A. Lee Meyer, Extension Professor(Sustainable Agriculture)U. of KY. - Dept. of Agricultural Economics

Title: "Sustainable Agriculture and Food - Local? Global? Now? Future?"

Mr. A. Lee Meyer is an extension specialist/professor in sustainable agriculture and agricultural economics at the University of Kentucky and has been here for 33 years. Most of his professional work has been targeted toward marketing, from feeder cattle and forage-based beef systems through all kinds of locally produced products. His focus is on direct marketing of meat products, farm transitions and grass-based livestock systems.

He currently leads a USDA- funded beginning farmer training project called KyFarmStart, chair UK's Sustainable Agriculture and Food Systems working group and the UK President's Sustainability Advisory Committee.

He has been one of the two Kentucky Sustainable Agriculture/USDA coordinators since 2006. In addition to my Kentucky SARE responsibilities, He serves as a liaison between the Southern SARE program and the land grant universities in the region, focusing on grantsmanship and special projects, so have a pretty good understanding of sustainable agriculture throughout the South.

He teaches a course in International Trade and Food Issues and has worked in Thailand for two years, Poland for one year, as well as several short-term overseas opportunities. He received his Ph.D. from Purdue U. in 1980 and lived and worked on a cash grain farm before that. Mr. Meyer is married and has three adult children - a teacher/mom of three in Louisville; an UK instructor/mom of one; and a program assistant for the Rivers Network in Portland, OR.
