

Next Week's Program...

Next week's program will focus on three topics. After a brief update on the Youth Fund finances including the results of the recent golf scramble, we will hear a presentation by **James Hardin**, former principal of the Franklin County Career and Technical Center, on the critical role of technical education in the 21st century.

Before going into education, James worked for the printing industry and Toyota Motor Manufacturing, which gave him valuable insight into the real-world demands of the workplace. He spent six years teaching at the middle school level and four years at the high school level, before becoming assistant principal at Dunbar High School in Fayette County. Subsequently he was appointed principal at Southside Technical Center in Lexington. This experience led to a promotion to the district director of all career and technical education programs in Fayette County. After a brief retirement, James realized he missed the students and took a position as the principal of Franklin County's Career and Technical Center, where he worked until his second retirement on June 30 of this year. Since his official retirement

from public education, he has been serving as the camp pastor at Laurel Lake Baptist Camp.

The program will conclude with a presentation of the remaining Youth Fund scholarships.
