State Auditor Adam Edelen is the Auditor of Public Accounts for the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Prior to that, he was the Chief of Staff for Kentucky Governor Steve Beshear from July 2008 until September 15, 2010. On August 11, 2010,



Edelen announced that he would be leaving the post to return to the private sector and run for State Auditor.

Edelen was born November 26, 1974, in Meade County, Kentucky and is a graduate of the University of Kentucky, where he was a member of Delta Tau Delta social fraternity.

At 21, he began his public service career as one of the youngest aides ever to serve a Kentucky Governor. He has since served as a senior executive with both the Greater Lexington Chamber of Commerce (Commerce Lexington) and Thomas & King, Inc. and, most recently, as Director of the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security.

As a two-term gubernatorial appointee to the board of Kentucky Educational Television, Chairman Edelen was the driving force behind the "Be Well Kentucky" initiative—an acclaimed effort which addresses Kentucky's public health crisis. While vice-president of the Commerce Lexington, Edelen was responsible for the nationally-recognized New Century Lexington Reports on Community Livability, which used a broad range of metrics for measuring Lexington's quality of life.

Edelen has also chaired the United Way of the Bluegrass Annual Campaign and the Lexington Fayette County Urban League. He has also served as a member of the Prichard Committee for Academic Excellence.


