fishing, hiking. I was always outside and developed a love for recreation."

Pickens flirted with studying biology briefly because of his love for nature. At one point, he realized biology wasn't exactly for him. Coincidentally, Pickens came across the parks administration program and thought it fit more in line with his passions. "It was one of those light-bulb "a-ha" moments," he said. "I almost immediately fell in love with the parks program."

After graduation, he worked for several Kentucky state parks, including Lake Cumberland and Rough River Dam Resort. He then began working in at the office of state parks in the Capital Plaza Tower. During that time, Pickens not only met his wife but they also had their first child. "Frankfort became home," he said. "That's where my family started."

Pursuing his career path, Pickens and his family moved to Shelbyville in 2013, where he worked as parks and recreation director for almost six years before learning about the retirement of longtime Frankfort Parks and Recreation Director Jim Parrish. One of the main draws of Frankfort was the reputation of its parks at a state level.

Rotary Foundation

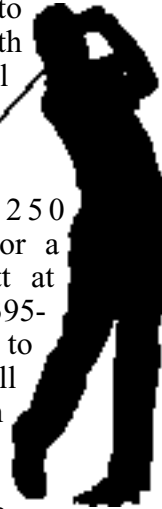
