Karen G. Hall is the assistant to Executive Director of the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's Office of Highway Safety. Before joining the KYTC Highway Safety team in 2017, she worked over 18 years in the field of substance use prevention, with seven of those years working to engage faith groups across Kentucky in drug prevention and mental health promotion. Although she primarily works with Highway Safety's Division of Incident Management, her substance use prevention experience is also applied to prevention of drunk and drugged impaired driving through Highway Safety Division of Programs and Grants.

Ms. Hall has a BA in English and French secondary education from Asbury University and an MA in Theological Studies from Liberty Baptist Theological Seminary. She has two children: a son, a sergeant with the Maysville City Police Department; and a daughter who is a stay-at-home mom. Her favorite "hobbies" are her two grandchildren in Kentucky and three in Michigan.

Karen's presentation is, "It's Not an Accident: How Community Involvement Can Improve Driver Safety." Franklin County is in the top 40 Kentucky counties of greatest concern for the Kentucky Office of Highway Safety. Overall, Franklin County ranks 26th in the state for having the most highway safety problems, especially in total number of crashes per capita; number of incapacitating injuries; and collisions involving high speeds, impaired driving, commercial vehicles, and motorcycles. Her brief presentation will share the latest Franklin County highway rankings and discuss how community partners can play an important role in addressing and improving driver safety and awareness.
