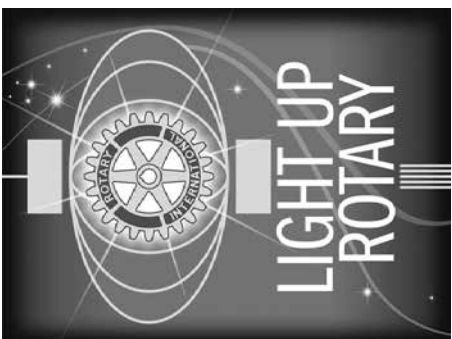

Joanna Hay, a native of Great Britain, grew up in Louisville, Kentucky attended



Indiana University and graduated from Kentucky State University. She and her husband moved to Frankfort in 1991. She owns Joanna Hay Productions, a Frankfort company that specializes in video, graphics, oral history and arts

& culture. She's known for her documentary films seen on KET, *Kentucky Bourbon Tales*, *A Kentucky Treasure: The Center for All*, and *Quest for the Perfect Bourbon*. Joanna produced and designed the exhibit inside the Old Taylor House at the Buffalo Trace Distillery. She has also produced cellphone tours for the Cities of Frankfort, Berea, Munfordville and Horse Cave.

She was recently quoted in Bloomberg Law discussing two films she produced for her Washington DC client, global law firm DLA piper. She is a member of the Oral History Association and has won two media awards from the Oral History Association. Her projects have also won Kentucky History, Kentucky Travel, Telly, and Communicator Awards.

Joanna has some additional projects under way including the Kentucky Civil Rights Hall of Fame Oral History Project and Jewish Kentucky Oral History Project for the University of Kentucky. In Franklin County she is creating a film about the Hands Healing HeArts project – an arts initiative involving women of Drug Court recovering from drug addiction. Judge Phillip Shepherd is very involved in the Drug Court project.

Along with other arts professionals in Frankfort, she is working on creating a five-year Capital Arts Cultural Plan with community-wide input. Many people know Joanna as the violinist in the musical group Stirfry Musette through performances at the Grand Theatre and other venues.

* Approved the Financial report for August 2016. Sallie Lanham made the motion, second by Diane Dehoney.

* Tabled the Proposed Budget for 7/16 - 6/17 until the October 2016 board meeting.
