This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Professor Robert G. Lawson of the University of Kentucky College of Law, who spoke about the problem of prison and jail overcrowding in the state. He stated that one reason for prison overcrowding was that with the assassinations and civil unrest and riots of the sixties, the criminal laws were toughened in the so-called wars on crime and drugs. Since the enactment of the Penal Code of 1974, we have had 33 straight years of substantial increases in the jail and prison populations. This country has seven times the incarceration rate of the world average. He addressed the morality of such drastic punishments and how our justice system is out of line with the philosophy that the punishment should fit the crime. However, a combination of fear and anger has produced an overcrowded jail and prison situation, which has drastic social consequences. The parole and probation systems are overextended and the jails are simply not equipped to deal with long-term incarcerations. Too many state inmates are put into county jails. He stated that the fault lies with us in demanding tougher and longer sentences with so many prisoners serving time for non-violent crimes like drug offenses. These prisoners are kept in inhumane conditions and he read a letter from an inmate that underscores the problem. He stated that there is a special problem with female prisoners, which is the fastest growing inmate population in the country. These are for the most part not violent offenders who are incarcerated for minor drug and low-level property crimes. Thank you Professor Lawson for focusing our attention on a problem most of us are not really aware of.

Next Week's Program... Russell A. Barnett University of Louisville

Kentucky Institute for the Environment and Sustainable Development, Director for Research and Development -- Responsible for the coordination of eight centers: Environmental Engineering, Environmental Education, Environmental Policy and Management, Environmental Law, Sustainable Urban Neighborhoods, Watershed Research, Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences, and the Kentucky Pollution Prevention Center. The Institute provides a neutral forum for policy development, research, education and community services on environmental related issues. The institute draws faculty from the schools of law, education, engineering, arts and sciences, business and public administration to create multi disciplinary teams to address environmental issues. Over \$2.5 million in grants and contracts to conduct environmental research or to implement environmental programs are obtained by the Institute each year.

Kentucky Department For Environmental ProtectionDeputyCommissioner--Responsible for administration of a 780-person Department with an annual budget of more than \$55 million. Provided oversight and management of state air quality, water quality, water resources, drinking water, solid and hazardous waste, Superfund, underground storage tank, and laboratory programs. Developed state policies, regulations, and statutes. Prepared the first statewide Environmental Management Plan, which was the catalyst for increasing the Department's budget by 50 percent and staffing levels from 405 to 780 employees.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Russell A. Barnett of the University of Louisville Institute for the Environment and Sustainable Development. He spoke of various partnerships to make Louisville into a "Green City" like other metropolitan centers around the country. We are moving to a knowledge-based economy, which is competing for brainpower. Louisville is looking to other green cities in terms of economic growth, quality of life, and job creation. An environmental pollutant is a wasted resource, and many of the reasons that were formerly put forth as reasons to not go green are no longer valid. Reasons historically given for not going green are capital costs, perceptions of higher costs, lack of knowledge and support infrastructure. Also in the past there has been no central issue forcing change. In order to change to a green economy, there must be small incremental steps and an identifiable agent for change. In Louisville, the Mayor, U of L president and superintendent of schools are all agents for change. Many Kentucky cities (including Frankfort) have signed on to adopting climate change. Also, the economics of energy costs is an agent of change. The goals in going green include a holistic environmental education and environmental health strategies to create sustainable management systems. Louisville is facing many environmental problems such as air and water pollution, but Louisville also has many collective resources at its disposal such as employees, land, and students. Energy audits performed to contain costs have found that there is a 10-15% reduction in energy costs if people are simply made aware of their energy use. One phrase to remember when conserving energy and going green is "When not in use, turn off the juice!" Green Fleets should be emphasized like environmentally

friendly automobiles and bicycles. We need to expand recycling in the schools for example. Environmental education is important, and the schools have been sponsoring "dumpster dives" to determine what kind of things people throw away. Many schools also use outdoor classrooms as we use the environment as a tool for learning. Curriculum guides have been developed for educating teachers about the environment and the importance of going green. Buildings are increasingly becoming environmentally friendly by using more solar power. Using various partnerships, we are well down the path of making Louisville a "Green City" by decreasing consumption and waste as we attempt to battle pollution of all sorts.

As part of his presentation, he will discuss your personal energy management and "how big is your environmental footprint"? Currently he is doing contract work with the non-profit organization Energy Services Coalition, which promotes energy efficiency through energy savings performance contracting. The ESC (energyservicescoalition.org) is an organization that promotes energy efficiency through Espc. Espc is a process through which a building owner/operator such as K-12 or state facilities or municipalities can upgrade their facilities using the utility and operating savings to fund the project and the savings are guaranteed.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Eddie Riddle of the Energy Services Coalition. He is doing contract work with this non-profit organization, which promotes energy efficiency through energy savings performance contracting. His organization promotes energy efficiency through which a building owner/operator can upgrade their facilities using the utility and operating savings to fund the project and the savings are guaranteed. His Task Force on Energy Efficiency and Climate Change was formed last year and was presented to the City of Frankfort whereupon a Sustainability Coordinator was appointed. The goal is to make Frankfort into a Green City. Although the Task Force has gone out of business, an Energy Team was formed. Among its duties is to meet with each department of city gov-

ernment to increase awareness and educate employees about the need to save and reduce waste. The team did a walk-through of City Hall and found waste and unhealthy conditions such as mold. There is a need to encourage city employees to support the Facilities Coordinator. There are many reasons to reduce waste and conserve, even it you do not believe in man-made global warming. These include saving money, making our country less dependent on foreign oil, and generally making more efficient use of our resources. We can do many small things at home such as using mass transit, turning down the temperature on the water heater, and walk and bicycle more. It is not necessary to change your lifestyle, just do those things you do more efficiently. We also must demand that government make increasingly efficient use of resources as a priority. In responding to questions, he stated that while he does not know exactly how many households recycle, a recent survey going out to city residents should shed some light on this. However, he did state that more aggressive recycling is a priority of the Energy Team and he encouraged Rotarians to make better and frequent use of the recycling center on Rouse Avenue.
