COLONEL (RET.) LARRY L. ARNETT Kentucky Writers – A Heritage Of Literary Excellence

Colonel Arnett received a commission as an infantry officer in 1969 and served on active duty in the U.S. Army until 1973. His assignments during this period included platoon leader, company commander, and helicopter pilot. Assigned to the 23rd infantry division in Vietnam in 1970, his distinguished service included roles as an aircraft commander, flight leader, air-mission commander and instructor pilot.

In 1973, he joined the Kentucky army national guard where he became one of the youngest officers to ever command at battalion and brigade level. During the 1991 Persian Gulf War, over 500 troops assigned to his command were successfully mobilized and performed exceptional service in Iraq.

Highly decorated, his awards include the Bronze Star, Meritorious Service medal w/oak leaf cluster, air medal w/ 33 awards, army commendation medal w/oak leaf cluster and numerous other decorations. Colonel Arnett was selected in 1997 as the outstanding alumnus for the Department of Military Science at Eastern Kentucky University.

He retired from a distinguished 27-year public service career with Kentucky state government in 2000 where his assignments included serving as the state director of veterans affairs, state director of air transportation, and executive director of the office of Kentucky veteran centers. In this latter role he directed the construction and operation of the Thomson-Hood veterans center, a 300-bed long-term care facility serving our state's elderly veterans, and the initial construction of two additional 120-bed nursing homes in eastern and western Kentucky.

Colonel Arnett earned a BS from Eastern Kentucky University in 1969 and a Master of Public Affairs from KSU in 1979.

He is married to Mary Arnett, a retired teacher and they have two children: Jeff, a captain in the Kentucky army national guard who recently returned from an active duty tour in Afghanistan; and Heather, who completed a Ph.D. At the University of North Carolina and works as a research scientist in Seattle.



This Week's Speaker...

Today's speaker was Rotarian Richard Taylor, professor of English at KSU, co-owner of Poor Richard's Books, and former Kentucky poet laureate. Richard provided insight into Kentucky during the Civil War years, the setting of his recently published novel Sue Mundy. "Sue Mundy" was the nom de guerre of Marcellus Jerome Clarke, who joined the Confederate army on his 16th birthday, was imprisoned in Indiana, and escaped to serve with John Hunt Morgan. Following Morgan's death in 1864. Clarke returned to KY and became a guerrilla fighter against the Union army. 1864-65 was a time of great civil unrest in Kentucky. Although about two-thirds of KY's soldiers joined the Union, the harsh regime of Union military commander Stephen Gano Burbridge led to loss of regard for the Union in KY, and to post-war support for Democrats and former Confederates in elections. Burbridge's most notorious order as military commander of KY was Order 59. It stated that four guerrillas would be executed for every one Union soldier killed by guerrillas. When the "supply" of guerrillas proved inadequate, regular Confederate prisoners of war were substituted. Richard said that perhaps the most shameful execution was the singling out of four prisoners of war in Lexington for a shooting in Peaks Mill. The four, including a frail 70-year-old man, were selected by lot, shackled, transported to Frankfort, forced to dig their own graves, and shot by a firing squad. Burbridge was so roundly condemned that he had to leave the state. During discussion, Jim Richardson noted that the four executed Confederates, Long, Hunt, Horton and Rafferty, are now buried in Frankfort Cemetery. Richard said that the name "Sue Mundy" was given by the editor

of the Louisville Daily Journal. In response to the draconian Union policies, the editor created a woman guerrilla whom the Union could not capture. Clarke was eventually captured and, at the age of 19, hanged in Louisville before a large crowd. In honor of Richard's presentation, a copy of Sue Mundy, donated by Poor Richard's, will be presented to the KSU Library.
