This Week's Speaker...

Rotarian Doug Howard and Jonathan Gaby spoke about using social media for business. Doug summarized the various types of social media. The speakers focused on Twitter and blogging and their use in business. Doug demonstrated tweeting using a live demonstration of a poll in which the audience participated. Using his homepage, LegalPreneur, he showed how companies could get feedback on their products or services by posting/sending tweets. In response to questions, Doug said that his cell phone is a Palm II, which he'll probably exchange for/ upgrade to an iPhone at some point. He acknowledged concerns about identity theft with social media, but said most are secure. Social media services are generally free. Jonathan discussed blogging. He said you can start blogging by using

a myriad of tools, including your existing Web host. His tips for communicating with customers/markets included being conversational (rather than sending ads), updating regularly to maintain interest, making it easy to find your blog, and setting realistic goals by starting small. He invited questions addressed to JDGaby@gmail.com or tweets to Twitter.com/ JDGaby. In response to questions, Jonathan said that people need to spend 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours per day on social media to be good at it; but, for a businessperson, it's a good return on investment. A guest noted that his e-mail has fallen by about 25% since he began posting information on blogs/tweets. In the speakers' honor, Allan Weis's book The Business of Changing Lives, about taking the superhighway to the inner city, will be given to a local school library.
