**Dave Adkisson**, President and CEO of the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce returned to Kentucky in 2005 after spending six years as president of the Birmingham Regional Chamber of Commerce, Alabama.

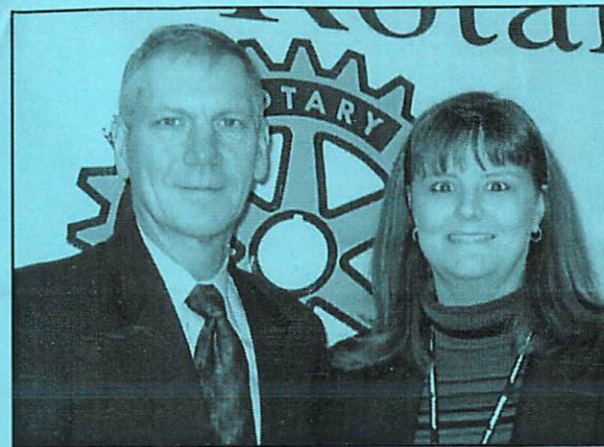
A 1971 graduate of Owensboro High School, Adkisson earned a bachelors degree from Georgetown College in 1973 and a master's degree in ethics from Harvard University in 1975. He began his career with the Owensboro Chamber of Commerce, Kentucky, first as project manager and then as the executive vice president. At age 34, Adkisson was elected mayor of Owensboro, and re-elected four years later. During his administration, he led the effort to revitalize Owensboro's downtown, created the River Park Center, recruited several industries to the MidAmerica Industrial Airpark, expanded the city's parks and bikeways and developed a new bridge linking Kentucky and Indiana across the Ohio River.

Adkisson has held several statewide leadership posts including chairman of the Kentucky Advocates for Higher Education, president of the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce Executives (KCCE), co-founder of Leadership Kentucky and chairman of the Kentucky Center for Public Issues. In 1999, Adkisson was named president of the Birmingham Chamber, where he worked with business and political leaders in the seven-county metropolitan area to develop consensus around an agenda for the region's growth. He greatly strengthened the chamber's public policy division and its lobbying presence in Montgomery and Washington, D.C. As a strong proponent of business growth, Adkisson is spending much of his time meeting with business and government leaders across the commonwealth. He has also spearheaded a new strategic agenda for the state of Kentucky, incorporating the best ideas from Kentuckians across the Commonwealth. Adkisson currently sits on the boards of the Kentucky World Trade Center, United Way of Kentucky and the American Chamber of Commerce Executives. He resides in Lexington with his wife Bonnie.

The speaker for the day was Jan Gould, president of the Kentucky Retailers Association. He represents retail businesses, pharmacies, restaurants, agri-business dealers and the propane gas industry. About 6,000 different locations across the state are represented. They represent these locations before the legislature and various state agencies. Also they provide information on laws and regulations that impact them. Finally, they can use the power of the marketplace to purchase services at a low cost. In 2005, retail sales were \$50 billion. 20% of employees are retail employees. There are many misconceptions about retail businesses being low wage with few benefits. Instead, these businesses employ many full-time career employees. Even at the store level there are opportunities to advance and make high income with great benefits.

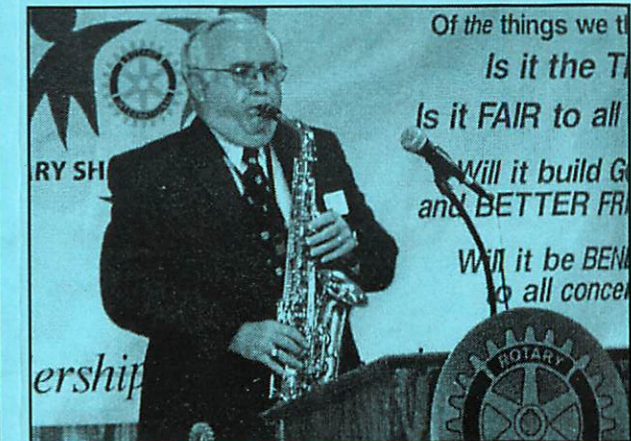

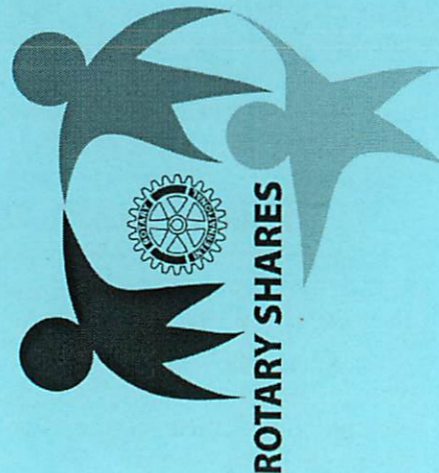

## This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Dave Adkisson, President and CEO with the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce. The Chamber serves many businesses from Paducah to Pikeville. His job is to keep Kentucky competitive as much as possible. He helps Kentucky to put the best foot forward and make Kentucky attractive to college graduates across the country. Sixty business leaders

sit on the Board. Small businesses are helped by the Chamber being their voice as well as for the large corporations. This year there is a political adjustment with a new administration as well as economic hardships with respect to the state budget. Eighty percent of the business audience is in favor of a cigarette tax increase, per a recent survey conducted by the Chamber. We also need to improve postsecondary education. Over half of Kentucky counties are below Mexico in educational attainment. We must keep momentum going in higher education. Health care is another priority. Family coverage is prohibitively expensive to both employees and employers. When employers buy it, information is needed on costs from health care providers. This "transparency bill" will be introduced in this session. A third area is workers' compensation. This issue needs to be addressed because we are no longer competitive due to medical costs getting out of hand. Fourth, there needs to be tax incentives when it comes to training workers. Finally, the public employee pension system is a matter of grave concern to the Chamber. Present levels of benefits will need to be curtailed.

**Marisa McLin** is the Women, Infants & Children (WIC) Coordinator for the Franklin County Health Department. Every Wednesday she conducts intensive nutritional counseling for cholesterol, obesity, and diabetes by appointment. As the WIC Coordinator Marisa is responsible for the WIC program in Franklin County. She will add and recertify participants to the program, and give nutritional counseling during visits when appropriate. She resolves any of the many random problems that come along and make sure that the program with the Health Department is doing everything correctly with in the scope of their work. Marisa audits the program monthly, implements changes when necessary, and trains all new nurses on the WIC program.

Marisa is originally from Somerset, KY and Southwestern Pulaski County High School. After Somerset Community College and the University of Kentucky, she began training to become a Registered Dietitian and completed her B.S degree in Dietetics. She enrolled into the didactic internship program at the University of Kentucky, where she had to complete three different rotations in different

aspects of the nutrition profession: community nutrition, clinical nutrition, and food service management. After completing this seven-month, 40-hour-per-week process, she graduated and passed the Registered Dietitian exam. In graduate school at UK, she recognized she was not interested in dietetic administration. The Eastern Kentucky University graduate program for community nutrition involved sports nutrition, maternal and child, and geriatric nutrition. She received her Masters degree from Eastern in 2005. That brought her to the Franklin County Health Department where she has been the WIC Coordinator for almost two years.

The speaker for the day was Jenny Stith, Corporate and Community Outreach Director of the Children's Hospital Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Kosair Children's Hospital. As part of her duties, she oversees all special events and fundraising projects for the Foundation. Caring for more than 100,000 children each year, the hospital is not-for-profit and never turns away any child, regardless of ability to pay. She stated that many children would not survive if they were not at the Kosair's Children's Hospital. It specializes in children's special medical needs throughout Kentucky and southern Indiana. Wal-Mart was particularly singled out for praise in that it donated to the construction of a new MRI. Kosair is a leader in treating children, and particularly specializes in treating pre-mature infants to enable them to go home sooner. At least 500 children from the Frankfort area alone were treated last year. She is attempting to reach persons in the local communities through programs such as this one to make people aware of the fine work the hospital does in the treating of children.

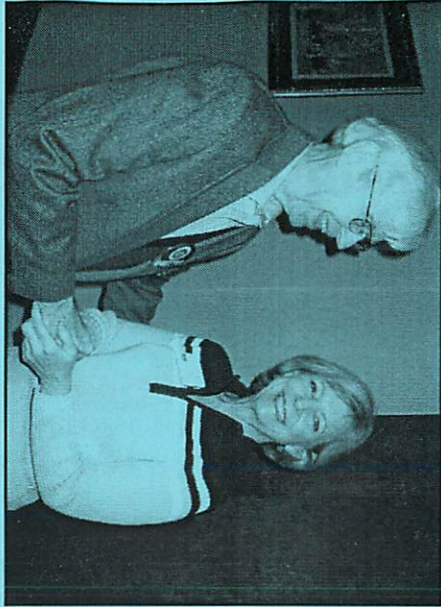

**This Week's Speaker...**

This week's speaker was Marisa McLin, WIC (Women, Infants, and Children) Coordinator for the Franklin County Health Department. She is also a registered dietitian and clinical nutritionist who conducts cholesterol, obesity, and diabetes counseling. WIC is a short-term intervention program for a high risk, low-income population. It serves pregnant women, postpartum women (for up to six months), breastfeeding women (for up to one year), infants, and children (to age five). The federal program is operated by the US Department of Agriculture. It provides benefits in the form of vouchers, which can be used at qualified vendors to purchase cheese, cereal, milk, eggs, beans, and peanut butter, plus some additional items for breastfeeding women. Franklin County WIC vendors are Capital Pharmacy, Kroger, Pic Pac, Wal-Mart, and Save A Lot. WIC also provides nutrition education and counseling, weighing, growth charts for children, and tests for anemia. The program began in 1974 and is among the most successful federal food programs. Ms. McLin said that WIC is very cost effective and has resulted in lower fetal and infant mortality, a decrease in low birth weights, more pregnancies coming to term, a reduction in anemia, and improved health and intellectual development in children. In response to questions, Ms. McLin said that WIC and the Food Stamp program are related in that a vendor who loses a license for one of the programs because of noncompliance loses the license for the other program. WIC provides a summer Farmers' Market voucher that allows recipients to purchase up to \$20 worth of produce. There are about 1,200 to 1,300 Franklin County residents of all ages in the WIC program. The income requirements depend on the number in the family and are not extremely low. In special cases, she makes home visits to assist potential recipients who are homebound. She said that her office does monitor the program for fraud. She said that diabetes is a major problem in the US. To control it, she

recommended counseling by a dietitian. The major cause of diabetes is carbohydrate intake, not just sugar. Weight loss is important, too. Program chair Kim Schroeder described the importance of WIC and Food Stamp certification to vendors. She told of a Bowling Green store that lost its certifications for a year and lost 30% of its business as a result. The club donated a book "Gaspard in the Hospital" to the Hearn Library in Ms. McLin's honor.
