This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Dr. Regina M. Raab, who specializes in sleep disorders. Specifically, she spoke about the problems associated with sleep apnea, which means "without breath". Persons who are particularly at risk are males, over 40 and who are overweight. Contrary to previous belief, the brain is very active during sleep. In the 1930s, research was done on the brain by developing the EEG where electrodes were placed on the scalp. In the 1950s persons were observed while sleeping overnight and the rapid eye movement (REM) was observed. It was determined that there is REM sleep (dreaming time) and

non-REM sleep (non-dreaming). It was also determined that there are two types of sleep apnea: Central sleep, where the brain forgets to tell the abdomen to breathe; and obstructive sleep apnea where muscle tone diminishes when one goes to sleep. This is particularly true with overweight people and people with thick tongues. Snoring is produced as the airway becomes obstructed and the snoring comes from vibration of tissue at the base of the tongue. The problem particularly becomes acute when one is in the level of deep sleep. Carbon dioxide levels rise and the oxygen levels decrease. The brain gets its oxygen when one gasps for breath. Cessation of breathing causes stress on the brain and cardiac system and can lead to congestive heart failure. What is the solution to sleep apnea? While there are no medicines available, the C-PAP machine keeps the airways open and provides continuous airway pressure. There are no secondary side effects so the machine is entirely safe to use. The body is paralyzed during REM sleep and there is a great deal of relaxation to the muscles. The brain must have REM sleep and will get it one way or another: at night or during the day sometimes while one is driving a car unfortunately. Persons who suspect they may have this dangerous condition are advised to seek immediate treatment at the sleep clinic of the hospital.

There needs to be an emphasis on physical activity. On June 21, which is the longest day of the year, the Health Department is sponsoring the "Longest Day of Play" in which we ask the question, "Can Franklin County come out and play?" The event will be held at Lakeview Park for persons of all ages to inform them of the need for physical activity and to get people active. Obesity, cardiovascular disease, and sedentary life styles are at epidemic proportions in this state and unfortunately our diet includes poor

eating habits and too many people use tobacco. Losing just 10% pf our body weight can result in a decrease of 20% in the mortality rate. Partners will provide physical activity opportunities at booths and there will be Passport Pickup stations with maps that outline opportunities for physical activities. This concept is based on a similar program developed by the Ashland and Boyd County Health Department. In preparation for this exciting event, the department is asking for commitments from businesses to provide prize donations. The program will also consist of a mentoring program for new runners, where participants will be trained for three months for a September 28 race. In addition, tennis will be promoted and Canoe Kentucky will be there. Fun is mandatory at this event and all Rotarians are encouraged to come to Lakeview Park and participate. Rosie informed us that several Louisville Rotary clubs are challenging each other to participate in similar programs to encourage healthy lifestyles through physical activity. In honor or Rosie's talk, the book "The Human Body" was donated to Frankfort High School.





Today's Speaker...

First Sergeant John Kibler, KY Army National Guard described his experiences as a member of the 133d Mobile Public Affairs Detachment in Iraq and Bosnia. He said that a "public affairs detachment" is a roving TV studio, newspaper, and general media unit that covers the soldiers' stories in the field. He said that the regular media rarely come out of Baghdad's "Green Zone," so the war footage we view on the broadcast media is often produced by detachments like his. He showed a series of slides of soldiers and civilians in Iraq. Sgt. Kibler said that, in his experience, the

KvNG is equipped with the proper equipment, e.g. body armor and fully armored vehicles, that it can logically need. In response to questions from Rotarians, Sgt. Kibler said that every KyNG unit, except the band, has been in Iraq. Much-discussed Dragon Skin Armor has very recently been disapproved by the military for the Iraq theater. The KyNG retains its personnel and equipment strength in KY for emergencies and natural disasters. None of our Guard's heavy equipment has gone overseas, and the Guard retains the personnel stateside with skills needed for local emergencies. The US military has long been working to support health care facilities and schools in Iraq. It's not heavily publicized, because publicity leads to insurgent attacks on the aided facilities. He said that, unlike Bosnia, the Iraqi insurgents have not figured out that US troops will leave if they "play nice." Regarding a question about rules of engagement, Sgt. Kibler said details are classified, but soldiers are instructed that a person treated badly becomes an enemy. On the recent PEW report that a small percentage of younger US-resident Muslims see bombings of civilians as justified, Sgt. Kibler noted that public affairs officers don't voice their opinions. He said, however, that US terrorism crosses racial and religious groups, and that WWII internment of Japanese and German citizens of the US warrants caution in reacting to such reports. Regarding the Iraqi Parliaments recesses, he said that cultural differences must be recognized in US and foreign governance and military operations. The book, From Bagdad with Love, will be presented to the WHHS Library in Sgt. Kibler's honor.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Chip Peal, CEO of the Frankfort Regional Medical Center. He gave the Club a statistical overview of the hospital and the myriad ways it serves this community. Although the facility is authorized for 173 beds, only about 100 are occupied at any given time. There are some 600 employees and over 200 physicians working at the hospital. Last year, there were over 46,000 admissions and 30,000 treatments at the emergency room. The Frankfort facility belongs to HCA, the largest health care provider in the nation second only to the Veterans' Administration. Nationwide, HCA has 1.65 million admissions and has over 190,000 employees and 94 surgery centers. HCA is in 22 states, England and Switzerland. The goal of the hospital is to be the very best health care provider it can be. The hospital takes a "patient first" approach and has a high commitment to patient safety and quality care. The goal is to have the right medicine, right patient, right dose and the right time route of admission. The Frankfort hospital uses a bar code on a wristband that gives all identifying information. Unfortunately, only 8% of hospitals presently utilize the bar codes. The hospital also employs what is known as "magnet recognition" for which nurses strive to attain. This high degree of nursing care makes for a low turnover rate. The less training the hospital has to perform, the fewer the mistakes. Chip also spoke about several examples of community involvement on the part of the hospital. The hospital participates in many community volunteer activities and the taxes paid by the hospital (not to mention the payroll!) all contribute to the community. Uninsured patients are very costly to the hospital. In 2006, some \$14 million was written off as bad debts and charitable expenses. As far as facility investment is concerned, this is a capital-intensive facility. 99% of all net profits are reinvested in capital of the hospital. Virtually all money made is plowed back into the facility. Concerning the medical office building now under construction, this will provide physicians with the ability to offer out-patient services so that the patient does not need to be transferred to Lexington or Louisville. In summary, this is a good hospital with a good staff of people. In honor of Chip's talk, the book "Your Best Life Now" by Joel Olsteen was donated to the Paul Sawyier Public Library.
