Louisville law practice, focusing on employment and business law. Stuart has served on the boards of Sister Cities of Louisville, the Kentucky Shakespeare Festival, and the Americana Community Center, which provides services for the US Department of State's refugee resettlement program.

Stuart joined the Rotary Club of Louisville in 1994 and became active on the International Service Committee. He has participated in several international projects including microlending in Belize, water/sanitation projects in Uganda, and Ghana, and cervical cancer screening in Haiti. He has also assisted with projects in Kentucky affecting legal refugee and immigrant populations such as micro-lending and home repair for multi-generational refugee

families. He served at the district level, organizing a multi-district conference with District 6740 in Eastern Kentucky, and also worked with that district during the 2010 Alltech FEI/ World Equestrian Games in Lexington. A former recipient of the Rotarian of the Year award, Stuart served as president of the Rotary Club of Louisville during its Centennial year, 2012-13.

Stuart is married to Peg Alexander, a Louisville remodeling contractor, and they are proud parents of three adult daughters and one English shepherd named Nellie.



Rotary Businesses of the Year honored

This year the Rotary sponsored "Business of the Year Award" was named Frank Sower Business of the Year. Two awards were given: one to a business with 50 or fewer employees, and one to a company of greater than 50 employees.

Frank Sower was a fellow Rotarian for 65 years. He owned Sower Hardware and Sower Office Equipment from 1937 to 1983. He was the first president of the new Frankfort/Franklin Co. Chamber of Commerce, was president of The Kentucky Retail Hardware Association, received the first President's award from the Chamber of Commerce, was the only person to serve two different governors as President of the Kentucky Historical Society, was president of the Frankfort Rotary Club, and also was an undefeated YMCA grade school basketball coach in regular season and tournament play for three years.
