Tom Hatton is Vice President and Trust Investment Officer at United Bank and Capital Trust. Tom joined the bank in early 2017 and brings over 37 years of investment experience. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Family Financial Planning and Counseling

from Brigham Young University in 1981. After working initially for EF Hutton, Tom began his banking career in 1984 at Liberty National Bank in Louisville as Head of Research. While in this capacity he created a PC-based quantitative investment research model for the \$4.1 billion trust company.

In 1990 he became a Vice President and Senior Investment Officer at Bank One Lexington, where he was responsible for managing over \$600 million in individual accounts, and served as an Alternate Fund Manager for the Value Fund from the Bank One family of mutual funds. In 2000 Tom established his own Registered Investment Advisory where he

managed assets for high-net worth investors in both Kentucky and Indiana. After joining the bank Tom relocated to Frankfort and enjoys meeting clients and traveling to the various bank locations throughout the state.

The Four-Way Test is a nonpartisan and nonsectarian ethical guide for Rotarians to use for their personal and professional relationships. The test has been translated into more than 100 languages, and Rotarians recite it at club meetings.

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
