Jim Kimbrough was born and educatin Huntsville, Alabama, While attending the University of Alabama, majoring in Government and American History, he



interned several years for the regional planning council in North Alabama, and spent a vear with the Alabama LRC at the capitol in Montgomery. In 1975 he was recruited to Frankfort as the Chief Planner in the state Department for

Public Health, and in 1977 was asked to become the director of the Falls Region Health Planning Council, which was attached to the area development district serving the Louisville region. In 1978 he became the director of the social services division there until 2000, when he joined the staff of the Human Development Institute at UK, directing a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation grant aimed at improving Kentucky's outpatient services for persons with disabilities. When that grant expired, he became a senior advocate with the Kentucky Office of Protection and Advocacy, a federally funded agency attached to the Department of Public Advocacy in the Justice and Public Protection Cabinet. In 2009, as he retired, AARP Kentucky asked him to be its lead volunteer for Medicaid issues and in 2010 to be a member of the State Executive Committee. In March 2011, he became the State President, a volunteer position, for the following six years, where he was the public face and voice of AARP in Kentucky. He is married to the former Debbie Davis, a native of Frankfort, who retired from state government after serving in Human Resources and Economic Development Cabinets.
