases. An example of the former is a Colorado Rotary club starting a school in South America and the Safe Blood program in Africa. The next Rotary Day at the UN program is set for November 3, 2007 and Frankfort Rotarians are encouraged to attend.





This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was John D. Stempel, Senior Professor at the University of Kentucky Patterson School of Diplomacy and International Commerce, who spoke about the state of the world and how things are going generally in the Middle East and elsewhere. He stated that we are in for major problems in Iraq whether we stay or leave. What we are seeing in the world today is a rapid decentralization of power with America becoming less relevant. First, as to energy, we will continue to be faced with growing demands, with the price of fuel going upward. On the international scene, we must be focused on diplomacy while domestically focusing on finding another way with alternative sources. The Internet is becoming an increasingly powerful tool with small groups with different goals driving policy. By our obsession with Iraq, we have slighted other important areas like Latin America. The free market economies developed there in the nine-

and France will soon have new leadership, which will make these and other countries more difficult to deal with. Except for North Korea, we have not focused adequately on Asia and Southeast Asia. For example, China is building a blue water (worldwide) navy that will challenge America's interests in many parts of the world. On the positive side, it looks like there may be a breakthrough with North Korea's nuclear development, but this did not work over a decade ago. Focusing on the Middle East, to create a stable democracy there we must maintain a federalized Iraq and resolve the sectarian violence. Unfortunately, he believes that Iraq is Vietnam all over again where a Vietnam-like withdrawal could create disastrous consequences for the region and the world. One nightmare scenario would be that the Iraqis flip and take thousands of American soldiers hostage. Although, the president is holding the course for now, he is being challenged by Congress. Attacking Iran is not a viable option, although there are those in the administration that seem to be advocating this. It is a mistake to isolate our enemies and the potential for a clash needs to be defused. For example, America should investigate reopening an embassy in Tehran. America is popular among most Iranian citizens and we do not want to jeopardize that. As to Afghanistan, the violence is increasing with the Taliban taking more control in the eastern part of the country. Finally, Dr. Stempel addressed the Palestinian/Israeli conflict. The peace process has been set back here with the recent civil war which was worse than the election of Hamas to the government. Iran and Syria have been introducing weapons into the region. There are opportunities for the United States here as well as dangers and America must not remain on the sidelines in this conflict. Ethiopia saved us from a terrorist takeover of Somalia but Darfur has been neglected. On the positive side, Rumsfield and Bolton are gone but there

is a need for a suitable strategy for Iraq, Iran, and Afghanistan. For solutions, Dr. Stempel called for a gradual reduction of American forces in Iraq. As to terrorism, the vast majority of the Muslim world wants peace, but we need a strategy to deal with the radicals. In honor of Dr. Stempel's talk, a book entitled "Hidden Iran" was donated to the Kentucky State University library.


- * Listened to Community Service report from Nancy Edwards. She noted there were 22 scholarship applications this year to be voted on for the FRYFI Scholarships.


