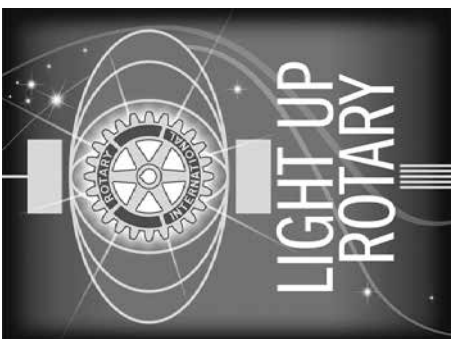

Next Week's Program...

Nancy Jo Kemper, the Democratic candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives from Kentucky's 6th District, is a native of Lexington and a proud Kentuckian. She attended Lexington/Fayette County public schools and graduated from Lafayette High School. A daughter of a letter carrier active in the National Association of Letter Carriers and a stay-at-home mother who was a leader in local and state PTA organizations, she learned early lessons from them about civic engagement. She is the mother of two adult daughters, and grandmother of two granddaughters, ages 11 and eight.

She was graduated *cum laude* from Transylvania University and from Yale University Divinity School, and attended both universities on full-tuition scholarships. Her employment history includes a year of work at the Urban League of Greater Little Rock, Arkansas; 23 years of congregational ministry, half as the sole or senior minister of congregations in the United Church of Christ, in New



Haven, Connecticut; Richmond, Virginia; Oak Park, Illinois; St. Louis, Missouri; and briefly in Toledo, Ohio before accepting the position to be Executive Director of the Kentucky Council of Churches in 1991.

Throughout her career, Ms. Kemper has been recognized and honored by many organizations for her diligent work on public policy and social justice issues, which have included such matters as health care reform, environmental stewardship, separation of church and state, economic justice, tax reform, pay-day lending reform, children's issues, racial justice, abolition of the death penalty, gambling expansion, minimum wage and living wage legislation, housing, domestic violence, and many other matters of public concern.

Ms. Kemper won the primary election on May 17 with 80.1% of the votes cast, and will be opposing incumbent Republican Garland "Andy" Barr in the November election.
