### Rotary International Dinner

The Rotary Club of Frankfort will host its 21st Annual International Dinner on Thursday, April 26, beginning with a social hour and silent auction at 6:00 p.m. at the Frankfort Country Club, 101 Duntreath, Frankfort. Dinner and program will begin at 7 p.m.

The guest speaker will be **Ambassador Thomas Graham Jr.** who is a former senior U.S. diplomat. Ambassador Graham, who graduated from Louisville Male High School, was involved in the negotiation of every single international arms control and non-proliferation agreement from 1970 to 1997. He will focus on "Hotspots of the World from Korea to Iran."
