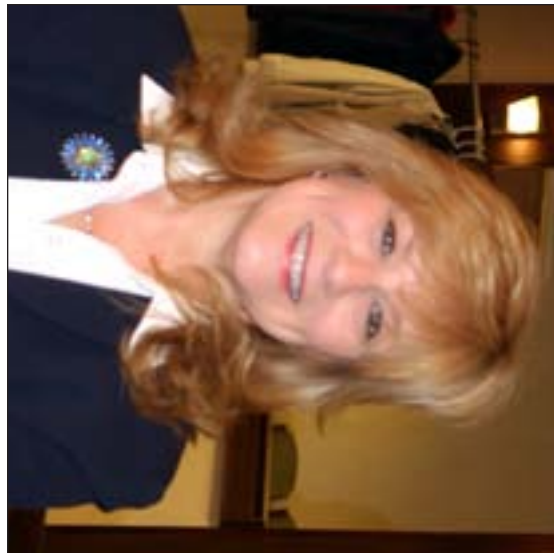

Next Week's Program...

Roy A. Grimes CEO/President NASP

Roy was the Deputy Commissioner of the Kentucky Department of Fish & Wildlife Resources when he was assigned the task of creating what became NASP (National Archery in the Schools Program) by then-Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources (KDFWR) Commissioner, Tom Bennett. Roy has been the world-wide leader for NASP from the planning phase in late 2001 through the present.



Roy was born in London, Kentucky but moved to Indiana before mastering the southern accent at 9 months of age. He attended Richmond Senior High School where he competed in cross country and track. He attended Purdue University from 1973-1977 graduating with a Bachelor's of Science in Forestry and a Bachelor's of Arts in Wildlife Science -- the first and last Purdue student to earn both of these majors in just four years.

He started his career as a Forester as assistant manager of Clark State Forest in Southern

Indiana. By 1979 he moved to Northern Indiana where he served 8 counties as the DNR's private lands biologist in the NW part of the state. He moved to become the manager of the DNR's Patoka Lake near French Lick, IN from 1985-1989 he planned and directed the building of the archery range which is still used for 3D tournaments by the Patoka Lake Bowhunters. Roy moved to Kansas in 1989 to be the first Wichita-area Parks and Public Lands Manger for the Kansas Dept. of Wildlife & Parks. He moved on to Missouri to serve a similar role in the St. Louis region of that state for the Missouri Dept. of Conservation.

Roy's last move as a wildlife biologist was to become the Wildlife Director and eventually Deputy Commissioner for the Kentucky Dept. of Wildlife Resources. As the Deputy Commissioner he oversaw personnel and activities of more than 400 employees in the Wildlife, Fisheries, Outreach, and Law Enforcement Divisions. NASP came into being on March 3, 2002 and Roy's efforts became increasingly directed towards oversight of the program in Kentucky and expansion across the United States, Canada and a few other countries. He retired from KDFWR in 2007 and continues today as CEO/President of NASP

In the beginning, basic operating principles were established and implemented in 21 pilot middle schools in Kentucky in 2002. These same operating principles remain constant today and account for the steady growth and continued interest in 12,000 schools in five countries. More than a million students will learn archery from their teachers this school year.

- Approved the February 2015 Financial report presented by John Avent. Teresa Hockensmith made the motion, second Gordon Saks.
- Approved the minutes from Feb. 18th board action, Kristin Cantrell made the motion, second by Teresa Hockensmith.
- Acknowledged resignation of fellow Rotarian Travis Mayo.
- Approved leave-of-absence for Annette Dupont-Ewing from 2/3/15 to 3/25/15, and Mark Hampton from 3/1/15 to 8/1/15. Dan Egbers made the motion, second by Kristin Cantrell.
