

- G. Deadline is June 14, 2008.



This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Jan Mester, president of the Kentucky Council on Economic Education. The KCEE is a non-profit affiliate member of the National Council on Economic Education, a nationwide network that leads in promoting economic literacy with students and their teachers. KCEE's mission is to help students develop real-life skills they need to succeed to be able to think and choose responsibly as consumes, savers, investors, citizens, members of the workforce, and effective participants in a global economy. The mission of the KCEE is to be a champion of economics and personal

finance in the marketplace economy. The goals are to inspire teachers, engage students and network with like-minded partners. The idea is to plant the seeds of economic literacy in the everyday business of life through economic education. The KCEE was started by a group of business people and its life-blood consists of a grass roots group. It empowers Kentuckians to be economically literate. Bankruptcy is a result of not putting aside money to maintain one's standard of living. There are various ways to develop knowledgeable economic educators. Scholarships, workshops for teachers, and taking advantage of professional development opportunities are some ways of doing this. Teachers educate students to promote economic development. Other ways include networking and advocacy where the KCEE works with school systems, colleges and technical schools. Students are taught how to read a financial page. In support of these efforts, the KCEE will conduct a Financial Literacy Summit on June 25-26 for students to learn life fundamentals. Through various sponsorships and partnerships, business leaders make this happen. As Rotarians, we have several ways to contribute to financial literacy through innovative teaching grants where the individual Rotarian or Rotary club can sponsor a teacher. There is also a library cart of classroom resources for teaching economics and personal finance. Finally, through student activities such as entrepreneurship fairs, students learn fundamental life skills in the area of financial literacy.



Next Week's Program

Frankfort native William I. "Bill" May, Jr. took office as Mayor of Kentucky's capital city on January 1, 1996. Mayor May was elected to a third term and took office January 1, 2005. He is the first Mayor to succeed himself since the 1800s. Mayor May was born March 19, 1959 and is a graduate of Frankfort High School and Kentucky State University.

Community service has been an important part of life for Mayor May. He believes it is important to have a strong community where there are opportunities for all of Frankfort's citizens. Mayor May and his family pull the community together annually to sponsor "Coats for Kids," a project that provides brand new winter coats for all school children in need in Frankfort and Franklin County. In 1987, Mayor May was awarded the Community Service Award for that project, but he is quick to point out that this is a project where everyone makes it a success.

Some of the civic organizations Mayor May has been involved with include Frankfort Rotary Club, Frankfort/Franklin County Chamber of Commerce, Boy Scouts of America District Chairman, Salvation Army of Frankfort Advisory Board, Frankfort Jaycees - President, Frankfort Arts Foundation - Board of Directors, P.U.S.H. Infant and Preschool - Board of Directors, Capitol Expo - Board of Directors. Public safety, youth, senior citizens, the arts, and neighborhood drainage problems are some of the issues Mayor May has worked hard to address during his tenure as Mayor.

This Week's Speaker..

This week's speaker was Jim O'Toole, Assistant VP of the Federal Home Loan Bank of Cincinnati. He described the Federal Home Loan Bank as a bank for other banks, which lends money to financial institutions. Jim discussed the economy, the banking system, and housing markets, saying that the opinions he would express are his and not those of his employer. He said that the current challenges to the banking industry include (1) significant

with banks therefore looking closer at risks, (2) less money to loan and higher rates in order for banks to hold more capital, (3) bank stocks have lost value. According to a recent Federal Reserve Board survey of loan officers, banks are significantly tightening on business loans, with over 50% of banks tightening. In the past, that degree of tightening has been associated with a recession. However, a recession is technically defined as two quarters of decline in GDP, and that hasn't happened yet. On the housing market, Jim noted that prices are falling (although they have been more stable in this area of the country) and that causes negative equity. There is an 11-month supply of houses for sale. The sub prime market is gone. Consumers are having a rough time, although the Federal Reserve rate cuts and the tax rebates have helped a little. He was pessimistic about relief from high oil prices because demand is going up, even though U.S. demand has fallen 2%. Some expect China's demand for oil to equal that of the U.S. by 2020 and to double U.S. demand by 2030. Prices will go down only if demand goes down. At present, Chinese consumers pay only \$1.50 per gallon because of government subsidies. He said that the lower value of the U.S. dollar has helped our exporters; but, on the negative side, the percentage of the household budget spent on gas and food as risen from 18% to 20%. Asked if negative press has an impact on the economy, Jim said that it does affect consumers' outlook and spending decisions. Asked about the impact of war on the economy, he noted that we can't afford the war, which is being financed with deficit spending, but we have to be cautious. He called for national leadership that is willing to make hard decisions. In Jim's honor, Dave Ramsey's book, The Total Money Makeover, will be donated to WHHS Library.
