Rotary Day at the United Nations 2017

Rotary Day at the United Nations 2017 celebrates two organizations' shared vision for peace and highlights the critical humanitarian activities that Rotary and the UN lead around the world. The event also honors people who make a positive difference in their community, their country, or around the world. Each year, about 1,000 guests attend. Open to the public, the audience includes:

- The Rotary International president and directors, Rotary Foundation trustees, other Rotary leaders, and Rotary club members
- Leaders from the United Nations
- Experts from other non-governmental agencies
- Renowned humanitarians
- Young leaders, who attend to exchange ideas, learn about the UN, and meet international leaders

Under this year's theme of "Peace: Making a Difference," Rotary will honor six Rotary members or Rotary Peace Centers alumni who have done outstanding work for peace, professionally or as volunteers. The event will be held Saturday, 11 November, at the Palais des Nations in Geneva, Switzerland.

- Rotary leaders, UN officials, and humanitarian experts will educate and inspire participants to work for peace at local, regional, and global levels.
- General and breakout sessions will address the UN Sustainable Development Goals and emergency and humanitarian assistance.
- A special session developed by and for young leaders will highlight the importance of education to peace.
- There will also be a welcome reception and tours of Geneva and the Palais des Nations.

Rotary's relationship with the United Nations dates back to 1945 when some 49 Rotary members acted as delegates, advisors and consultants at the United Nations Charter Conference.

Today, Rotary holds the highest consultative status possible with the United Nations as a non-governmental organization. Rotary and the United Nations have a long history of working together and sharing similar visions for a more peaceful world.
