Col. Steve Parker (Ret.)
Kentucky Department of Aviation



Col. Parker retired from the U.S. Air Force in 2000 with over 28 years of service to his country. He had combat experience in Vietnam, 1973 Arab-Israeli War, Grenada, Panama, Persian Gulf Conflict and Bosnia. He has over 10 years of experience working internationally with NATO,

the United Nations and embassies around the world. As a pilot, he has logged 5,000 flying hours in five Air Force aircraft, mostly the C-141 and also the KC-10 and C-21. Col. Parker's civilian education includes a BS in Political Science from Univ. of New Mexico; an MA in Human Relations from Pacific Lutheran Univ; and an MPA from Golden Gate Univ. This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Peg Harmon, Director of the Thorn Hill Learning Center. She stated that the school was founded by Lillian Nunnely in 1984, and that it serves about 2,000 persons each year. There is an after-school program for grades K-5 at 7:15 a.m. and adult education students come at 9:00. There are six-week classes for the students, and the students are tested beforehand to determine their level. There are three levels of proficiency. There is a four-hour practice test which the students must take before sitting for their eight-hour GED exam. The GED exam consists of math, science, literature, writing, and social studies. The GED exam is very difficult and one-third of high school seniors cannot pass it. The school even had an 81-year-old graduate! While most students come of their

own volition, other come because they are ordered to do so by the courts. Many quit for a time due to family situations but most come back. There was a 50% increase in graduates this year. GED is only one aspect of the center. There are also English language learners and family literacy. The jail also has an instructor. At 5 p.m. there are extended classes which go until 9 and include everything from computer classes to art classes. The school is also open on Saturday for those students who cannot come any other time. The Center has many needs, such as for volunteer tutors and children's volunteer tutor coordinators. The building is also in need of extensive renovation, which will cost up to \$300,000. The roof is in need of replacing. Peg then introduced a GED student, Shelly Morrow who gave her personal testimonial about getting her GED, having been out of school for some 36 years. The Thorn Hill Learning Center is truly a success story right here in Frankfort.

Successful UNICEF Drive

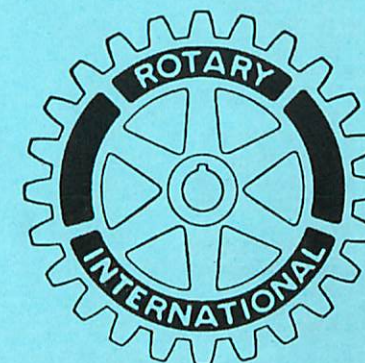
A total of \$494.28 was collected this year in our annual UNICEF drive, much of it in coins. Capital Day School was a major contributor.

John Nicholson

Executive Director, Kentucky Horse Park

A native of Winchester KY, John Nicholson has been Executive Director of the Kentucky Horse Park since June 1997. Prior to being appointed to this position, he was the Horse Park's Deputy Director. From 1994-96 he was Director of Sales for the launch of the international equestrian trade show, Equitana USA. He began his association with the Kentucky Horse Park from 1991-94 while serving as its Director of Operations. He is a former President of the Kentucky Horse Council and Chairman of the Kentucky Horse Fair. He served on the Board of Directors of the Horse Industry Alliance, a national marketing council for the equine industry. Currently, he serves as President of the World Games 2010 Foundation.

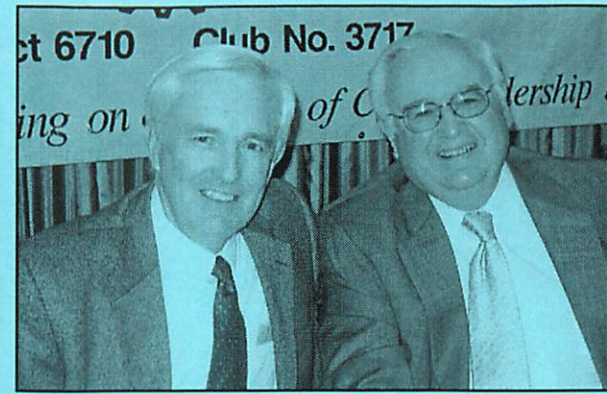

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Colonel Steve Parker with the Kentucky Department of Aviation. He stated that he has long been involved in veterans' affairs, and that the World War II vets are his heroes. He stated that aviation is one area in which he is an expert and that there are three types of airports: military, commercial, and general aviation. General aviation comprises 75% of the airports which includes private and corporate aircraft. There are over 100 private airports in Kentucky, and it is important for businesses to have access to an airport when they decide where to locate and whether to expand. There are over 5,000 general aviation airports in the U.S. and these are important for economic development, natural disasters, tourism and recreation. He is concerned with security and safety issues at these airports in these days. There are new airports opening in Whitley County on the Tennessee border, Hancock County and Morehead. It takes ten to twenty years to build a new airport and they cost about \$20 million – even more if there is a lot of elevation. The goal is to put every Kentuckian within thirty minutes of an airport and 80% already are that close. He also spoke about the "VLJ" or very light jet.

These are much less expensive than corporate jets, costing about \$1.3 million. Due to the low cost, more businesses can own jets which in turn improve the quality of life and allows the company to retain high-quality people. These new jets will change the face of aviation, and thousands are being built. The state now owns four aircraft with three of them belonging to state parks. Colonel Parker also spoke briefly about aviation education and praised Jackie Hensley and Tim Smith who is a teacher at Frankfort High and teaches math and science with aviation. Colonel Parker helped found the Kentucky Aviation Teacher Institute, which is a three-day training session for teachers in the field of aviation. In honor of Colonel Parker's talk, the book "An American Hero: Charles Lindberg" has been donated to the library at Western Hills High School.

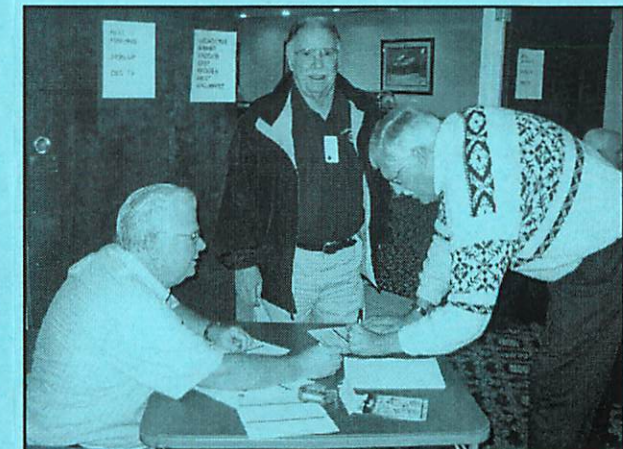

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was John Nicholson, Director of the Kentucky Horse Park. He spoke about his trip to Bahrain where he landed the World Equestrian Games for 2010. The 2006 games were held in Aachen, Germany and he showed a video highlighting some of the events there. The vote for Kentucky was unanimous and he attributes this success to the Kentucky Horse Park, which has paid dividends many times in excess of the investment. The Equestrian Games will be the largest sporting event in Kentucky. It will last for 16 days and 60 countries will be represented. It is projected that the economic impact will be over \$200 million to the state's economy and some \$6 million worth of tickets have been sold in advance to over 40,000 persons in a two-week test period. The closing date for the Games will be October 10, 2010. There will be many capital improvements made to the

Park in preparation for the Games, including a new stadium. There will be 8,000 permanent seats in the stadium with a template to grow over 35,000 if the legislature should approve this extra spending. John is also hoping for a system of internal transportation at the Park to be funded out of the Road Fund. The Horse Park has 1224 acres. Responding to questions from the floor, he stated that there will be 900-1000 horses at the event. The Park will have some 1900 stalls. He also stated that tickets can be purchased for the day or for the event and about 50,000 persons are expected for each day of the 16-day event.

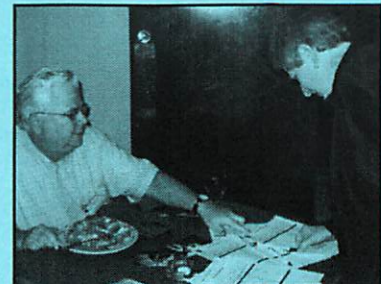

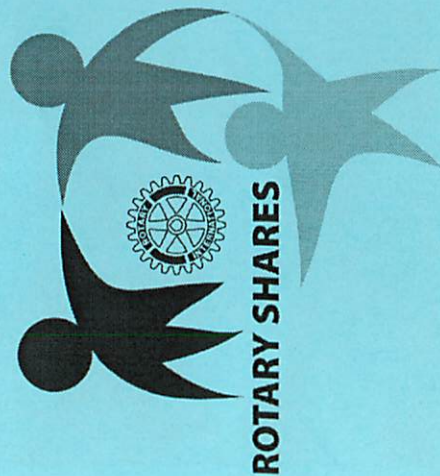

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Mary Pedersen, Chief Information Officer for the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security. She spoke about various initiatives and projects of her department in the areas of crime prevention and disaster response. The mission of her department is to provide information and data to help first responders and give them the tools and training to respond to crimes and disasters. Among those projects are community preparedness which involves voice and data operability. The goal, which has largely been accomplished, was to make sure first responders can communicate with each other on their radios which use different frequencies. Concerning data entry, the goal is to put computers in all police cars so that officers will have a secondary source of information to voice. This means an officer can issue citations in much shorter periods of time. This is also important in crash reports enabling the officer to even draw out the crash scene in minutes. Consequently, this does not tie up radio traffic through data trafficking between emergency vehicles. She also spoke about "E-Warrants" which will automate warrants across the state. This means that the criminal complaint can be created online and immediately made available to prosecutors and

then the judge who issues the warrant. Within seconds, the signed warrant can be made available to law enforcement officers all over the state. This also avoids duplicative warrants. This comprehensive electronic warrant system is to be implemented next year starting in Jefferson County, and within 12-18 months it should be available in all counties. In honor of Mary's talk, the book "Games of My Life: Stories of Wildcat Basketball" is being donated to the Frankfort Christian Academy.

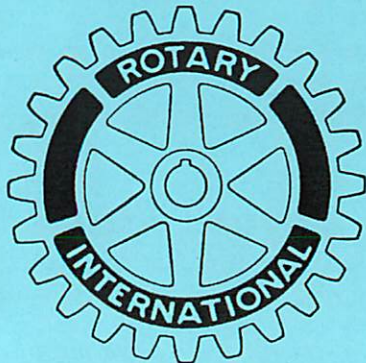
