# Rotary gives \$53.5 million to help eradicate polio

EVANSTON, Ill. (Jan. 25, 2018) — With (WHO), and another \$518,000 will go toward 22 confirmed cases in 2017 to date, and just technical assistance in West and Central Africa. one case in 2018, the world is on the brink of children each year.

be conducted by the World Health Organization billion children in 122 countries from polio.

While significant strides have been made eradicating polio, a vaccine-preventable disease against the disease, polio remains a threat in that once paralyzed hundreds of thousands of hard-to-reach and underserved areas and conflict zones. Despite a historically low case Rotary is giving \$53.5 million in grants to count, as long as a single child has polio, all children are at risk, which underscores the need led by the Global Polio Eradication Initiative for continued funding and political commitment to eradication.

Rotary has committed to raising \$150 million efforts to end polio in two of the three countries over the next three years, which will be matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, yielding \$450 million for polio eradication activities, including immunization and surveil-

Rotary started its polio eradication program PolioPlus in 1985, and in 1988 became a partner in the GPEI, along with WHO, UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation later became a partner. Since the initiative launched, the incidence of polio has plummeted by more than 99.9 percent, from about 350,000 cases in 1988 to just 22 confirmed cases in 2017 (as of 25 January). Rotary has contributed a total of more than \$1.7 billion — including matching funds from the Gates Foundation — and count-An additional \$731,338 will fund research to less volunteer hours to protect more than 2.5
