On stage at the Carson Center Performing Arts Center, **Andy Andrews** is the featured speaker for the first ever Rotary Community Event that is part of the District Conference on Friday, June 1 from 3-5 p.m. Rotary District 6710 and community sponsors are joining together to invite over 1,000 people to hear from a person who has spoken at the request of four U.S. presidents and has been called "someone who has quietly become one of the most influential people in America."

When asked about the best speaker he had ever heard, Paducah Rotarian Terry Reeves, without hesitation said Andy Andrews. When looking over Andy's presentation topics, we found "Making a Difference" our Rotary International theme for the year and we knew he was the one! Zig Ziglar agrees with Terry saying "Andy Andrews is the best speaker I have ever seen."
