Rotarian Bill Miller – “Rotary and the UN: Creating A Better World”



Bill Miller worked with the Kentucky Legislative Research Commission (LRC), which is the bipartisan staff for the Kentucky General Assembly, from 1977-1999 primarily as a Federal/International Relations Specialist and Assistant Public Information Officer. Upon retirement, he established Miller and Associates Federal and International Relations Media Consultants. He holds a Masters of Science of Social Work from the University of Louisville's Kent School of Social Work and a Masters of Public Administration from Kentucky State University.

As a public service, Bill produces and moderates Channel 10's "Frankfort's Global Connection" television program that airs on Channel 10 on Tuesdays at 7 p.m. and Wednesdays at 9 a.m. He is the producer/moderator of "Global Connections Television," which does most of its tapings at the United

Nations in New York. To view some GCTV programs, Google "Global Connections Television with Bill Miller."

Bill helped develop international education programs at the local level and the "Rotary Day at the United Nations" Program. He was President of the Frankfort Rotary Club (2000-01) and was the Rotary District 6710 Governor (2003-2004). He was appointed as a Rotary Alternate Representative to the United Nations in 2007. Bill has 31 years of Perfect Attendance as a Rotarian. He has served for several years as the District 6710 WCS Committee Chair. In 2009, Bill was President D.K. Lee's Representative to District 6580's District Conference.

Bill Miller is the President of the Frankfort Chapter United Nations Association of the USA (www.unausa.org), which is part of the largest nonpartisan foreign policy association in the USA. An international relations specialist, he has written numerous articles on the United Nations for newspapers, such as the Lexington-Herald Leader and the Washington International. He and his wife Paula, a retired language arts teacher, live in the historic district of South Frankfort.

The First Four Rotarians

On 23 February 1905, Paul P. Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram E. Shorey gathered in Loehr's office for what would become known as the first Rotary club meeting. Harris's desire for camaraderie among business associates brought together these four men and eventually led to an international organization of service and fellowship.

Rotary's founder, Harris was born in Wisconsin on 19 April 1868. He was raised by his paternal grandparents in Vermont and attended the University of Vermont, Princeton, and the University of Iowa. He

was Rotary president from 1910 to 1912 and a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago until his death on 27 January 1947.

Loehr, a mining engineer, was born on 18 October 1864 in Carlinville, Illinois. He was a Rotarian for only a few years, never holding office at the club or international level. But that first Rotary meeting was held in his office, Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. He died in Chicago on 23 May 1918.

A Rotarian for only a few years, Shorey served as recording secretary during the club's first year. He was born in Maine in August 1862 and died in March 1944.

Schiele, a coal dealer, served as the Chicago club's first president in 1905 and Rotary International's third treasurer in 1945. Born in Indiana in 1870, Schiele attended Terre Haute Business College and served in the U.S. Army during the Spanish-American War. He was president of the Schiele Coal Company from 1902 until his retirement in 1939. He and Harris became lifelong friends and lived near each other on the South Side of Chicago. Schiele died on 17 December 1945 and is buried near Harris at Mount Hope Cemetery.

Originally from Michigan, Harry L. Ruggles, often called the "Fifth Rotarian," was a graduate of Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, and joined Rotary at its second meeting. He was treasurer of the Chicago club during its first year, president from 1908 to 1910, and a Rotary director from 1912 to 1913. He is known for having introduced singing to Rotary club meetings. His printing company, H.L. Ruggles & Co., printed the first issue of The National Rotarian and the first Rotary songbook. He died on 26 October 1959, an honorary member of seven clubs in addition to his home club, the Rotary Club of Chicago.
