Next Week's Speaker...



Roland Herzl is a Frankfort native, born at the corner of Third and Steele Streets 69 years ago. He attended Second Street School and Frankfort High School, with music degrees from Southern Methodist University and the University of Louisville. After military service (Vietnam 1968-1969) Roland was hired as a claims administrator for Investors Heritage, where he worked until retirement in 2009. He occupies the organ bench at South Frankfort Presbyterian Church on Sunday mornings and sings in the Capital City Chorale. The YMCA occupies his time most weekday mornings. The rest of the time he drinks coffee and listens to classical music.

His interest in ships began in 1955. His family was returning to USA from a year-long residence in Israel. As the months preceding departure approached, Roland's father brought home ship brochures from the travel agency. Those brochures were the beginning of his collection of ship memorabilia, which contin-

ues to this day. His Titanic lectures have been heard in Indiana, Tennessee, North Carolina and Kentucky.

Roland's Titanic collection includes a first-edition copy of Walter Lord's 1955 book "A Night to Remember" inscribed by the author, whom Herzl met in 1972. The book is also signed by six survivors of the 1912 sinking, all of those survivors now deceased. Roland has 97 books devoted to the Titanic, 45 video documentaries on the Titanic, and 10 movies of the Titanic, dating from 1912 to 2007. His Titanic artifacts include an item once aboard the ship, an item taken off the ship before sinking, and an item from the debris field of the Atlantic Ocean floor. He is a 40-year member of the Titanic Historical Society.
