Next Week's Speaker...

Dance Kaleidoscope's Artistic Director **David Hochoy** brings a truly international perspective to the company. Hochoy, whose parents were of Chinese descent, was born in Trinidad, West Indies. He attended college at McGill University in Montreal, where he began studying for a career as a doctor; however during his senior year he discovered an affinity for the theatre. He went on to receive his B.Sc. from McGill and then continued his theatrical interest with an MA in directing from Penn State University.

At age 20, David took his first dance class and discovered his true love of dance. After studying in New York at the Alvin Ailey and Martha Graham schools, he danced with numerous national companies, and in 1980 was invited to join the Martha Graham Dance Company. He was promoted to soloist and later became rehearsal director in 1986. He toured the world with Graham until 1989. He has given master classes in Graham Technique throughout the United States and Europe, and in 1990, was invited to Guangzhou China, where, for ten weeks, he taught the experimental troupe of the Guangdong Dance Academy.

David has been on the faculty of the Martha Graham School since 1982. In addition, he has taught at the American Dance Festival (ADF) held at Duke University as well as ADF West in Salt Lake City and ADF Seoul in Korea. In 1991 he was invited to teach and choreograph at the Vienna International Dance Festival. He has given workshops in Quebec City, Dublin and Tokyo. David spent two years as a full-time faculty member at Texas Christian University. Since becoming Artistic Director of Dance Kaleidoscope in 1991, he has choreographed over 64 works for the company.

David has also choreographed numerous productions at the Indiana Repertory Theatre (where he is an Associate Artist), the Indianapolis Civic Theatre, Phoenix Theatre, Edyvean Repertory Theatre, as well as Salome for the Arizona Opera and Miss Evers' Boys for Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park. For ten years he served as Artistic Director of the Green Shows at the Oregon Shakespeare Festival where he choreographed thirty original dance works based on Shakespeare's plays.

David received a 2005 Choo-San Goh & Robert H. Magee award to produce his world premiere of Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue." He is a two-time recipient of a Master Fellowship in Choreography and an individual Artistic Award from the Indiana Arts Commission and has received a Creative Renewal Fellowship from the Arts Council of Indianapolis. He has been awarded the Key to the City by the Indianapolis City/County Council, the Distinguished Hoosier Award by the Governor of Indiana and was honored by the Center for Leadership Development for outstanding achievement in the arts. In 2004, David was voted one of Indiana's 25 "Keepers" by the readers of Indy Men's Magazine.
