Sara Elliott, Executive Director Liberty Hall Historic Site

A native of Somerset, KY, Sara has a B.A. in American History from the University of Kentucky and a M.A. in Folklore from Western Kentucky University. After graduate school Sara went to work for Kentucky State Parks where she was the manager of Waveland State Historic Site for 13 years. She has been the Executive Director at Liberty Hall Historic Site since 1999. She is a past president of the Kentucky Association of Museums and has held office in or been active in many state, regional and national museum organizations.

Home to two U.S. Senators, one Vice-Presidential candidate, one Governor of Missouri, one Commissioner of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, one Ambassador to France, one U.S. District Attorney, three U.S. Army colonels, two doctors, one newspaper editor, and the ancestral home of one of the most beloved children's authors, Margaret Wise Brown

Located in historic downtown Frankfort on the banks of the Kentucky River, Liberty Hall Historic Site was the home of one of Kentucky's most interesting families. The site

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Sara Elliott, Executive director of Liberty Hall. She spoke a little about its history and the restoration work now underway. This year marks the 250th birthday of its builder, John Brown, who was the first United States Senator from Kentucky. He served in that position for 12 years and then returned to Frankfort where he became involved in local politics and community service. He started the Frankfort Water Company and engaged Gideon Shryock to design the Old Capitol and the Orlando Brown House. His wife was very education minded, and the Sunday School class she started is now the First Presbyterian Church. She also advocated educating the slaves - teaching Mason and Orlando. Mason was very serious, but Orlando was a very fun-loving man who eventually became a lawyer and was editor of the Frankfort Commonwealth. He also was active in community affairs, and started the Frankfort Cemetery. Two Victorian type ladies, Mary and Annie, were the last of the Browns to live in the Orlando Brown House. The Browns owned some 3½ acres by the river, including the garden and grounds. The restoration work now under way includes window restoration. All the replacement wood must be old-growth wood. The glass is to be replaced by old plate glass. The names of the Brown family are etched in the glass in the Orlando Brown House. The process involves removing the windows and replacing with plywood and insulation. The plate glass is labeled so that it will be known exactly where they are to go back in once restored. The restoration also involves repairing the plaster and tuck pointing the bricks. The chimney will be rebuilt in Orlando Brown. Conservation work will also be done, for example on the water colors. The paintings will all be reframed. A paint analysis will be done, including possible faux. There will be restoration of graining and interior art nouveau. Carpets and wallpaper samples are being considered, depending on the time period. The Browns originally used bright colors because in the absence of artificial light, colors were needed to reflect light. Rotarians were urged to become a Friend of Liberty Hall where, as a member, they can be a "Time Traveler" which entitles them to discounts in participating museums elsewhere. Thank you Sara for bringing us such an interesting program on the restoration work now being done at Liberty Hall.



Next Week's Program...

Ron Crouch is Director of the Kentucky State Data Center located at the University of Louisville. The Kentucky State Data Center (KSDC) is the official clearinghouse for Census data for the Commonwealth of Kentucky. KSDC provides data on population, housing, education, employment and other social indicators. Historical data, current data and projections are provided to help understand trends and issues facing individual states and the country as a whole.

Each state, as well as the entirety of the United States, is undergoing major demographic and economic revolutions. The populations are aging. The economy is moving from a manufacturing base to a knowledge base. Populations are growing more ethnically diverse and there are major differences in census data across regions.

Mr. Crouch's background is in data analysis and information development with an emphasis in enhancing data understanding and usability. He characterizes his vocation as "knowledge dissemination." Mr. Crouch provides approximately 150 presentations each year in Kentucky and across the nation.

Mr. Crouch is a graduate of the University of Louisville with a major in Sociology and minors in Political Science and Economics. He also holds MA in Sociology and MS in Social Work from the University of Louisville, as well as an MBAS from Bellarmine University. Mr. Crouch has also done doctoral work at the University of Kentucky.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Charlee Doom, National Collegiate Agricultural Ambassador and Kentucky Derby Festival Princess. She spoke about agriculture and its impact on the global economy. She asked first of all the question as to what is agriculture. Of course, it is first and foremost food but also includes clothing, forestry and timber. It also includes biotechnology, which is a new force in agriculture. For example, Monsanto is a leader in the area of genetics. Also, through the production of ethanol, it is hoped we will someday be energy independent. Agriculture is multifaceted with 24 million workers in this country with 938.8 million acres producing 2 trillion pounds of food. The average farm in Kentucky has 144 acres and there are some 89,000 farms in the state. Through tradition, innovation, biotechnology and globalization, she is passionate about helping the American farm economy to create opportunities for struggling farmers in the developing world. The U.S exports \$68.7 billion in agricultural products but imports \$64 billion. We need new markets through the U.S. Grains Council, Market Access Program and the Kentucky Proud Program. She spoke about her efforts in Morocco to help improve farming there and in improving feedlots in particular. There is a need for us to get involved with helping Africa, where hunger is the number one killer of children. She spoke about the Once Acre Fund, which empowers local farmer groups and provides farm education, makes capital available and connects farmers with output markets. It is all about globalization. In honor of Charlee's talk, the book "Earth From Above for Young Readers" was donated to the Kings Center.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Ron Crouch, Director of the Kentucky State Data Center. He spoke about how the population is growing in the southern hemisphere but declining in the northern hemisphere. In Afghanistan, 45% of the population is under 15 while in Iraq, 29% is under 15. The most growth has been in the undeveloped countries. Kentucky is far from being "barefoot and pregnant" with an average of only 1.95 kids per family, and Kentucky is among those states which is below the replacement rate of 2.1 children per family to maintain the population. Without immigration, the United States would be in a population decline like Europe. The major growth in this country is in longevity and not in fertility. There is a major transition going on because we are healthier and living longer. There are no more kids today than 100 years ago. Due to its "one child" policy, China will soon have the oldest population in the world, which will challenge it as an economic power. The population boom in the world has only been since about 1800. Far from government being a bad thing, successful societies have efficient and strong governments, and government provides the platform for a better society. America's diversity is good for the future of this country, with Asians growing in population due to immigration as fast as the Hispanic population. Only one in three households in the United States today have kids. The entire growth in young people today is in the South. Most growth today is in the 65-plus age bracket. As far as education is concerned, the best progress has been in the South in general and Kentucky in particular. In honor of Ron's talk, Clark's Kentucky Almanac was donated to Western Hills High School.


